Coast Football Seeks Comeback

West Coast football, beaten eight out of 10 times so far this season in key intersectional games, faces another tough cross-country challenge this week but can start to "get well" if the odds-makers are right.

Southern California has been tabbed a six-point choice to beat Michigan State in Los Angeles tonight and recover from last Saturday's defeat by top-ranked Oklahoma.

On Saturday's slate it is Washington by six points over Iowa, Oregon is a seven-point choice to defeat West Virginia and Oregon State a four-point selection over Baylor.

The other side of the ledger finds eighth-ranked Pittsburgh a 13-point choice to defeat California and complete a three-game sweep of West Coast opposition.

The Bears, incidentally, hold one of two intersectional wins to be chalked up by a West Coast representative. They defeated Iowa State, 15-8, two weeks ago. San Jose State defeated Kansas State, 16-0, and Washington State gave the West Coast a 2-1 mark last Saturday by gaining a tie with Iowa, 14-14, while being done out of a critical fourth down.

Oregon hardly needed "Marvelous Mel" Renfro in routing Stanford last Saturday but he could be used more against a West Virginia team that is fresh from thumping Boston University, 34-0.

Fourth Victory Over Chokers Is Target Of Owls

Oregon Tech's Owls have faced the Grays Harbor Chokers three times.

All three times the Owls have posted wins.

However, the margin of the triumphs has been getting smaller and smaller.

Last year it was by a small 7-6 score that Ron Pfeister's Owls continued their dominance of the series.

Saturday night, the chore could become even more difficult.

The two teams collide at Modoc Field Saturday night at 8 p.m., with the Chokers bringing a 1-1 record to Klamath Falls against the 0-2 mark of the Owls.

Both teams are known to have improved considerably over one year ago.

The Chokers opened the 1963 campaign with an 8-6 win over Everett JC and last weekend lost to last year's Junior Rose Bowl team, Columbia Basin JC.

The Owls, meanwhile, opened with a 14-12 loss to the Seattle Ramblers and were impressive in defeat and last Saturday night were stopped by the Weber Wildcats.

Both the Chokers and the Owls have impressive lineups, with top gridders pacing the respective teams.

For the Chokers it's such people as 265-pound, 6-3 tackle Skip Davies and all-conference guard Sam Schlegel weighing 210.

Another top lineman is 185-pound end Rich VanZandt, who is the current Washington State 440-yard dash titleholder with a time of 48.5.

Impressive backs include John Mangini, 195-pounder who runs the 100-yard dash in 10 flat and Dick Johnson, a 190-pounder, with a 9.9 timing in the century. Both go at halfback for the Chokers and an added note on Johnson is that he is the son of former PCL hurler Chet Johnson.

The Chokers possess a pair of outstanding fullbacks in Bob Owens from Chicago and weighing 230 and Clyde Lucas at 220 pounds.

The Owls hope to offset this football talent with a good supply of their own, with five freshmen figured in the Oregon Tech starting offensive unit.

And on defense, the Owls will throw 11 top freshman gridders at the Choker offensive machine.

One of these is Leon Broadous, a 180-pounder from Jefferson of Portland who last weekend led the Owls in tackles with 15. Another receiving plaudits from Pfeister for work against Weber State is Al DeBortoli from Chiloquin and figured to see much action Saturday night.

Bruce Rodabaugh, a 215-pounder, was outstanding at defensive end for Oregon Tech and figures to again slow any outside stuff thrown against the Owls by the Chokers.

Offensively, the Owls will place their chances for the initial win of the year in the capable hands of quarterback Mike Glines, halfbacks Vic Ventura and Sonny Luke and fullback Bob Battle.

For Luke, the contest against the Chokers will be somewhat of a homecoming against former buddies, in that Luke transferred to Oregon Tech from the Washington school.

The Owls have stressed offense all week in practice sessions with a complete revision of their offensive formations the key to the workouts.

The Oregon Tech staff has been highly pleased with the results of the workouts this week, with good sessions witnessed the first three days of the week before the Owls tapered off Thursday.

The new offensive work appeared paying off well as run against the Owls' first defensive unit.

All hands are reported in good shape, with the exception of John Harris who is suffering from a badly sprained ankle and was a highly-doubtful performer against the Chokers as of today.

Another large crowd is expected for the contest at Modoc Field, with kickoff time slated for 8 p.m.

Dodgers Favored, 3-1

NEW YORK (UPI)—The Los Angeles Dodgers are favored at 3-1 today to win the best-of-seven World Series because of their victories over the Yankees in the first two games.

However, the Yankees are a slight choice at 11-10 to take Saturday's third game in Los Angeles. The clubs are idle today.

Before the Series, the Yankees had been favored at 7½-5 to win the classic.
