SALEM (UPI)—License fees have gone up for most Oregon house trailer owners due to a change in the fee schedule which took effect Oct. 2.

The change will mean more money for Oregon counties which receive all house trailer fees collected by the Department of Motor Vehicles except for the \$6 registration fee.

Fees increased from 5 to 50 per cent, depending on age, when the depreciation rate of a house trailer's market value was decreased by the 1963 legislation.
