

### Dr. Pauling Criticizes Moon Plan

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Dr. Linus C. Pauling, the controversial chemist who has twice won the Nobel Prize, sharply criticized the United States' man-on-the-moon program today as a waste of talent and money better used in the battle against human suffering.

Pauling, this year's winner of the Nobel Peace Prize, said "something is seriously wrong with our system of values when — mainly for reasons of national prestige — we spend billions of dollars to go to the moon while at the same time there is tremendous human suffering on earth which could be alleviated."

He said that cancer, mental illness, and malnutrition were among the sources of suffering that could "now be effectively attacked."

"The scientific and technical personnel liberated with the decrease in the arms program would be better employed on problems of disease and human nutrition than in the space race," he said.

Pauling, who won his first Nobel Prize in 1954 for his work in chemistry, said that the money being spent for the moon program could be used "to answer thousands of interesting and important questions about the human body for every one question answered about the moon."

### Fires Blacken Smaller Area

SALEM (UPI) — Only 6,798 acres of state and private lands were blackened by fire this year—one of the smallest forest fire losses in history—the State Forestry Department said today.

The 1962 toll was 8,407 acres. In 1961, 64,903 acres were burned, and the 1960 toll was 20,856 acres.

There were 491 man-caused fires this year, compared with 628 last year, and 430 lightning-caused blazes, compared with 127 a year ago.

While fire danger was potentially the most critical in the state's history because of blow-down from the Columbus Day, 1962, storm, the summer was unusually cool and damp, officials noted.

### Markets Study Planned

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The area Redevelopment Administration has approved an \$18,050 study of potential markets for hardwood lumber and wood products. Sens. Wayne Morse and Maurine Neuberger, D-Ore., said today.

The senators added the products might be produced in Oregon and Washington counties formerly concentrating upon softwood lumber.

Oregon counties included in

the study are Clatsop, Columbia, Lincoln and Yamhill.

The study will investigate factors such as location, price and quality requirements for wood products, transportation and distribution costs. In addition, business structures best suited for hardwood production will be studied.

The Oregon senators said the study, although involving a relatively small amount of money, could have meaningful consequences because hardwood species in Western Oregon have largely been ignored.

### BLUE WHALES
