The champion and Denver boxing promoter Milt Willner staged a formal news conference — with all questions submitted in writing — Wednesday to explain why Liston suddenly quit the tour and returned to Denver in a huff Sept. 18.

PORTLAND (UPI)—The outlook for Oregon deer hunters this weekend continued mostly on the grim side unless weather conditions change.

The State Game Commission reported hot weather on opening weekend kept deer bedded down in the thickets during the day with dry ground conditions making stalking extremely difficult.

Fishing Report

PORTLAND (UPI)—The weekly fishing report prepared by the State Game Commission:

Northwest: Silver salmon and jacks are now in the Sandy River; salmon and jacks plentiful in Nestucca tidewater but bites are few; Cascade lakes have been good on flies late in the evening.

Southwest: Diamond Lake has been excellent both trolling and still fishing; North Umpqua spotty for steelhead; Rogue River fair for steelhead near Galice; striped bass hitting plugs in lower Umpqua.

Central: Lower section of Deschutes has been fair for steelhead; Prineville Reservoir fair to good at upper end from bank; big rainbow being caught at Crane Prairie on special flies.

Northeast: John Day good between Dayville and headwaters; Magone Lake picking up for Eastern brook.

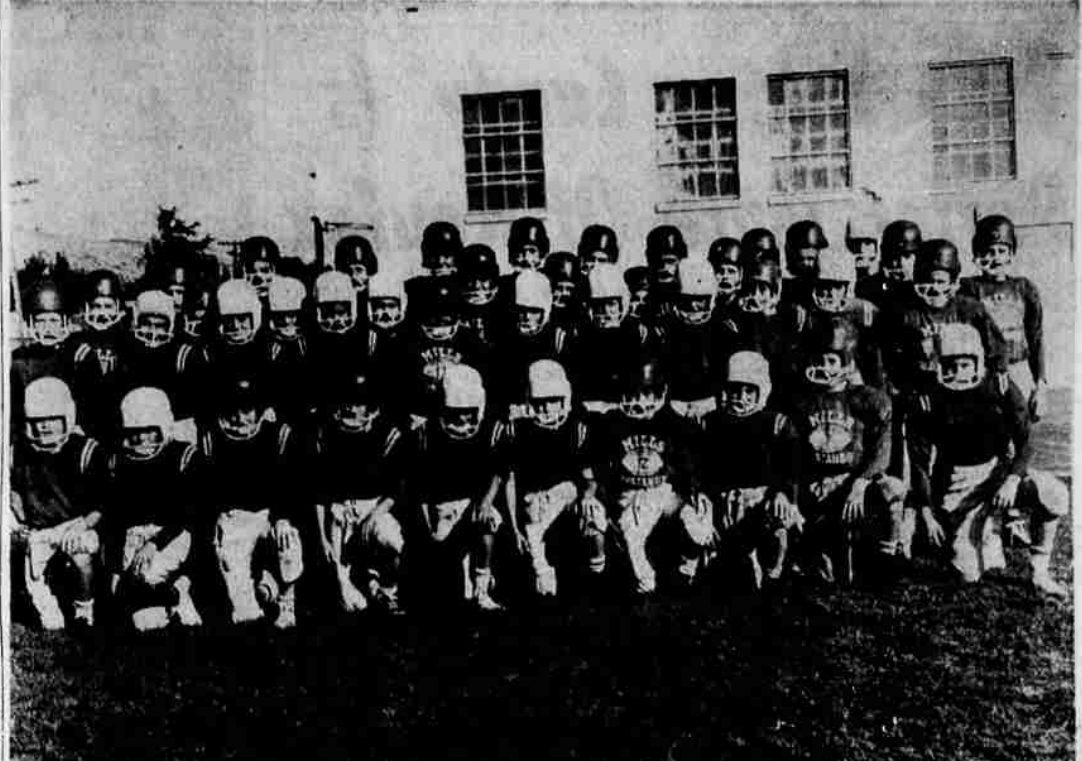

Annual Grade School Jamboree Takes Football Spotlight Tonight

Tonight's the night for the grade school gridders in Klamath Falls. It's the night of the annual football jamboree at Modoc Field as 12 teams from seven different schools perform for football fans young and old.

The jamboree, now in its 10th consecutive year, brings the young teams together for a night of action, with all youngsters ticketed for play.

The first contest starts at 6:15 p.m. and the games continue until completion at approximately 9 p.m.

The jamboree is sponsored by the Klamath Falls public schools and sends players from the sixth and seventh grades into action. No scores are kept, with the purpose of the jamboree to allow each player an opportunity of seeing action.

Tickets are sold by students of the participating schools and priced at 50 cents for adults and 15 cents for students.

KU Athletic Director Jim Johnson is in charge of the evening of football, with much assistance coming from interested citizens.

The Pelican Booster Club and the principals of the individual schools assist in the running of the jamboree and members of the Klamath Falls Officials Association supply officials at no charge.

In the operation of the jamboree, each team will play an eight-minute half and approximately 25 minutes is allowed for the completion of each of the six games scheduled.

At 6:15 p.m. the teams will be introduced to the crowd and at 6:30 p.m. the Conger-Riverside B team will face the Fairview B team.

Then in order will come games between the Conger-Riverside A team and the Fairview A team; Roosevelt B team vs. Mills B team; Roosevelt A team vs. Mills A team; the Midgets vs. Altamont I, and Altamont II vs. Sacred Heart.
