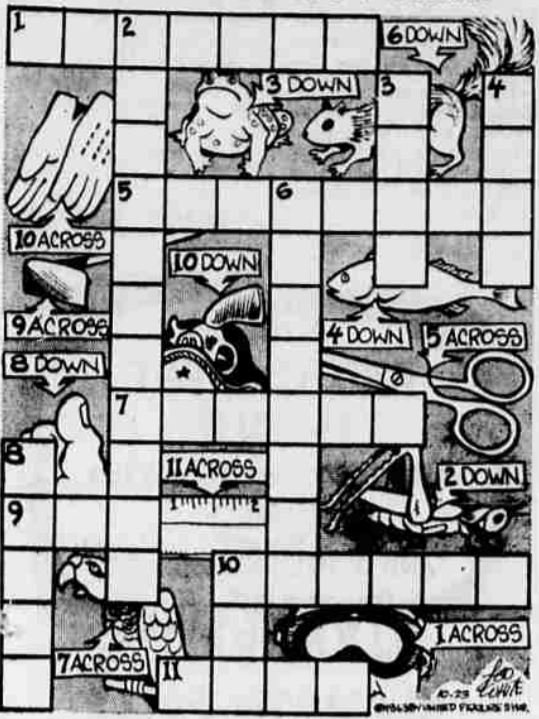


**LITTLE PEOPLE'S PUZZLE**

**Beware City Streets, Particularly Saturdays**

One person was killed and 79 were injured in 364 traffic accidents reported in Klamath Falls for the first seven months of this year, according to a special report released by the State Department of Motor Vehicles.

Of the 79 persons injured, 19 were hurt seriously, 37 others suffered visible injuries such as bruises and abrasions, and the remaining 23 complained of pain without any signs of injury being visible.

The leading cause of injuries was attributed to two or more motor vehicles being operated in traffic. Fifty-five injuries were reported in such cases, followed by incidents involving pedestrians, 8; parked motor vehicles, 7; vehicles running off roads, 5; cars overturned on roadway, 2; and miscellaneous accidents and those involving bicycles, 1 each.

The report shows that city streets were more dangerous for motorists than primary state highways leading through Klamath Falls.

Of the 364 accidents, 197 occurred on city streets, with 172 resulting in property damage and 25 in personal injuries, including one fatality. On primary state highways, 165 reported accidents resulted in property damage to 131 vehicles and injuries to 34 persons.

More accidents were reported on Saturday than any other day during the week. That day led with 60, followed by Friday, 59, and Monday, 54. The summary noted that accidents occurred most frequently during the two-hour period from 3 to 5 p.m.

Statewide figures reveal that 30,882 accidents were reported for the first six months of 1963, with 11,211 of the number recorded resulting in personal injuries and 247 in fatalities.

Multnomah led the state's 36 counties in the number of vehicular accidents reported during the six-month period with 13,887, followed by Marion, 2,029; Clackamas, 1,470, and Jackson, 1,130. Klamath ranked ninth with 679.

**Enrollment Hits Record Figure**

ASHLAND — Enrollment at Southern Oregon College for the fall term has risen to an all-time record of more than 2,100 students.

Registrar Mrs. Mabel W. Winston said this tops last year's high of 1,856 students by nearly 250.

There was an 18.6 per cent increase in new students, but there was also an upswing in the number of returning students of 10.1 per cent over last year.

**Bids Sought On 12 Tank Reservoirs**

PORTLAND—Plans for construction of 12 earth tank type reservoirs in Lake County were announced Friday by the Portland office of the Bureau of Land Management.

All projects are to be located approximately 40 miles east of Lakeview, with each reservoir requiring about 7,210 cubic yards of excavation.

Bidders are asked to furnish all labor, transportation, equipment, tools and supplies and perform all work necessary for the construction of the reservoirs.

Bids will be opened at 2 p.m. on Nov. 8 in the Field Administrative Office of BLM, Room 720, 1002 NE Holladay St., in Portland.

The work is set aside for small business concerns only.

A guided inspection tour of the project sites will be conducted by BLM personnel if prospective bidders indicate sufficient interest. The BLM district manager in Lakeview will provide tour information.
