STOCKTON, Calif. (UPI)—Coach John Rohde said today Mike Hair has taken over first string fullback chores for the University of the Pacific.

Hair replaces John Billeci who has a swollen eye. Billeci will be out for at least a week, Rohde said.

STANFORD, Calif. (UPI)—Stanford halfback Dick Ragsdale, bitten by the flu bug, watched from the sidelines Wednesday as his teammates prepared to meet Oregon State this Saturday at Corvallis, Ore. Ray Handley ran at Ragsdale's slot while the Indians practiced goal line plays from five yards out.

BERKELEY, Calif. (UPI)—California coach Marv Levy reported today that tackle Roger Foster is a "very doubtful" starter against UCLA Saturday. Levy said junior tackle Tom Brown will fill in for Foster at the Los Angeles contest.

SAN JOSE, Calif. (UPI)—Injuries continued to plague the San Jose State Spartans today after placekicker Rich Patley pulled a leg muscle and was ruled out of Saturday's game with Oregon.

The Spartans are also in trouble at the fullback spot with Charley Harraway out with a shoulder separation and Herb Engel and Jerry Bonetto doubtful because of a knee injury and swollen neck glands respectively.

PULLMAN, Wash. (UPI)—Halfbacks Clarence Williams and Dale Ford drew the praise of Washington State coach Jim Sutherland today.

Sutherland said the two showed fine running Wednesday in the Cougars' scrimmage in preparation for Saturday's game with Idaho here.

SEATTLE (UPI)—No major personnel changes are planned for this Saturday's contest here against Southern California, University of Washington coach Jim Owens said today.

Owens ran his charges through an intensive drill Wednesday night that lasted into the evening hours.

EUGENE, Ore. (UPI)—Oregon today halfback Mel Renfro is a doubtful starter for Saturday's meeting with San Jose State.

Renfro suffered a cracked rib last weekend against Washington. He sat out Wednesday's practice.

CORVALLIS, Ore. (UPI)—Oregon State coach Tommy Prothro gave his Beavers the day off Wednesday.

Prothro said he felt the team needed a rest before playing Stanford, fresh off an upset of Notre Dame, here Saturday.

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—UCLA coach Bill Barnes announced Wednesday that he will use the same backfield for Saturday night's football game against California that he put against Illinois last week.

Larry Zeno at quarterback will be flanked by halfbacks Byron Nelson and Bill Hauck and fullback Jim Colletto, Barnes said.

Wednesday's drill featured running and pass defense plays.

LOS ANGELES (UPI)—Coach John McKay stressed the ground game on both offense and defense Wednesday in putting his University of Southern California Trojans through a lengthy drill for Troy's game with Washington this weekend.

Guard Bill Fisk and end John Tomas drew special praise on defense and halfbacks Mike Garrett and Willie Brown on offense.

Among the professional entries are defending champion E. J. (Dutch) Harrison and former winners Fred Wood, Willie Goggin and Chuck Congden.

Kansas City Drops Tie With Portland
PORTLAND, Ore. (UPI)—The Kansas City Athletics Wednesday night notified the Portland baseball club they were terminating their working agreement with the Pacific Coast League team.

The action left the status of baseball in Portland in doubt. The final decision is expected to come at the minor leagues meeting in San Diego Dec. 1-3, when Portland learns whether it can get another working agreement.

"Frankly, I'm not very optimistic," said club president Arch Kingsley.

Kingsley said the major problem is finding a place to play. Multnomah Stadium is up for sale, but so far there have been no buyers.

The Kansas City action was not unexpected. There were indications during the season that the Athletics were not happy with the dimensions of the park or the weather in Portland.

The Beavers had worked with Kansas City for the past two years and in 1959. They had an agreement with the St. Louis Cardinals in 1960 and 1961.

Willamette Back Cited
PORTLAND (UPI)—Willamette's Elgin Baylor is being cited as a backfield player who was a member of the Northwest Conference back and lineman of the week Thursday.

