# Big Game Hunters Look To Elk Season Opener

Somewhere around 50,000 big game hunters will be heading for the high timbered areas of the state this weekend for the big game animal many feel is the most challenging trophy animal on the North American continent.

The Saturday opening, Oct. 26, sparks the opening of the general elk season scheduled to run through Nov. 11 in the coastal units and through Nov. 24 in the Cascades and eastern Oregon areas. Bull elk only will be legal game along the coast, Cascades and northeastern Oregon elk country, while elk of either sex may be taken on southeastern Oregon ranges. In the bull hunting areas of the state, the bag limit is one bull elk with antlers longer than the ears.

The north coast area, which includes the Clatsop, Wilson and Trask units, will be hunted on a permit basis only and hunters without these permits must confine their hunting to other areas. Only those hunters holding valid bull elk hunting permits for the above-named units may hunt in the north coast area. The Wilson unit hunt is limited to five days, Oct. 26 through Oct. 30.

The south coast areas will be open for bull elk hunting with a general season tag, but the Dixon unit is to be hunted on a permit basis only. The game commission reminded hunters also that in these units no other hunting will be allowed during the permit season except

that authorized by the permit. Units open for general bull elk hunting along the coastal area include the Willamette, Alsea, Siuslaw, Elkton, Melrose, Tioga and Powers. All other coastal units are closed to general season elk hunting.

In the Cascades and northeastern Oregon, units available to bull elk hunters include Hood River, Wasco, Santiam, McKenzie, Metolius, Deschutes, Fort Rock, Keno, Rogue, Columbia Basin, Walla Walla, Wenaha, Sled Springs, Chesnimus, Snake River, Imnaha, Minam, Catherine Creek, Baker, Starkley, Ukiah, Heppner, Desolation, and Umatilla.

Elk hunters after either-sex elk during the general season will have available the Wheeler, Grizzly, Ochoco, Maury, Northside, Keating, Lookout Mountain, Murderer's Creek, Beulah, Malheur River, and

Silvies units to try their luck. Clatsop and Wilson unit permit holders are reminded that the season does not open until 9 on the opening morning of the season.

Hunters are urged to check the regulations in the big game synopsis for tagging big game and other requirements while the animal is in transit, in the field, or transferred to another person. The antlers with eyes and scalp attached must remain with the animal taken, while in the field or in transit from the hunting area.

Rifles that do not meet the following minimum requirements are not legal for elk hunting. Minimum requirements include a rifle of at least 25-inch bore diameter, and developing at least 1,220 foot pounds of energy at 100 yards. Elk hunting rifles must meet both of these requirements.

## Oregon Tech Draws Pacific In Tip-Off

Willamette University will again host the finals of the fifth annual NAIA Tip-Off Basketball Tourney, but for the first time in the history of the meet, Pacific University in Forest Grove will host two nights of action.

Eight teams are entered in the three-day meet, Dec. 5-7, with the format as follows: At Pacific, Portland State vs. Lewis and Clark and Oregon Tech vs. Pacific; at Willamette, Linfield vs. Oregon College and

Eastern Oregon vs. Willamette in first round action.

Second round play continues at the two sites with winners advancing to the championship bracket. On Saturday, Dec. 7, all eight squads will play at Willamette starting at 5 p.m.

The Salem Exchange Club will again sponsor the tourney which signals the start of pre-season play for the Northwest Conference and Oregon Collegiate Conference teams participating. Lewis and Clark College won last year's championship.

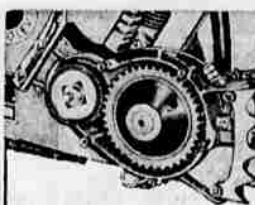

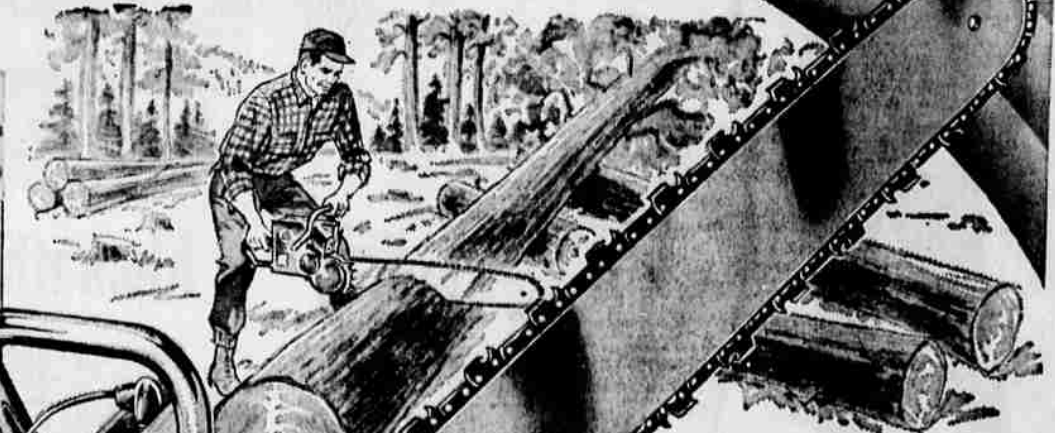
