It ended with the announcement that the Oregon Webfoots would be involved in a "first" in the football world with the televising of the Duck-Washington Huskies game via closed circuit in the Portland area.

And sandwiched in between was the Oregon School Activities Assn. ruling which shocked the state prep teams as the Class B champion of 1962, Monroe, lost its title to the Merrill Huskies for use of an ineligible player.

The wackiest of football weekends slowed many would-be prognosticators with six of the nation's so-called "top ten" falling last Saturday. Look at 'em: Texas over the No. 1 team, Oklahoma; SMU over Navy; California tying Duke — almost another upset; and here on the coast such games as San Jose dropping Washington State, Washington belting Oregon State, and Lewis & Clark ending Linfield's winning skein.

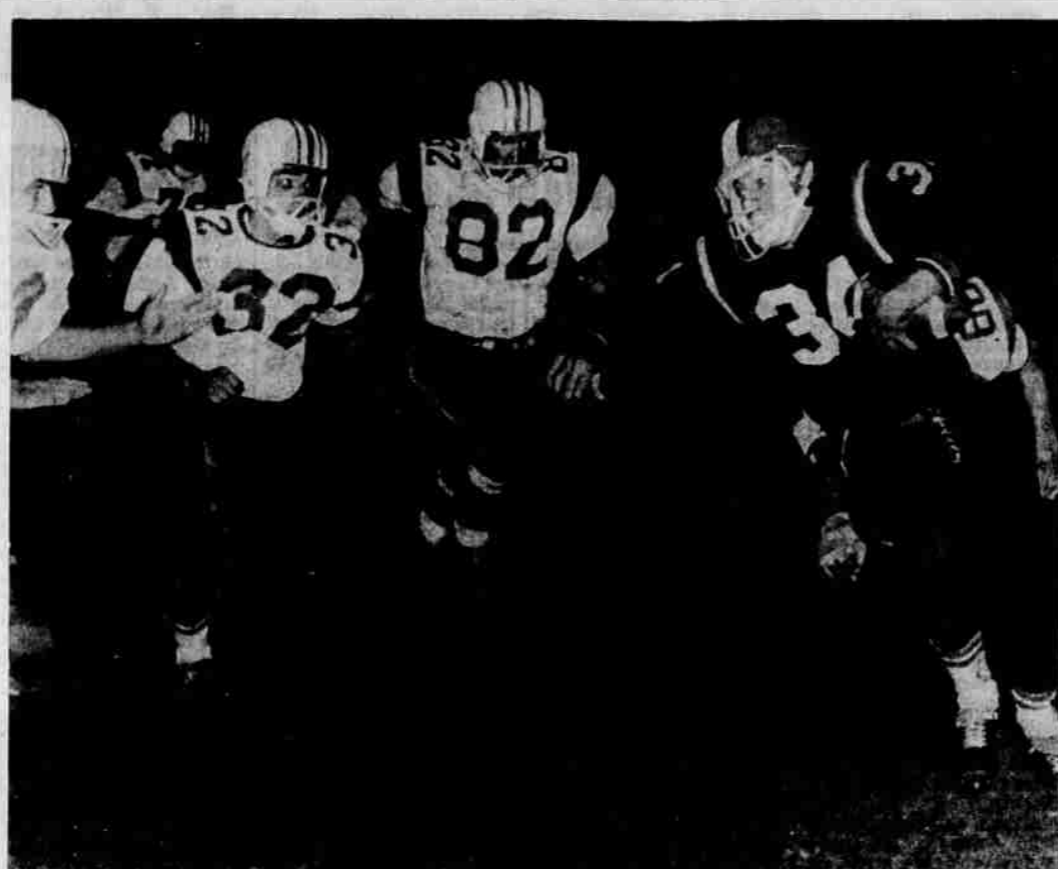
These are just a few. There were more. Needless to say, the bookies (oops!) made a killing. The sellout of the Oregon-Washington football game in Portland Oct. 26 brought about the first class circuit showing via the "booth tube" for the first time in the Northwest.

Closed circuit showing of football games is a matter of practice in Canada and this "first" by the Ducks will probably lead to others. Muultnomah Stadium seats some 26,000 and the Glass Palace in Portland, where the TV showing will be held, seats 10,000 of which about 8,500 will be available for the telecast.

With 1:22 left in the first half and the ball on the Medford 39, Mike Barnes unlimbered his aerial game and hit Greg Gande for a 29-yard gain to the Pelican 32.

With 1:22 left, Barnes again took to the air and rifled a 32-yard touchdown heave to end Frank Toews and it was a 19-0 game. Murray again added the PAT on a run for a 20-0 score.

It was a wild attempt on the PAT with Piche fading to pass and almost completely surrounded and falling but he got the pass off to Bill Houston for the 34-0 game with 38 seconds left.
