### Winston's Daughter Succumbs

**LONDON (UPI)**—The death of Diana Churchill, oldest daughter of Sir Winston Churchill, was announced today by a family spokesman.

The Westminster coroner's office said it was examining some bottles found at Miss Churchill's home before deciding whether to hold an inquest.

It was understood the 54-year-old Miss Churchill was found dead Sunday in the bedroom of her home in the expensive Belgrave district of London.

Neighbors said she had not appeared ill, and when last seen Saturday night seemed "gay and carefree."

Miss Churchill was the former wife of Duncan Sandys, Commonwealth relations secretary in the current cabinet. They were divorced in 1960 and she took her maiden name again.

Miss Churchill also had been married to John Milner Bailey, a wealthy South African. They were divorced in 1935 after three years of marriage.

Miss Churchill was one of the first women to volunteer for military duty when World War II broke out in 1939. She became an officer in the Women's Royal Naval Service and later a Red Cross worker.

She had three children from her marriage with Sandys. The oldest, Julian, is 29.

### Berbers Surround Group Of U.S. Correspondents

**BOU-ARFA, Morocco (UPI)**—Yelling, chanting Berber villagers surged around us, pinning us in front of the army garrison in this desert town near the Algerian-Moroccan frontier.

"Long live the king (Hassan of Morocco)!" they chanted together in Arabic. "Make stew out of (Algerian President Ahmed) Ben Bella! Give us weapons to defend the true frontier of Morocco!"

The Moroccans staged a wild, 45-minute demonstration when a group of foreign correspondents arrived here en route to the frontier near the village of Ich, raided Friday by the Algerian army.

Bou-Arfa is 90 miles northwest of Colomb Bechar, Algeria.

The village is inhabited by simple, weatherbeaten people who herd the goats and camels through the unpaved streets. They are edgy because their adobe houses and families are in the troubled frontier area.

When we arrived, men, young and old, raced over the desert to stare at us Westerners, a sight seldom seen in the Moroccan desert.

We were taken to an army garrison. The villagers gathered across the street, quietly watching the photographers.

Then one spotted a tape recorder and began to shout his feelings to the newsmen, who

had come from so far away. Immediately, leathery-faced men in modest white robes and ragged turbans joined in to demonstrate their solidarity against Ben Bella.

Yelling in near-frenzy, they swept across the street. The correspondents retreated behind the garrison walls but the mob, smiling and chanting, charged through the gateway.

Women arrived, some so excited that their white veils slipped off to reveal blue tattoos on cheeks and chins. Silver bracelets jangling, they shouted

"Ben Bella is a pig." Soldiers had to join hands to keep back the crowd. Finally army officers sneaked the 22 foreign correspondents out the back door to waiting trucks.

### Mme. Nhu Sees Hope

**WASHINGTON (UPI)**—Mme. Ngo Nhu, South Viet Nam's controversial First Lady, believes Americans are sympathetic to her but "puzzled like me" about U.S. policies towards her country.

Mme. Nhu, on an unofficial tour of the United States, said the American people have heard only one side of the story about Viet Nam. "For once they hear something else," she said Sunday during a radio program.

She appeared on From the People — Radio Press International.

She criticized the State Department for suspending some U.S. economic aid to Viet Nam when "we are winning the war." She said she considered it proof that the United States was trying to stir up the Vietnamese against the government headed by her brother-in-law, Ngo Dinh Diem.

Mme. Nhu predicted that Viet Nam would repay all aid provided by the United States, and said that even now her country is looking for ways to reduce U.S. help.

### U.S. Continues To Live Under 'Shadow Of War'

**BOSTON (UPI)**—President Kennedy said Saturday in a foreign policy address that despite new hopes of peace on the horizon "we still live in the shadow of war."

Kennedy spoke at the University of Maine in Orono where he was awarded an honorary doctor of laws degree.

Then he made an aerial inspection of Passamaquoddy Bay, proposed site of a hydroelectric project, before flying here.

In his University of Maine speech the President said the United States must continue to explore every possible pathway to peace, but warned that the road ahead is "long and hard and full of traps and pitfalls." He added that it is no reason "not to take every step we can safely take."

Kennedy recalled the Cuban crisis came a year ago next week and criticized Republicans who have accused him of backing down after demanding the withdrawal of Russian missiles.

He said only the most "zealous partisan" could call the

Cuban matter a defeat for this country.

"While it is too late to say that nothing has changed in Soviet-American relations, it is too early to assume that the change is permanent."

"There are new rays of hope on the horizon — but we still live in the shadow of war."

The Chief Executive said there was nothing inconsistent about signing an atmospheric nuclear test ban, on the one hand, and testing underground on the other, nor about being willing to sell surplus wheat to the Soviets while refusing to sell strategic items.
