

## State Vacates 96 Positions

SALEM (UPI) — The State Tax Commission eliminated 96 positions as part of its \$366,457 budget reduction, it was announced Saturday.

Forty-eight employees were laid off, and 48 vacant positions were eliminated. Those laid off included all employees over 65. Most of those let go were clerical workers, and only a few auditors and collectors received notices.

The two-week notices went out to employees Thursday, and become effective Nov. 8.

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## Fischers Will Move

ABERDEEN, S.C. (UPI) — Next Friday is moving day for the Andrew Fischer family of Klamath Falls.

Chamber of Commerce Manager E. C. Pieplow said Friday night a large, rambling home on the northeast part of the city is to serve as the temporary residence for the Fischers, the quintuplets and the couple's five other children until the city builds them a new \$100,000 home.

Pieplow said the Fischers had not selected the site for the new home, but "probably things will start moving on that as soon as they're settled in their temporary home."

The quintuplets remain in St. Luke's Hospital and were not expected to leave before the family moves to its temporary residence.

## Mental Health Center Being Studied

HAPPY CAMP—Mrs. J. Everett Barr, Yreka, and Mrs. Jesse Hamilton, Dunsmuir, were named at the 25th district meeting, California Congress of Parents and Teachers, in Happy Camp on Wednesday to explore the possibilities of a mental health center in Redding to serve the state's four northern counties.

Results of a meeting in Redding with county officials and other interested persons will be reported at the next 25th district meeting in Weed on the evening of Nov. 29.

Mrs. E. E. Hyde, San Jose, CPTT publicity instruction chairman, was the guest speaker at the all-day session. She discussed fundamentals of publicizing PTA through press, radio, and television media and stressed the role of individual members improving the PTA public image by being well informed on national, state, and local PTA policies and accomplishments.

Eddie Roberts, president of the College of the Siskiyous, explained the problems of COS in meeting the demand for adult education courses. He promised more courses would be offered this winter as soon as attendance centers are found within the financial range of the adult program funds.

Last year 83 courses were taught involving 3,600 enrollees at a cost of \$30,175.45 for instruction, transportation, and a classroom space. Registration

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## Reprisals Charged

NEW YORK (UPI) — The New-York committee charged Saturday that the Yugoslav government has begun reprisals, including arrests, against families of emigres who picketed President Tito here earlier this week.

George Vujnovich, chairman of the committee, said the committee's attorney, J. Dudley Devine, will ask the state department to protest to the Yugoslav government concerning treatment of the demonstrators' relatives. Vujnovich said the committee has documentary evidence to back its charges.

Vujnovich and another committee member, Dusan Petkovic reported that emigres who picketed Tito on his first visit here in October, 1960, had received warning letters beginning late last month from relatives in Yugoslavia. They quoted the letters as saying "please do not do as you did in October or we will be harassed and tortured" and "please do not demonstrate or we will lose our jobs and be deported to the interior."

"Yes, the letter actually used the word torture," Vujnovich said.

"One 78-year-old woman wrote her son 'I have the October cold I had in 1960 and the doctor has been to see me three times.' We interpret this as meaning that the police had been to see her three times. Others wrote 'you are nice to have a guest, so behave nicely or you know who will pay the bill.'"

## Motorists Set New Mark For Deaths On Highways

CHICAGO (UPI) — The nation's motorists set a new record for death on the highway during the first nine months of the year, the National Safety Council said today.

During the first three quarters of the year, 31,170 highway deaths were recorded — 6 per cent more than the previous nine-month high of 29,549 in 1962.

September saw more highway travelers killed than any other September — 3,970. This toll was 9 per cent higher than the 3,640 who died in September, 1962, and 6 per cent more than the month's record-setting total of 3,746 in 1941.

While the number of deaths increased 6 per cent, the amount of travel rose 4 per cent in the three quarters. The resulting
