

# GOP Hopes To Pick Up Seven Seats

EUGENE, Ore. (UPI)—The Republicans hope to gain at least seven Congressional seats in the 11 Western states.

This estimate came today from Frank Reynolds of San Francisco, Western Regional Coordinator for the GOP's National Congressional Committee. Democrats now lead 41-29 in the number of Western congressmen.

Reynolds said in an interview at the Western Republican Conference that despite the congressional lineup favoring Democrats, President John F. Kennedy's program will be a major issue in the legislative campaigns next year.

"He is not the hero of the West," Reynolds said. "He only won three states out here in 1960."

The GOP official said he expected the Republicans to pick up two seats now held by Democrats in California and one each in Montana, Idaho, Colorado, New Mexico and Arizona.

# High-Living Army Sergeant Sold Secrets To Reds Before Killing Self

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Demands for a sweeping review of U. S. security procedures appeared certain today to follow disclosures that a high-living Army sergeant sold secrets to the Russians for an estimated \$60,000.

The Defense Department said Thursday night that Sgt. I.C. Jack Edward Dunlap, 35, an employe of the super-secret National Security Agency (NSA), peddled classified materials to Red agents for more than two years, but killed himself when his lavish spending gave him away.

Dunlap's breach of U. S. security was the second case at NSA in three years. In 1960 NSA mathematicians Bernon F. Mitchell

and William H. Martin fled to the Soviet Union by way of Mexico and Cuba.

NSA deals with high-level military intelligence, particularly codes and ciphers of this country and foreign powers. Its work is perhaps the most secret of all government agencies.

The Pentagon insisted that Dunlap, who was originally assigned to NSA headquarters at Ft. George G. Meade, Md., in April 1958 as a driver, did not have access to top secret U. S. codes and ciphers.

Arthur Sylvester, assistant secretary of defense for public affairs, said Dunlap had told his wife he received between \$30,000 and \$40,000 during the first two years of his dealings with Red spies. Informed sources put Dunlap's total take at \$60,000, however.

Sen. Richard B. Russell, D-Ga., chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, who received a confidential report on the incident, said he was "shocked that such a thing as this could have occurred in this agency."

Russell said the incident "reveals a glaring weakness in their personnel policy." He said his

committee would await the results of a complete investigation being conducted by the Army's Counter-Intelligence Corps before deciding whether to take any action on its own.

Pentagon officials would not comment on whether the FBI or other government agencies have established the identity of Dunlap's Soviet contacts.

Dunlap, a native of Bogalusa, La., was married and the father of five. He joined the Army in 1952 and was "relieved" of his NSA duties "several weeks" before his suicide last July 23, according to the Defense Department.

His body was found in his new yellow Cadillac about a mile from his home at Glen Burnie, Md., early on the morning of July 23 by Anne Arundel County police. He had run a hose from the exhaust of the car through

the front window, where he was treated and released.

Police said it was Dunlap's second suicide attempt. On June 16, he took an overdose of sleeping pills at a motel near Ft. Meade. He was found about 2:30 p.m. that day by a friend, Robert Tester of Glen Burnie. Tester took him to the base hospital

Asked about the case, the White House said through Press Secretary Pierre Salinger that the Defense Department "has indicated that various government agencies have investigated and will continue to investigate the matter."
