The New York Giants found

a way of living with Jimmy Brown and the Green Bay Packers found a way of winning without Bart Starr. And suddenly the National Football League races are tighter than a pair of \$5 shoes.

The Giants brought Jimmy and the Browns crashing to the earth — in more ways than one — with a 33-6 beating Sunday, while the Starr-less Packers had to score two touchdowns in the final period for a 34-20 triumph over the Baltimore Colts. It was Cleveland's first defeat in seven games.

This was one of the most miserable afternoons Jimmy Brown has spent in seven NFL seasons. He fumbled on the third play of the game to set up New York's first score; gained only 40 rushing yards in nine carries; and wound up being ejected for the first time in his career after a pummeling and wrestling match with linebacker Tom Scott of the Giants during the final minute.

Scott also was ejected.

Tied For Lead

By winning, the Packers managed to remain tied for the Western Division lead with the Chicago Bears, who defeated the Philadelphia Eagles, 16-7. Both Green Bay and Chicago have 6-1 records.

The Giants' surprise win narrowed Cleveland's Eastern Division lead to one game and also permitted the St. Louis Cardinals to get back into close contention with a 21-7 victory over the Washington Redskins. Cleveland has a 6-1 record; New York and St. Louis are 5-2.

In Sunday's other games, the Pittsburgh Steelers won 27-20 over the Dallas Cowboys; the Detroit Lions beat the Minnesota Vikings, 20-10, and the Los Angeles Rams made it two-in-a-row by edging the San Francisco Forty Niners, 28-21.

Y.A. Tittle completed 21 of 31 passes for 214 yards and two touchdowns, and Don Chandler kicked four field goals as the Giants forged their stunning upset before 84,213 fans at Cleveland.

where Southern California knocked off California, 36-6, without much strain. Willie Brown set up the first two Trojan touchdowns with punt returns of 43 and 36 yards and USC held a 28-0 advantage at the half.

In other games, Washington defeated tricky Oregon, 26-19, Syracuse battered Oregon State 31-8, Army blanked Washington State, 23-0, Idaho nailed San Jose State 28-12, Utah State swept by the University of the Pacific 40-14 and Fresno State downed Los Angeles State 35-20.

Junior Coffey, officially "sidelined for the season," with a broken foot last month, made his first start of the year Saturday for Washington and was the key man in the Huskies' win over Oregon. He not only packed the ball 112 yards in 39 carries but smashed over for his second touchdown from four yards out during the final minutes of play to win it. Mel Renfro, Oregon's great halfback, was hurt midway through the third period and sat it out for the rest of the way.

Syracuse gave up a quick touchdown to Oregon State and then ground up the Beavers, 31-8, while intercepting three of Gordon Queen's passes. Charlie Shaw had gone 80 yards for a Beaver touchdown then Oregon State set up two Syracuse scores with fumbles.

The Army's Ken Waldrop scored a pair of touchdowns against Washington State while the Cadets moved away to a 17-0 halftime lead. It was the fourth loss in six games for the Cougars who were wrecked by disastrous fumbles on the part of Clarence Williams and John

Browne. The Kay-dets killed Washington State on the ground, outrushing the Cougars 353 yards to minus three.

Rich Naccarto scored twice for Idaho's Vandals, who used a blocked punt, two fumbles and penalties to down San Jose State. Ken Berry connected on a pair of scoring passes for the Spartans but Bill Scott's six-yard touchdown plunge following his 55-yard run iced things for Idaho.

Bean Carter's passing and handoffs sparked Fresno State's 35-20 win over Los Angeles State.

UCLA was beaten on Friday night by highly-favored Illinois, which had to come from behind for an 18-12 win in the fourth period.

U.S. Team Captures Canada Cup Contest

PARIS (UPI) — Jack Nicklaus won the individual championship and the United States took the team title today in the Canada Cup and International Trophy golf matches, but unless everyone finished the tournament the victories would not stand up.

Playing only nine holes instead of the scheduled 18 because of a heavy fog which shrouded the course, Nicklaus shot a four-under-par 32 which gave him the individual crown with a total of 237. It was five strokes better than runners up Gary Player of South Africa and Sebastian Migue of Spain.

In the team race the U. S. team of Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer finished with a total of 482 against 405 for runnerup Spain.

with the U.S. triumphs. Under the rules which shortened the tournament from the scheduled 72 holes to only 63, it was stipulated that all teams must finish or the scores would revert to the 34-hole total.

Some of the teams teed off shortly before Nicklaus and Palmer finished, and there was some question whether all would be able to complete play because the fog was getting denser.

