

Chess Master Slates Exhibition Here Monday

International chess master George Koltanowski of San Francisco will be the special guest Sunday of the Klamath Chess Club, where he will play against 30 players simultaneously.

Koltanowski started playing chess at 14 and won the national championship of Belgium when he was 17. He won the World Blindfold Championship at Edinburgh, Scotland, in 1937. In Edinburgh, he played 34 games simultaneously while blindfolded. In 12 hours of play he won 24 of the games and drew 10.

The meeting will be held at the Klamath Falls Moose Lodge. Prior to Koltanowski's appearance Sunday, there will be a tournament with local players.

Registration Totals Listed

SALEM (UPI)—Registration for 34 of Oregon's 36 counties total 228,335 for the Oct. 15 special election, and figures for Klamath and Lincoln counties should up this total to about 738,000.

Figures on file with the secretary of state for the 34 counties which already have reported show 383,568 Democrats, 333,907 Republicans, and 10,869 others registered and eligible to vote.

Klamath County, which in 1962 had 20,489 registered voters, and Lincoln County, which in 1962 had 12,402, had not yet submitted reports of their new totals.

Of the 34 counties reporting, all showed registration declines except Sherman which recorded a slight gain.

Heart Attack While Hunting? Here's How To Render Aid

Oregon hunters are in danger this year—but not so much from careless gun handling.

Heart attacks have already claimed two hunters in the state this season and the Oregon Heart Association has compiled a set of instructions on what to do in case of heart attack in the woods.

Dr. Earl DuBois, president of the association, said this season's record is following those of past years in which more hunting deaths are caused by heart attacks than gun accidents.

He advised hunters to check with their doctors before taking to the woods. Hunting, he said, often puts a strain on bodies not accustomed to strenuous exercise.
