Sweet Taters 'N Meat As One

Fragrant redolent of the Old South wafts through the air as a rich platter of thinly sliced Sausage Sweet Potato Loaf is borne aloft to the table escorted by a bowl of tiny fresh peas and a basket of hot rolls, split and dressed with butter. A good thought for late supper or buffet flanked by mugs of hot coffee, for luncheon for the ladies with accompanying salad bowl and fruit dessert for slim figures.

2 sweet potatoes
2 eggs, beaten
1/2 cup orange juice
1 teaspoon grated orange peel
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup currant jelly
1 tablespoon butter
1 (8-ounce) can tomato sauce
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
Miniature marshmallows optional

ture and then a trip to the oven (375 degrees F) for half an hour. Meanwhile a scrumptious pour-over of melted currant jelly, butter, smooth tomato sauce and nutmeg warms atop the stove, to be spooned over the loaf for a brief return trip (15 minutes) to the oven. A garnish of orange slices at serving time emphasizes the orange flavor in the loaf and complements the high color and friendly taste of tomato sauce. A few miniature marshmallows sprinkled atop the sauce lend a festive note and give a pleasant impression that the cook has been fussing for a very special audience.

(Six servings)
1 pound pork sausage
1/2 pound ground beef
2 cups, mashed, cooked

Sausage browns with ground beef in the skillet (pour off excess fat) and is joined by sweet potatoes, beaten eggs, seasoning, orange juice and bright peel to spear the richness of the pork. Into the loaf pan goes the mix-

TWO TWISTS — These tuna sandwiches are versatile to suit your mood or the weather. Simply serve plain for a fast snack or a picnic. Or serve tuna sandwiches French toasted for a good, hearty, quick as a wink lunch or supper. You're ready to make sandwiches in minutes if you make the filling ahead of time and store in the refrigerator.

FRUITY
Bana-cherry fruit soup is appropriate as either first course or dessert. Mix together 2 cups of mashed banana (about 4 medium bananas, fully ripe), 1 (1 1/2 pound) can of pitted undrained dark sweet cherries, 1 (9 ounce) can of undrained pineapple tidbits, and 1/2 teaspoon of anise. Chill. Pour into 6 serving dishes of garnish with 1 medium banana, sliced and pass a dish of sour cream.

Tuna-Cheese Sandwiches

1 can (6 1/2 or 7 oz.) tuna, drained
1 package (3 oz.) cream cheese, softened
2 green onions, sliced thinly, tops and all
1 canned pimiento, chopped
1/2 teaspoon prepared horseradish
1/2 teaspoon salt
8 slices day-old white bread
Mix together first 6 ingredients. Spread tuna-cheese mixture on

4 slices of bread, then top with remaining 4 bread slices.
Plain: Add lettuce to each untoasted sandwich.
French Toasted: Beat 1 egg slightly; add 1/2 cup milk, 1/2 teaspoon salt, and 1/4 teaspoon pepper. Quickly dip sandwiches in milk-egg mixture and turn to coat both sides. Cook sandwiches in butter or margarine over medium heat until golden brown on both sides; turn once. Serve hot. Makes 4 sandwiches.

FROZEN FISH CASSEOLE
Don't wait for the fish to thaw for this delicious seafood dish. Spread butter evenly over frozen fish fillets and layer with slices of potato in a greased shallow baking dish. Mix 1/2 teaspoon suet, 1/2 teaspoon baking soda, 1/2 teaspoon each salt and onion powder and 2 tablespoons flour and sprinkle over the first layer of potato. Repeat layers as desired. Add 1/2 cup milk and bake at 450 degrees for 1 1/2 hours.
