Unheralded Spaniard Leading Favored Nicklaus In Tourney

PARIS (UPI)—Arnold Palmer, firing three birdies in a row, shot a three under par 33 on the front nine in the second round of the Canada Cup and International Trophy golf matches today for a 27-hole total of 102.

Jack Nicklaus, who had an opening round 67, started erratically today and shot a one over par 37 for a total of 104.

There was dense fog over the 6,834-yard St. Nom-la-Breche course. A crowd of about 1,000 followed the morning play and saw Nicklaus eagle the par five, 456-yard first hole for the second time.

But that was the only hole the burly Ohioan played well. He scrambled the rest of the front nine, carding three bogeys and five pars.

Palmer, who shot a first round 69, had six pars to go with his three birdies, which came on the sixth, seventh and eighth holes. He rolled in a 15-foot putt for 15 birdie on the sixth, a 25-foot on the seventh and a 12-foot on the eighth.

Blasius From Trap

Palmer saved his par on the par three ninth by blasting out of a sandtrap to within a foot and a half of the pin and sank the putt.

Nicklaus put his second shot on the green for the first hole and sank a 10-foot putt for his eagle. But he bogeyed the third when he trapped his drive and also bogeyed the fourth when his approach shot went over the green.

Although chipping poorly, Nicklaus managed to par the next four holes before he ran into another bogey on the ninth.

His drive was about 20 feet off the green and he chipped too strongly, going 20 feet past the cup and missing the putt.

Gary Player of South Africa, who had a first round 68, carded a two under par 34 on the front nine today, giving him a 27-hole total of 102. His playing partner, Retief Waltman, had a 33 for a total of 103. That meant the South Africans were leading the U.S. team by one stroke at the 27-hole mark in the battle for the Canada Cup.

French Finish Strong

Among the early second round finishers, Jean Gerainde of France was the leader with a total of 143. He shot an even par 72 today to go with his first round 71. His partner, Jean-Claude Harismendy, carded a 79 for a total of 154. That gave the French a team total of 297, the best of the early finishers, but it did not figure to stand up long.

The two Canadians, Al Balding and Stan Leonard, who had first rounds of 67 and 69

respectively, both went out in 37, one over par, on the front side today.

Sebastien Miguel, a 32-year-old Spaniard, fired a six-under-par 66 Thursday to take the first-round individual lead by one stroke over Nicklaus and three strokes over Palmer. The U.S. total of 136 earned it a first-place tie with Canada for the team lead.

However, there was nothing but complaints after Palmer and Nicklaus finished their round.

The complaints were not directed at the two famous Yanks but at the gallery of 5,000 which followed Nicklaus and Palmer. They were so slow getting off greens and fairways and so completely ignored the golfers playing both ahead and behind the two U.S. stars that the other competitors were forced to wait for long periods of time.

Those behind the U.S. pair took nearly 5 1/2 hours to play the St. Nom La Breche course, 12 miles outside Paris.

Player Blasts Crowd

"Either they have to get better players or do a better job of controlling the crowd," said Gary Player, who followed the American twosome.

"It's bloody impossible and pardon my French," said England's Bernard Hunt, who was playing ahead of the U.S. duo. But Nicklaus and Palmer, while they realized they were

holding up play because of the large gallery — the biggest in French golfing history — would have nothing to do with the complaint department.

"We're here to play golf and not criticize the course," said Nicklaus.

"No," added Palmer, "to criticize the organization."

Both had cause for complaint, however. Both were bothered by the constant clicking of cameras and the talking of the crowd.

Nicklaus three-putted the sixth green for a bogey after his attention was diverted by a camera sound. Palmer stepped out of a sand trap twice while the noise died down after he trapped his tee shot on the par-three ninth hole. He finally exploded out to within five feet of the cup, but then missed the putt. After he tapped the ball in, he stomped off the green, not even waiting for Nicklaus to putt out.

No Longer 'One Of Boys', Yogi Turns Boss Of Yankee Bombers

NEW YORK (UPI) — Yogi Berra's the new boss and whether they like it or not, New York Yankee players already are resigned to the fact he's no longer one of the boys.

Everyone from former teammate Joe DiMaggio on down seemed sure today the oft-comical 38-year-old Yogi will tolerate no monkey business and will crack down anytime there is any need to do so.

"He's not the clown that some have made him out to be," said DiMaggio, who played on the same club as Berra for six seasons.

"The men will play for him. They like him. He'll get the most out of them. He'll do a good job."

Yankee players always loved to kid Yogi. Two of them, Mickey Mantle and Whitey Ford, even sent him a wire moments after co-owner Dan Top-

ping named him the new manager Thursday.

Applied For Release

The wire read: "We are hereby applying for our unconditional release. We want to become professional golfers."

It was signed "Mickey and Whitey."

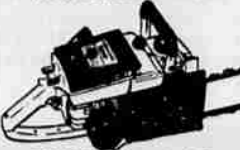

In balloting conducted before the series, the 27-year-old southpaw swept all votes by representatives of the Baseball Writers Assn.

Cy Young Award To Dodger Mound Ace

BOSTON (UPI) — Sandy Koufax, the Los Angeles Dodger's spectacular strikeout artist, today was being touted as a good bet to couple the National League's Most Valuable Player award with the Cy Young Award.

This "double" has been accomplished only once. In 1956, the year the Cy Young Award was introduced, Don Newcombe, then pitching for the old Brooklyn Dodgers, walked off with both honors.

Koufax was named Thursday night as the 1963 winner of the young award as the outstanding major league pitcher of the year. The 27-year-old southpaw became the first unanimous choice, polling all 20 votes by representatives of the Baseball Writers Association of America (BWAA).

In 1957, Warren Spahn of the Milwaukee Braves came within one vote of a sweep. The lone dissenting vote that year went to Jim Bunning of the Detroit Tigers.

The National League's Most Valuable Player for 1963 will be announced sometime next month. Koufax, queried about his chances of completing the "double," said, "I don't think the MVP will go to a pitcher."

Sandy, though, is keeping his fingers crossed. He has already assured himself a good pay hike for next season and as a double award winner he will have additional ammunition when he negotiates his 1964 contract.
