deer tag, in three unrelated cases during the weekend.

Late Sunday, police detected a car with a broken wheel at the bottom of an embankment near Shady Pine, about five miles north of Klamath Falls. Investigation by police indicated that the car had been reported stolen from Weed about 1:15 o'clock the same afternoon.

A safe that had been stolen during a burglary of Novak Parts Supply, 2835 South Sixth Street, last summer was recovered by police about 3:30 p.m., Saturday, nearly two miles north of Oregon Technical Institute. The safe was one of two recovered by police following a number of burglaries earlier this year in which safes were carried from the looted establishments.

Also on Saturday, police cited Harry David Anderson, Zigler

Motel, for tagging a forked horn buck with a 1962 deer tag. A police officer noted the expired tag during a check of deer carcasses at a local meat locker.

Police later established that Anderson had a hunting license and deer tag for this year. Anderson is to appear in District Court, Friday, Oct. 11. The hunter said he bagged the deer on Bryant Mountain.

## Seven Oregonians Die In Mishaps

Traffic accidents claimed the lives of seven Oregon residents during the weekend. Six of the deaths were recorded in the state. Mrs. Cora Macklin, 61, Springfield, was killed and 18 persons

were injured in a chain-reaction collision involving six cars and two trucks on Interstate Highway 5 two miles north of Albany Sunday morning.

State police said the crash occurred when a car slowed down as it hit a patch of fog and a freight truck smashed into the vehicle. Five other cars and a tank truck piled into the mass of wreckage, police said.

Shirley Laucks, 18, Medford, died when the car in which she was riding crashed 25 feet into a ravine off State Highway 62 south of Shady Cove State Park near Medford early Sunday.

Cole Young, 3, Eugene, was killed by a car in front of his home and Chester Morrill, 45, Bend, was killed in a one-car accident five miles south of Bend Saturday morning.
