

Big Name Golfers Seek Tourney Lead

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (UPI)—Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus,

Gene Littler, Art Wall and the other big names in the golfing business go out today to try and catch the front-running Al

Geiberger in the second round of the \$70,000 Sahara Invitational Golf tournament.

The Paradise Valley Country Club proved anything but a paradise Thursday when rain and wind swept across it in the late afternoon to ruin some of the bids for the leadership.

But Geiberger, 26-year-old former college star, came in early with a four-under-par 67 that stood up all day against the onslaughts of stars from the United States and British Ryder Cup teams.

Closest in contention are Gay Brewer and Lionel Hebert, who finished early; and Art Wall, who finished after the rain let up, each with 68.

Eight In Contention
In the 69 bracket were eight men: Tommy Aaron, Ray Floyd, George Will of England, Ted Kroil, Bill Blanton, Don January, George Knudson and Bob Nichols.

Geiberger, who had an early starting time, will be off the tee late today — and he hopes that there is no duplication of weather.

"When I played the par five, wind behind us and I reached

home with a drive and a five-iron," said Geiberger. But some of the players coming in late when the wind shifted, couldn't get home with two woods.

Nicklaus is going to have to come from far back to make a run for the \$13,000 first prize money. He had a big 75 after being hit by the rainstorm.

He was in trouble as he had difficulty judging distances against the mountain backdrop. He was out in 40, back in 35 after bogeying the last two holes.

Palmer is in better contention at 71, while Littler has a 73.

Plays Brilliant Golf
Geiberger played brilliant golf en route to his 67. He hit every green in regulation figures and was only off the fairways twice. He had four birdies and no bogies.

Wall probably had the most exciting round of the day. He rolled in a 53-footer for a birdie on the very first hole. He followed that with one from 50 feet on the 12th; and topped off the round with a 40-footer on the last hole despite a sopping wet, spongy green.

The first hole-in-one of the tournament was chalked up by Bob Duden, the pendulum putter man from Oregon, who knocked in a four-iron on the 167-yard eighth hole. However, he finished with a 74. It was the 18th hole in-one of the 1963 PGA tour.

Along with Palmer at even par 71 were Rex Baxter, Doug Sanders, Chi Chi Rodriguez, Bill Eggers, Jack Fleck and Claude King.

Ducks, OSU Are Tabbed

Oregon and Oregon State go into Saturday afternoon football games as favorites, and if either one should fall on its face there'll be lots of people watching.

Oregon is rated a two-touchdown favorite over Arizona in a game that will be televised throughout the West from Tucson.

Oregon State has been made a 10-point favorite over Washington State in the OSU Homecoming game at Corvallis.

The Webfoots take a 3-1 record and the third-best total offense record in the nation against Arizona, but the Wildcats have speed and should be acclimated to the 92-degree temperature expected for the contest. Arizona has won two out of five contests this fall.

Quarterback Bob Berry goes into the game as the No. 3 man in the nation in total offense. He has gained 721 yards this season, more than anyone except Navy's Roger Staubach and Northwestern's Tom Myers.

At Corvallis, both the Beavers and the Cougars are looking for someone on which to take out the frustrations of last weekend. Oregon State had a 10-game winning streak snapped and took a 34-7 pasting from Washington. Washington State was upset 13-8 by San Jose State.

The Cougars boast one of the best runners in the Northwest in halfback Clarence Williams and the nation's No. 10 passer in Dave Mathieson. End Dennis Kloke is the top pass receiver in the Big Six with 18 catches.

If coach Jim Sutherland is to have to contend with Beaver defensive halfback Danny Espalin this week, Espalin was hurt and missed the Washington game.

This week Gary will have to be at his best for the aerial circus of Southern Oregon. For Wald and quarterback Mike Glines and tackle John Harris, Saturday's game will be a homecoming. All three boys played prep ball at Crater High School in Central Point. It's a good bet the boys will want to perform in top flight action for their hometown crowd.

The rumor is the Red Raiders plan another 50-0 romping. The Owls hope to smother this rumor and prove to the Southern Oregon fans that OTI athletics are second to none!

Owl Outlook

The annual nemesis is almost upon us. The Owls will meet Southern Oregon tomorrow night in an OCC counter, Southern Oregon and Oregon Tech have been fierce rivals for years. In 1948 the Owls and the Red Raiders met for the first time. The SOC crew dominated. Since that time the Owls have won five, the Raiders seven, and there was one tie. The balance of athletic power between the schools has shifted from year to year. In 1952 the Owls downed SOC by an overwhelming 89-0. Last year SOC humbled OTI 50-0.

