Commodore Cliff Evans urges all past commodores to be present. They will be specially honored during the evening. Guests are also welcome.

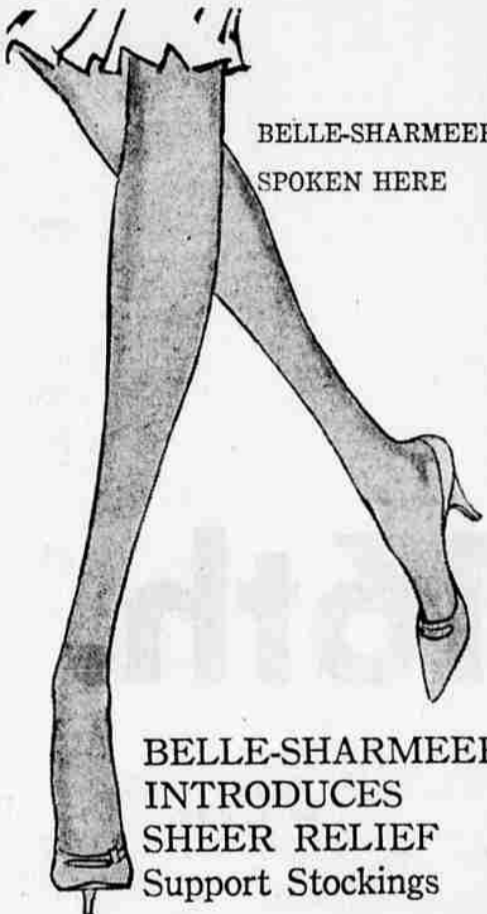
Dress for the occasion is semi-formal.

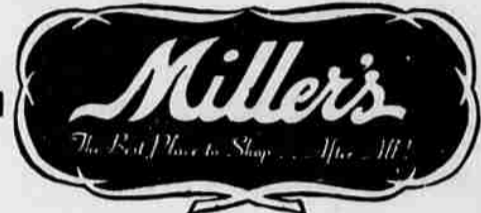
