

Portland State Vikings OCC Opener Foe For OTI

Modoc Field Scene Of Owls' Conference Kickoff Crucial

Now the play for keeps begins. Up to now, Ron Pfeister's Oregon Tech Owls have been learning. Whether they have learned their lessons well will be determined Saturday night at Modoc Field.

The picture on football in particular has changed considerably at Portland State. The result is the Vikings are one of the favorites for the OCC title this year. An opening league facing of Eastern Oregon by a 38-0 count is testimony. Oregon Tech has a new outlook also under the guidance of former Oregon standout Pfeister. No longer are the Owls teams out for a bit of physical exercise on the football field. Now the school has taken on a new look in regards to winning or losing. Losses are no longer tolerated on the Mile-High Campus with a shrug.

In the PSC-OTI series, which dates back to 1948 when the teams opened with a scoreless tie, the Owls have won seven games, the Vix five and two contests have ended in ties. But since the arrival of one Billy "Bye-Bye" White on the Portland State scene from Roseburg, the Owls have been downed in two straight. In 1960, when White was a freshman, the Owls collected their last victory in the series by a score of 19-14.

Recruiting from Hawaii has proved a real bonus for the Owls. The '63 Owl squad has three outstanding ball players from Hawaii, Richard Yamashiro, Henry Pelfry and Vic Ventura. Yamashiro has earned a starting berth at the guard spot. The 5-10, 195-pound guard is an aggressive, hard-nosed player who loves the contact in football.

Yamashiro's speed and size make him a potential All-Conference choice his first year on the mile high campus. Teamed with the other Owl guard, Ken Lenhardt, Yamashiro has been a consistent blocker and outstanding punting guard. Victor Ventura, another frosh from the island of Hawaii, is a first string end for the Owls. Ventura, 5-10, 175 pounds, does not have exceptional size or speed but he has a real desire to catch that ball and this he has done on several occasions this season.

The third member of the lava kickers is Henry Pelfry. Pelfry recently earned a first string spot at the linebacker slot. He also plays the fullback position and this he does well, too. All three boys are welcome additions to the Owl camp and the OTI grid staff has high hopes that it will be good in most parts of the state.

One exception to the Saturday opener is Malheur County, where the season will open Oct. 26. In western Oregon, hunting prospects look best in Marion, Clackamas, Yamhill and Washington counties, and in the Medford-Sams Valley area of the Rogue Valley, according to the State Game Commission.

Bird Season Sets Start

PORTLAND (UPI) — Oregon's pheasant and quail season opens Saturday at 8 a.m., with prospects good in most parts of the state.

Best areas east of the Cascades will be Jefferson, Sherman, Grant, Baker and Union counties for both quail and pheasant, and Wasco, Gilliam, Morrow and Umatilla counties for pheasants. The Klamath Basin is expected to be poor for pheasants, but good for quail in sagelands adjacent to agricultural areas.
