

First Family Moves Into New Home

WASHINGTON (UPI)—President Kennedy and his family are finally moving into their new country home on Rattlesnake Mountain, near Atoka, Va.

This weekend will be the first the Kennedy family has spent in the single story, yellow stucco "cottage" deep in the heart of the Virginia hunt coun-

try, four miles west of Middleburg. The seven-bedroom rambler-style house, completed last June, is in a picturesque setting overlooking the Blue Ridge Mountains.

Mrs. Kennedy and the children, Caroline, almost 6, and John Jr., 2, planned to go to Atoka this afternoon. The President will join them Saturday

afternoon after participating in dedication ceremonies for the new Robert Frost Memorial Library at Amherst College, Amherst, Mass.

Mrs. Kennedy sent a housekeeper to Atoka earlier this week to get the house ready for the First Family.

Had Rented "Glen Ora"
The Kennedys decided to build a home after nearly two years of renting "Glen Ora," an estate near Middleburg. They chose as a site the village at Atoka, which boasts only a country store and a gasoline service station.

For the past two and one-half months the Kennedys have rented the home to two different families. Washington investment broker A. Dana Hogdon and his wife leased it during July and August. In September it was rented to Mr. and Mrs. Ogden Armour, a wealthy Cal-

ifornia couple who came East to get their daughter settled at exclusive Foxcroft school at Middleburg.

The Kennedy home sits on a 39-acre tract, once part of the huge landholdings of Hubert Phipps, a multi-millionaire cattle-raiser and newspaper publisher. The White House originally estimated the cost of construction of the home at about \$45,000 but area builders believe the final total was much higher. A special road was cut through the woods to the house from U.S. Route 50, and an artificial pond was also built.

Three-Store Stable
There is also a three-store stable for Mrs. Kennedy's horse "Sardir," Caroline's pony "Macaroni," and John John's newly acquired "Leprechaun," a shaggy little pony, the gift of Irish Prime Minister Sean F. Lemass.

The complex White House communications system, which travels with the President wherever he goes, has been set up in the house, not far from the cozy living room with its huge fireplace and the library.

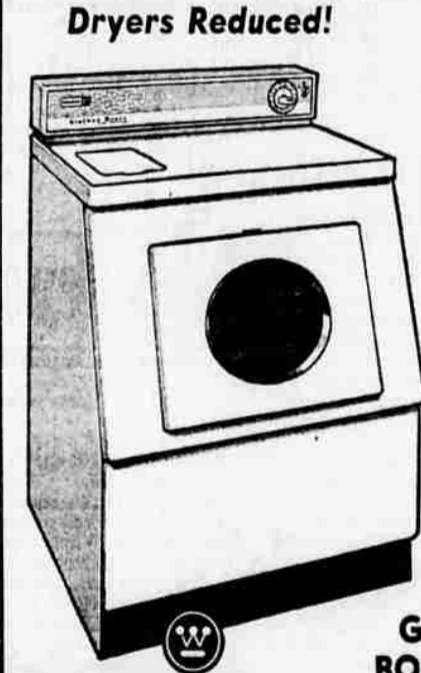

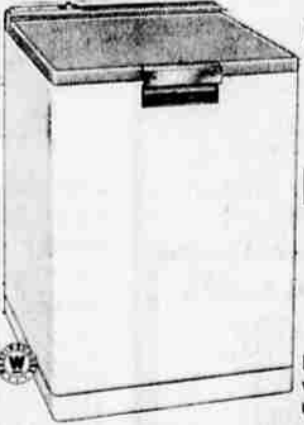

Mardi Gras To Help UF

The west hangar at Kingsley Field will take on a carnival atmosphere Friday evening, Nov. 1, when the second annual Mardi Gras will be held to benefit the United Fund.

A costume affair, the Mardi Gras climaxes the United Fund contribution activities held this year at Kingsley Field, with more than two dozen booths offering a variety of games, entertainment and refreshments.

As with last year's Mardi Gras, the most popular activity will probably be the dunking booth, where airmen may buy a chance to dunk their officers in a giant tub of cold water.

"The Ambassadors," a 16-piece Air Force band from McChord AFB, Wash., will furnish dancing music for the evening, as well as music for a "twist" elimination contest for teenagers and adults.

A panel of influential citizens of the community has been invited to act as judges to select a Mardi Gras queen from six candidates.

Stock Exchange Chief To Testify On Tax Bill

WASHINGTON (UPI) — G. Keith Funston, head of the New York Stock Exchange, was among the witnesses scheduled for the ninth day of the Senate Finance Committee's public hearing on President Kennedy's \$11 billion tax cut bill.

Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis., loosed another broadside at the measure today. He said the bill, passed by the House Sept. 23 and stalled in the committee ever since, contained few reforms and included "at least four new loopholes which previously did not exist. This is pathetic record of tax reform."

Tax Measure Being Drafted

PORTLAND (UPI) — A Portland attorney Thursday announced formation of a statewide organization to draft a sales tax measure and place it on the November, 1964, general election ballot.

He said it was planned to have petitions ready for circulation early next year.

American Farm Bureau Federation clashed Thursday in testimony on the measure.

Andrew J. Biemiller, legislative expert for the AFL-CIO, urged approval of the tax cut to release funds to "help create badly needed jobs." Farm Bureau President Charles B. Shuman sharply criticized the bill as a "siren song which seems to say, 'we can spend without taxing; we can solve without effort.'"

Senate Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen, Ill., said Thursday he had "real doubts" the bill would pass the present session of Congress.

Other congressional news: Civil Rights: House Democrats and Republicans backing a tough civil rights bill stood firm today in the face of in-

creased pressure from President Kennedy and congressional leaders. The President seeks a compromise that could break up a militant coalition supporting the measure, which is far broader in scope than the bill he submitted June 19. The administration believes the strong bill cannot get through Congress.

Stockpiles: A three-member "draft" and three statements of dissent will be printed by the Senate Armed Services Committee on the controversial stockpiling report. The much-

publicized inquiry, begun at President Kennedy's behest, developed no major conclusion. It left in partisan dispute the stockpiling roles of former Treasury Secretary George M. Humphrey and other Eisenhower administration officials. Three of the four Democrats on the stockpile subcommittee endorsed the "draft," but the other Democrat and the two Republican members dissented.
