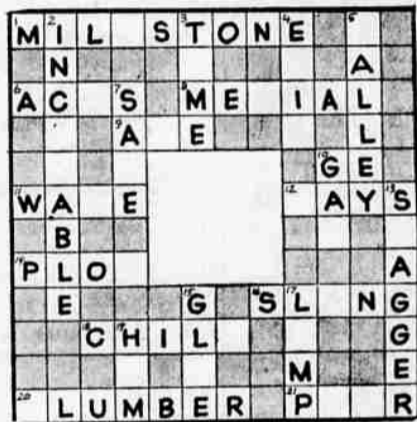

COINWORD CONTEST RULES

Box 941. Mail entries must be postmarked not later than 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, and entries must be deposited in the COINWORD contest boxes by 12:00 noon Wednesday.
5. The Herald and News will award a prize of \$100.00 to the winner of each week's COINWORD contest. If more than one winning answer is received, the prize will be divided equally among the winners. If no correct solution is received, the amount of the weekly prize will be increased \$25.00 each week the puzzle is not solved. (\$2,500.00 maximum).
