Lack Of Arms Fails To Stop High School Football Star

PROVIDENCE, R.I. (UPI) — The star place-kicker on the Classical High School football team has never made a tackle in his life.

Walter Christian Schumann, a junior, was born 15 years ago without arms.

Chris spent eight years in Illinois and did odd chores for the football team at the University of Illinois where his father was a professor.

The Schumanns moved to Swarthmore, Pa., when Chris was 10, but he became homesick for Illinois.

"I thought of a plan that would take me back," Chris said. "I intended to learn how to kick a football and return to play for the University of Illinois team."

Practiced Kicking

He practiced kicking a miniature football over a steel bar and three years later found himself a member of the Swarthmore High School football team.

During his first season, Chris recalled, he was successful on seven kicks, had two blocked and missed on six others.

His reason for playing football is simple.

"I want to be like others," he said, "not in appearance, but in the sense of participating with them."

He said he could have worn artificial limbs, but they were uncomfortable so he had to learn to play without them.

Coach Al Morro, who captained the Boston College football squad in 1942 when it went to the Sugar Bowl, said place-kicking is a rarity in high school football.

"You need not only a strong kicker," he said, "but someone with a good pair of hands who can catch the ball and place it to be kicked and a center who can pitch the ball back with accuracy, and whose got the time to train all these people?"

Worked Out System

But, time was made and a system was worked out.

NEW YORK (UPI) — Florida A&M, paced by "world's fastest human," Bob Hayes, was rated the No. 1 small college football team in the nation today by the United Press International board of coaches for the second consecutive week.

However, Northern Illinois, which moved up to second, and third-ranked Delaware received more first-place votes than the Rattlers and cut the Florida team's point lead nearly in half since the preceding week.

There were no new entries to the top 10, but there was quite a bit of shuffling.

Texas A&I jumped from eighth to fourth and drew five first-place ballots.

Montana State moved from sixth to fifth, San Diego State, from seventh to sixth and Wittenberg, from a ninth place tie to seventh. Lenoir Rhyne, the only team in the top 10 beaten last weekend, fell from fourth to eighth. Central Oklahoma dropped four notches to ninth and East Carolina slipped from a nine-place tie to 10th.

Tennessee Tech led the "second 10" in 11th spot, followed by East Central Oklahoma, South Dakota State, Massachusetts, and San Francisco State.

TEANECK, N. J. (UPI) — 24-year-old Don, in Don's Middleweights Jose Torres and Don Fulmer will meet in a return match, promoter Murray Goodman announced today, because Torres' victory Wednesday night was so close.

"Date of the 10-round bout will depend upon whether it is held at the New York Coliseum, or at Salt Lake City or here at the Teaneck Armory again," Goodman explained.

Sluggish Torres of Puerto Rico won the referee's decision Wednesday night before about 2,500 in the Armory. There are no boxing judges in New Jersey. Referee Joey Harrison gave five rounds to Torres, two to Fulmer of West Jordan, Utah, and called three even.

Torres weighed 161 pounds; Fulmer, 158.
