

11 Arraigned Following Grand Jury Indictments

Eleven persons indicted by the grand jury were arraigned in circuit court Tuesday and five others will appear Friday morning for arraignment.

None of the 11 submitted a plea. Nine of the eleven will also appear Friday to plead and the other two will submit pleas at a later date.

William Edward Unsworth, indicted for second degree murder, will submit his plea Oct. 30 at 9:30 a.m. to Judge Donald A. W. Piper. He is accused of shooting a farm laborer near Beatty in April, 1962. Unsworth's original conviction was set aside by the Supreme Court.

Clifford George Jr., indicted for assault with a dangerous weapon and assault with intent to commit rape, will submit his plea next Monday at 9:30 a.m. He is accused of cutting with a knife and striking with a croquet mallet a woman near Chilcoquin Sept. 27.

Three persons who had been released on bail prior to being indicted will appear Friday for arraignment. They are Clyde Bell, charged with burglary not in a dwelling; William Richard Best, burglary not in a dwelling; and Wesley Robert Johnson, concealing stolen property.

Three of the persons appearing for arraignment Tuesday

had been indicted secretly and their names had not previously been announced.

Two of them are women—Colleen Crume, 23, and Darlene Sanchez, 22. They are accused of assault with a dangerous weapon for shooting at a man and attacking him with a meat cleaver. They will appear Friday at 9:30 a.m. for submission of a plea.

The other person appearing after secret indictment was Theodore Albert-Julius Drummond of Eugene, accused of obtaining money by false pretenses. He is accused of passing worthless checks in Klamath Falls last month and will appear Friday for a plea.

Samuel Julius Amato, accused of burglary not in a dwelling, and Jimmy Wurst, indicted for obtaining property by false pretenses, will be arraigned Friday. Their arraignment was delayed because their attorney wasn't available.

The others arraigned Tuesday who will appear Friday to plead are James Doering, forgery; Charles Byrd, assault with a dangerous weapon; Ray Walsh, forgery; Delmar Lloyd Nash, forgery; Cecil Rachal, concealing stolen property; and Donald Roy Storms, unlawfully obtaining public assistance.

Skate Rink Refinished

Just in time for the winter season, the City Parks and Recreation Department has completed refinishing of the Moore Park ice skating rink.

Parks and Recreation Director Gary Woodring said the rink was resurfaced and asphalt retaining curbs were installed. The work was done by city crews. It is expected that ice skating lessons will be offered at the rink again this year.

Also, Woodring announced that the irrigation pump house at the park has been reconstructed with brick at a cost of \$650. One other recently completed project is an asphalt winding walk across Conger Park providing access to Conger School from Siskiyou Street.

Neuberger Bill Asks Credit On Federal Income Tax

A bill to secure a seven per cent tax credit on federal income taxes paid was introduced Tuesday in Congress by Sen. Maurine Neuberger.

In her introductory speech, Senator Neuberger called attention to the recent defeat of the proposed new income tax increase law at the polls in Oregon, and cautioned that many states are faced with rising tax burdens.

She said, "The efforts of state legislators to retain a progressive tax structure have long

been clouded by the fear that industry and risk capital would tend to flee to neighboring states which choose to rely heavily upon regressive sales and other excise taxes."

Under provisions of the bill she introduced, each taxpayer would be able to take a credit on his federal income tax of seven per cent for state income taxes paid.

In other words, a taxpayer whose federal income tax liability was \$100 would be able to deduct \$7, assuming that he or she has paid at least that amount in state income taxes.

In her statement, Senator Neuberger suggested that this procedure would then, in the case of taxpayers in Oregon, make

available about \$27 million that could then be "freed either to be taxed by the state, or if the state should choose not to increase income rates, then to serve as a tax reduction to the taxpayer."

At present, federal taxpayers are permitted to deduct their state income tax as a deduction off the gross amount. The proposed bill would not disturb

this feature, but would add the extra seven per cent credit to be subtracted from the total net tax bill.

At the close of her remarks, Senator Neuberger asked that the bill be printed and that it lay over for a period of seven days for co-sponsors to add their support.