This year's game should not be a runaway for either squad. SOC with the passing attack of outstanding reputation will be the favorite. The Red Raiders have switched all-conference quarterback Doug Olsen to wingback. In this position Olsen is a running and passing threat. To fill Olsen's spot SOC uses Bill Bailey, a 6-1, 155-pound junior from Anderson, Calif. The Red Raiders will center their running attack around fullback Mike Hood. Hood also passes well which only complicates matters for the Owls.

Last year it was the Owls' homecoming when the two squads met—most people would like to forget it. It was a tremendous morale and physical beating for the young Owls. However there is one Owl griddler who hasn't forgotten the abasement of last season's loss.

The sting of the 50-0 romping is still remembered by veteran lineman Chuck Hawkins. Hawkins 6-4, 210-pounds, was the Owls' starting end. It was his first season in OTI athletics and the Vallejo JC transfer learned the hard way that Southern Oregon plays a rugged, sometime colorful game of football. This season Chuck is anchoring the Owls' defensive line at the center spot.

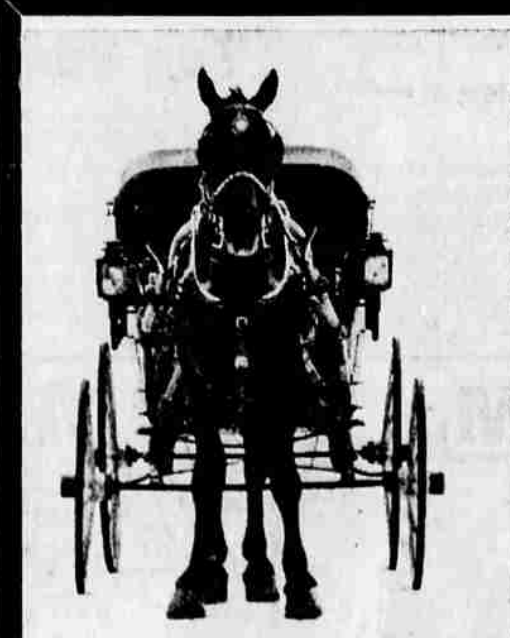

Celtics Make It Two With One-Point Win

It's two-for-two today for the Boston Celtics — a team so great it can lose Bob Cousy and go on winning like they never heard of the block.

Twenty-four hours after blitzing the Baltimore Bullets, the Celtics scored their second straight victory of the National Basketball Association season Thursday night, 93-92, over the Cincinnati Royals at Cincinnati. The loss was Cincinnati's

first in a home opener since 1957. Bill Russell connected with a free throw with seven seconds remaining to give the Celtics a 93-90 lead and they let Oscar Robertson drive in unopposed for a two-pointer as time ran out. The Celtics went "cold" in the fourth period, hitting only 2 of 26 field goal attempts, and were outscored, 27-11, in the final quarter.

Sam Jones scored 24 points and John Havlicek had 21 for the Celtics while Robertson led the Royals with 20. Former Ohio State All American Jerry Lucas had 13 points and 20 rebounds for the Royals.

The Bullets rebounded from their Wednesday night loss to the Celtics by beating the New York Knickerbockers, 115-113, at New York. Si Green hit two free throws to give the Bullets a one-point lead with less than a minute to play and then stole the ball to clinch the victory.

Terry Dischinger led the Bullets with 25 points and Johnny Green had 23 for the Knicks. New York Coach Eddie Donovan was ejected from the game with nine minutes remaining for what referee Earl Strom said was "constant bickering, shouting and second-guessing."

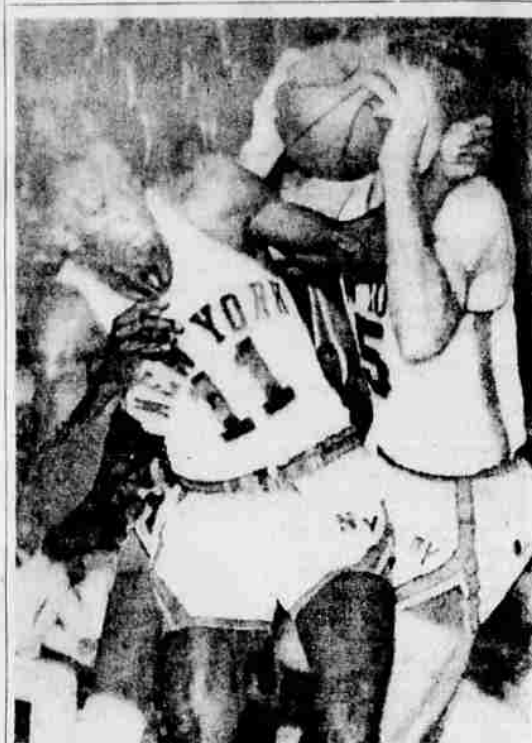
