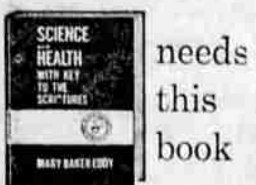
Vote Sought On Revised Constitution

\$58.3 Million Deficit Forecast

SALEM (UPI) — A general fund deficit of \$58.3 million at the end of the current biennium was forecast today by Finance and Administration Director Freeman Holmer. State law requires announcement of the state's financial condition in advance of any election at which any legislation involving the raising or expenditure of funds is submitted to the people by referendum. Holmer said if voters uphold the tax measure at the Oct. 15 election, a \$5.8 million balance at the end of the biennium is forecast.

President Will Dedicate First 2-Purpose Reactor

HANFORD, Wash. (UPI) — President Kennedy today visits the Hanford Works Reservation, a 600-square-mile area which 20 years ago was a barren sagebrush desert inhabited only by a handful of dryland farmers and thousands of jackrabbits.

Before World War II the only visitors were rockhounds and an occasional Yakima Indian hunting wild horses that found refuge in the brakes that border the Columbia River where it carves a crooked course through the barren land.

With the President today were an estimated 30,000 persons who came to watch him dedicate a new production reactor which not only will make weapons-grade plutonium for nuclear warfare but also will provide steam power to generate 800,000 kilowatts of electricity.

This will be the first dual-purpose reactor in the nation. The bill for this plant will run about \$195 million, and about \$25 million of that cost is associated specifically with features which make the reactor convertible to allow power generation.

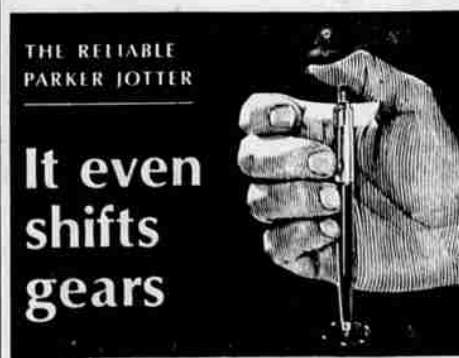
Today, the persons who work at Hanford live in Richland, 25 miles to the south. Richland, itself, was about the size of Hanford before the Atomic Bomb, but today it is a town of about 15,000. Combined with nearby Pasco and Kennewick to make the Tri-City area, it is one of the most populated places in the state outside of Seattle.

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Oregon Remains Only State Without Tax On Cigarettes

SALEM (UPI) — A straw poll at the recent State Fair indicated if new tax revenues were needed, they should come from cigarette and sales taxes.

The poll was conducted by the secretary of state's office as part of a test of a new voting device—and was not a serious effort to determine public feeling on the revenue issue.

The poll did not ask whether voters opposed any new taxes or wanted a change in the state's present sources of revenue.

That question may have to be decided by Gov. Mark Hatfield and members of the legislature after the Oct. 15 tax referendum election.

But the State Fair poll was significant in the light of a recent report issued by Commerce Clearing House (CCH), an organization which reports on tax and business laws. Oregon is the only state that

does not tax cigarettes.

There are 37 states with a sales tax, and of these, 30 receive the biggest part of their operating monies from the sales tax. Sales tax collections totaled \$5.5 billion in fiscal 1962-63, almost a quarter of the \$22.1 billion total state tax collections.

Second highest money producer was the state income tax which garnered \$4.4 billion. Thirteen states looked to income taxes as their major source of revenue. New York collected 58 per cent of its operating money this way.

Taxes on gasoline were the top revenue producers in six states, and one state, Louisiana, looks to a severance tax on the removal of natural resources as its chief tax yield.

Montana last year switched its best revenue source from the income tax to the gasoline tax, reflecting a long-time see-saw be-

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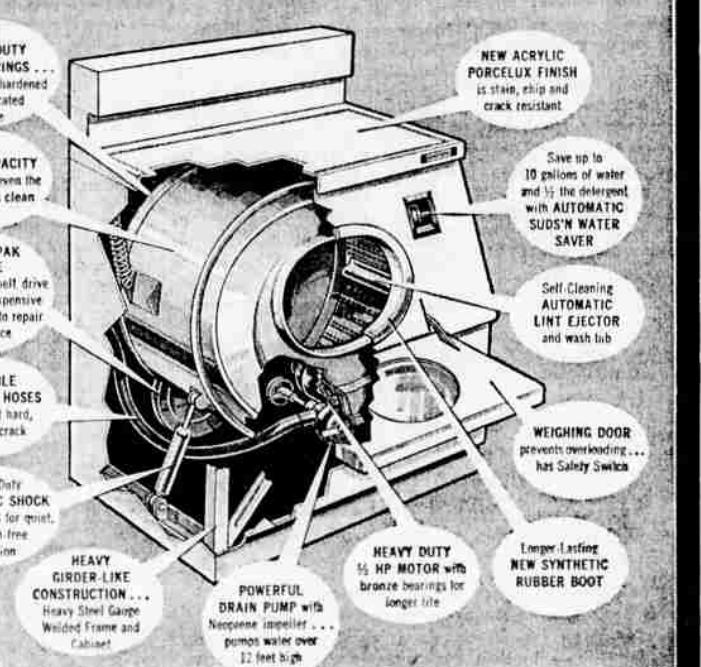
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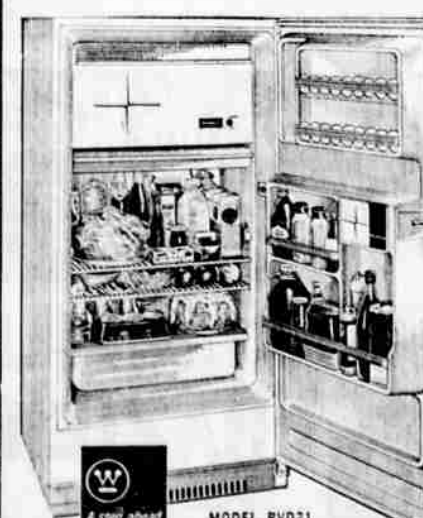


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
