In going against Rogue River, the Hornets will seek to increase their winning streak over the Chieftains to five straight.

Last year the Hornets collected a 7-6 triumph to add to three consecutive wins in as many years.

Hurt Boxer Is Critical

BALTIMORE (UPI) — Ernie Knox, a 28-year-old Baltimore hood carrier and part-time heavyweight boxer, remained unconscious and in critical condition today at Provident Hospital.

Knox lapsed into a coma several hours after being knocked out by veteran heavyweight Wayne Bethea of New York in the ninth round of a bout at the Coliseum Monday night.

Neurosurgeons who performed emergency brain surgery on Knox Tuesday gave him "little chance of survival."

While Knox was battling for his life, Baltimore Mayor Theodore R. McKeldin said he would do everything in his power to prevent a professional boxing match from being booked at the city's new \$14 million Civic Center.

McKeldin said that under present conditions, pro boxing is "terrible and brutal." He termed the match between Knox and Bethea — in which Bethea held a 27-pound weight advantage — a "mismatch."

Knox took a tremendous beating at the hands of Bethea, who punished him with right uppercuts and left hooks for the nine rounds the fight lasted.
