## Pleases Daughters

DEAR POLLY—I enjoyed reading your column while I was away on a business trip. It is good! When I come home from such a trip, I always take my "girls" out to dinner. My wife bears with me admirably but my three teen-age daughters think nicotine-stained fingers are disgraceful. Before I take them out, this is the way I remove those stains. Mix one tablespoon of baking soda with enough bottled lemon juice to make a thick paste. Rub into the stains and then scrub with a brush. Women being the way they are, there must be lots of other papas with the same problem, so I hope they find my solution helpful.—R.C.V.L.

GIRLS—"Being the way we are," I am sure we all appreciate the thoughtfulness of this father in making every effort to please his girls. A gentleman friend tells me that he always rubs a fresh cut lemon over such stains.—POLLY

DEAR POLLY—Did you ever hear of drying salad greens (lettuce, watercress and so on) in your washing machine? Wash the greens well, shake out as much water as possible and place them in heaps on a clean dish-towel (about a head of lettuce to one towel). Fold the ends of the towels loosely around the greens. Place in the washer and set the controls for the final spin-dry cycle. They do not get mangled and will stay in the dish-towel and come out nice and dry. Store them in a gallon freezer

canister and they will keep for about a week in the refrigerator, always ready for salad.—MRS. M.S.

GIRLS—This is a wonderful way to speed up the preparation of greens for a big party, church supper, etc.—POLLY

DEAR POLLY—If you are short of space for storing blankets, fold them lengthwise and hang on coat hangers. For easy access and protection, hang the blankets inside a zippered garment bag.—MRS. R. K.

DEAR POLLY—When wringing out scalding hot cloths that are being sterilized use a potato ricer as a substitute for your hands.—MRS. M.W.C.

GIRLS—Small cloths could be lifted out of the sealding water with ice tongs, dropped into the ricer, with the hands never touching them.—POLLY

DEAR POLLY—I have five daughters and I hope my hint will save other mothers as much as it has me. When dresses grow too short for little girls up to five years of age, I use them as tops for their crawlers or long pants. The fuller smocked ones are especially nice for this. ## Two Artifact Collections Displayed

MERRILL—At the recent Artifacts Club show organized by Cliff Clayton, Doug Ernst, and Mrs. Carter, two collections were displayed from Merrill, owned by Harvey Greenbanks and Samy Merriman.

Greenbanks has collected artifacts since 1956. His interest in the hobby began when he went on a hunting trip with a friend. Since that time, he has collected about 1,200 artifacts, most of

them around Clear Lake and Tulalake. The articles are mounted on styrofoam in wooden frames and covered with glass. He has been an active member of the club for the past three years.

Merriman started his collection in 1951 and for the next five years found only a few arrowheads. In the late fall of 1956 he found a five-inch spearhead, and his collection now totals 2,500 pieces

which include arrowheads, crescents, drills, bone and horn tools, and ornaments such as wedges, awls, dice, beads, and pendants. He also has stone implements, trade goods, and baskets.

Five of the baskets were purchased from the late Dr. Frank Adams' collection. The artifacts are mounted on styrofoam and the frames, which he makes, are constructed with inlaid wood. Merriman has found his collection around Clear Lake, Tulalake, Lower Klamath-Lake, Klamath River, and Klamath Marsh. He joined the club in 1957.

Meetings are held on the third Monday of each month at 8 p.m. in the Klamath County Library. All interested persons are invited to attend.