If this happened scores would revert to the 34-hole total and there would be a sudden death playoff involving Nicklaus and Player for the individual title and the United States and Spanish teams for the team championship as they were tied going into today's play.

Because of the commitments of most of the participating golfers, the tournament must be concluded today, Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer are scheduled to leave tonight along with a dozen other golfers, for Australia to compete in the Australian Open starting Thursday. Many of the others, including Canadians Al Balding and Stan Leonard, leave tonight for Barcelona to play in the Spanish Open, also starting Thursday. Still others are going to a tournament in Brazil.

Shoeless Kicker Rescues Unbeaten Texas Ranking

It's the arm of a quarterback and the legs of a running back that draw most of the attention in football circles, but deep in the heart of Texas they pay special reverence to the toe of a bench-warmer.

Tony Crosby is a unique type of hero. He doesn't run, pass or play defense, and he's never on the field for more than two minutes in any one game. All he does is kick, and he doesn't even do that the right way.

Right or wrong, Crosby's unorthodox kicking, accomplished without the aid of a shoe on his foot, is one of the big reasons Texas today stands as one of only four major colleges with unblemished records. The other perfect-record teams are Auburn, Princeton and Bowling Green.

The Longhorns, ranked No. 1 in the country, made it six in a row Saturday night when they nipped Rice, 10-6. Crosby was responsible for four points with his 18th straight point-after-conversion and a 22-yard field goal. It was the second week in a row that Crosby's bare toe has provided the winning margin for Texas.

Auburn, idle last weekend, has a 6-0 mark as does Bowling Green, which beat Kent State, 18-3. Princeton trounced Cornell, 51-14, to record its fifth straight triumph.

Several other members of the top 10 didn't fare as well Saturday, second-ranked Wisconsin losing to Ohio State, 13-10, third-ranked Pittsburgh dropping a 24-12 decision to Navy, and ninth-ranked Northwestern falling before Michigan State, 15-7. In addition, the nation's longest winning streak was halted at 15 when Dartmouth was a 17-13 upset victim to Harvard. The biggest form reversal of the weekend, however, came when Stanford rebounded from four straight setbacks to defeat Notre Dame, 24-14.

Tide Rolls On

Fifth-ranked Alabama beat winless Houston, 21-13; sixth-ranked Mississippi romped to a 27-7 triumph over Vanderbilt; seventh-ranked Oklahoma remained unbeaten in Big Eight play by trouncing Kansas State, 34-9; and 10th-ranked Southern California beat California 36-6.

In other top games last Saturday, Baylor stayed up with Texas by trouncing Texas A&M 34-7, Washington Tech edged Oregon, 26-19; Georgia Tech downed Tulane, 17-3; LSU beat Florida, 14-0; and Missouri stopped Iowa State, 6-0.

Injuries Cripple Oregon

EUGENE (UPI) — Battered Oregon began getting ready for its football game with San Jose State here next Saturday — minus Al — American halfback Mel Renfro, quarterback Bob Berry and tackle Milt Kanehe.

The three starting players were injured as the Ducks dropped a 26-19 decision in Washington before 35,000 in Portland Saturday.

Kanehe, a 6-3, 250-pound senior, suffered a fractured right ankle and probably will not be able to play in any of Oregon's four regular season games.

Renfro and Berry were listed as "doubtful" for the Ducks' next contest. Renfro received bad bruises on his right side and Berry suffered strained ligaments in his right knee. They were scheduled to undergo further examinations today.

Fullback Junior Coffey, starting his first game of the season, sparked the Huskies' win over the Ducks. He ran for 110 yards in 39 carries including touchdowns of 1 and 4 yards.

The 205-pound junior missed his team's first four games with a broken foot bone and carried the ball only four times in its fifth contest.

Coffey's 4-yard scoring run came with 3:44 remaining in the game and broke a 19-10 tie. Oregon Coach Len Casanova blamed defensive mistakes for the loss.

Portland State was only one victory away from its first Oregon Collegiate Conference football championship today.

Quarterback Mike Schrank passed to end Jim Hollingsworth for three touchdowns as the Vikings defeated defending champion Southern Oregon 19-14 at Portland Saturday.

The decision left Portland State with a 3-0 record and the Red Raiders with a 3-1 mark in the conference. The loss was the first in the conference for the Ashland school since 1960.

Oregon Tech edged Oregon College of Education 20-19 at Klamath Falls in the other OCC game. Eastern Oregon was walloped by Weber 48-7 at Ogden, Utah, in a non-conference contest.

Portland State is favored to wrap up the league championship against Oregon College of Education at Monmouth and Oregon Tech meets Eastern Oregon at La Grande in conference action next Saturday. Southern Oregon plays host to Chico State at Ashland in non-conference play.
