Driver Hurt In Accident

One motorist was slightly injured in one of two one-vehicle accidents that occurred in Klamath County yesterday and early this morning, Oregon State Police disclosed today.

The injured was Richard Earl Munshaw, 16, of Ashland, who received a head laceration when the automobile he was driving went out of control on a curve west of Keno about 9 a.m., Sunday, and struck a guard rail near the Klamath River Bridge. The impact of the collision spun Munshaw's car in a circle and it stopped facing the direction it had been traveling. He was cited for violation of the basic rule.

Similarly cited was Mrs. Patricia Putnam, 42, of 4765 Onyx Place, who lost control of her car about 7:30 a.m. today when she attempted to avoid a collision with milk truck near the junction of Hope Street and Harlan Drive.

Mrs. Putnam, southbound on Hope Street, applied her brakes when the truck proceeded across Harlan Drive. Her car went into a broadside, nicked a fender of the truck, and skidded into a ditch against a power pole.

Mrs. Putnam was not injured but damage was extensive to the driver's side of her automobile. The operator of the truck was Wayne Carothers, 56, of 2150 White Avenue.

Space Couple Married; More Trips Predicted

MOSCOW (UPI)—The world's first space newly-weds were launched on a brief Russian honeymoon today before embarking on a possible joint spectacular in the cosmos.

Cosmonette Valentina Tereshkova, a lovely bride in white with a near-blonde hair-do, disappeared from a boisterous reception Sunday night hand-in-hand with spaceman Andrian Nikolayev.

Twenty-one toasts rang in their ears, most of them hoisted by Premier Nikita Khrushchev who said he was acting as "father of the bride." Valentina's father was killed in World War II.

Air Force Chief Marshal Kon-

stantin Vershini, in raising his glass, hinted that the bride and groom might go in orbit together one of these days.

"I wish you further great successes in the air and the cosmos," he said.

Valentina, in her 48-orbit space flight last June, almost linked up with cosmonaut Valery Bykovsky who was whirling around the world in a second spaceship at more than 17,500 miles per hour.

Nikolayev flew alone in August of last year on a 64-orbit mission that kept him aloft in for more than 94 hours.

The 300 selected guests also included the top secret hierarchy of the Soviet space program.

International Affair Starts

KOBE, Japan (UPI)—Mayors and chamber of commerce officials from states on the West Coast of the United States were gathering here today for the start of an international conference.

Mississippi, Kentucky Elections May Give Clues To Future

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Voters elect governors in Mississippi and Kentucky and a mayor in Philadelphia Tuesday in off-year balloting that may reflect the political impact of the civil rights issue.

Political strategists were watching these contests with particular interest because Negro demands and white reaction to them have been of major concern in all three races.

Hundreds of other elections for state, county and city offices will be held across the nation, but state and local issues appeared predominant in most of them.

Major cities holding municipal

elections include Cleveland, Columbus, Youngstown, Akron, Canton, Toledo and Dayton, Ohio; Boston; San Francisco and San Diego, Calif.; Rochester and Niagara Falls, N.Y.; Indianapolis, Ind., and Tucson, Ariz.

Congressional Election

One congressional seat also is at stake Tuesday. Pennsylvania's 23rd District is holding a special election to fill the term of the late Rep. Leon M. Gavin, a Republican. Albert W. Johnson, the GOP candidate, is heavily favored over Democrat William T. Hagerty.

The Philadelphia mayoralty race took on special significance

because President Kennedy visited the city last week and closely aligned himself with the Democratic battle to retain control of the city hall.

Democratic Mayor James H. J. Tate is running for another term against Republican James J. McDermott. Tate has accused McDermott of making a "play" for the white vote. McDermott has accused Tate of faltering action that prompted racial unrest.

The election is being watched for the reaction of both Negro voters and those white residents who may feel that the Negro has been pressing his demands too fast.

Tate is favored to win but by a smaller margin than Democrats have compiled in recent years.

Kentucky Situation Similar

A similar situation prevails in Kentucky, where Republican Louie B. Nunn opposes Democrat Edward T. Breathitt Jr., for governor. Breathitt is backed by retiring Gov. Bert Combs.

At issue in Kentucky is an executive order issued by Combs this year which forbids racial discrimination in all business establishments licensed by the state.

Kentucky Republicans have said they have a chance to win

the election, although they are outnumbered 3 to 1 in voter registration.

In Mississippi, Republicans and Democrats have vied with each other in denouncing the Kennedy administration's civil rights stand. Lt. Gov. Paul B. Johnson is the Democratic gu-

bernatorial candidate opposing Rubel Phillips, a Democrat-turned-Republican who now favors Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., for president.