Maze gained 141 yards in 25 carries Saturday as Willamette scored its first victory of the season: a 7-0 decision over Pacific. Gunther, who weighs only 147 pounds, was a standout in a losing 21-0 effort at Linfield.

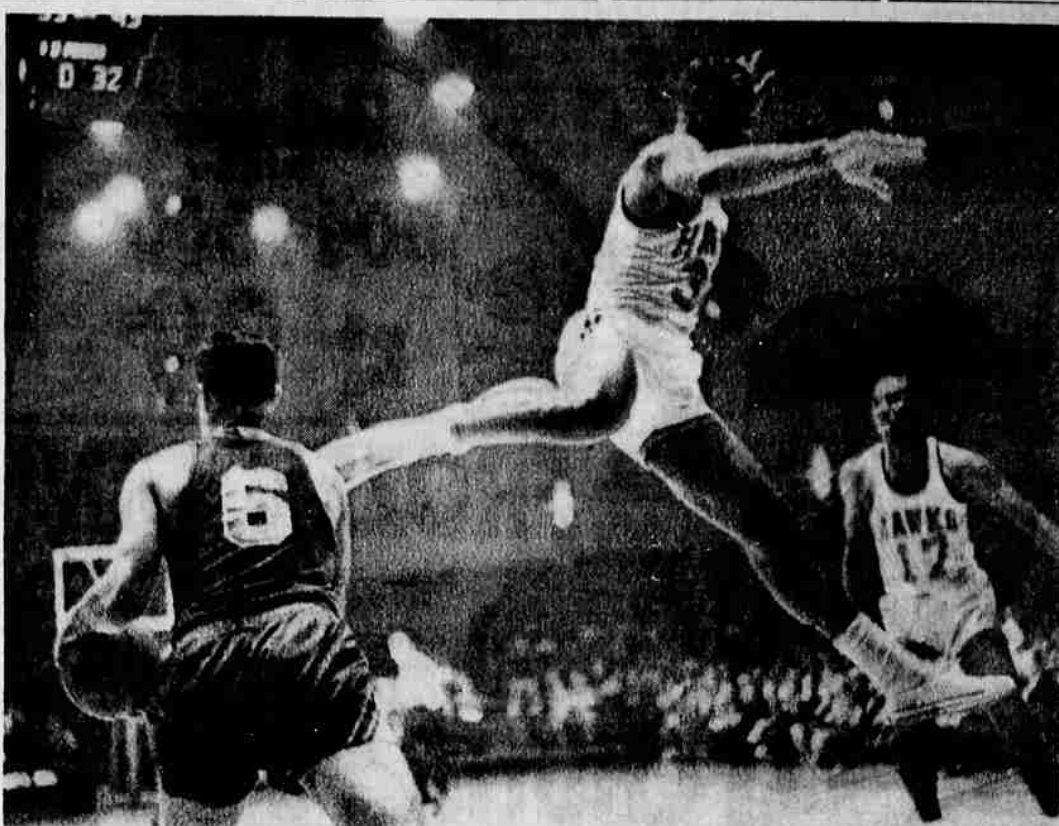

home opener before 14,533 fans at the Sports Arena—the largest opening game crowd for the Lakers since the franchise moved to Los Angeles.

In other games Wednesday night, the NBA champion Boston Celtics remained undefeated by downing the Detroit Pistons for the 10th straight time 108-102; the St. Louis Hawks came from behind for the second straight night to defeat the New York Knickerbockers 121-104; and Hal Greer scored 39 points to pace the Philadelphia 76ers past the Baltimore Bullets 111-108.

No games were scheduled for tonight.

Boston remained the only unbeaten team (4-0) by profiting on a balanced scoring attack, albeit without the services this season of former NBA-great Bob Cousy. John Havlicek of the Celtics sat out the first half in the game against the Pistons, but wound up the game's scoring leader with 22 points.

Billie McGill, playing his first game for St. Louis, scored 15 points, 11 of them coming in a 15-minute flurry in the second half.

Gene Sluge, involved in the McGill deal, netted seven points in his first game for Baltimore, one of his shots cutting the Philadelphia lead to 108-106 before the 76ers went on to win.
