

Boys Held In Thefts

Three teenage boys were picked up here Friday evening as runaways from Oakridge, and later were discovered to be responsible for two thefts.

Police received a call Friday that the boys were seen near Klamath and Broad streets carrying two rifles and a policeman caught them after a short chase. He found the rifles where the boys had hidden them.

Hospital Staff Hosts Delayed Wedding Vows

ALTURAS—The Modoc Medical Center staff in Alturas hosted the wedding of Harold Richard Drew, Tulelake, and Mary Jane Bohlman, Tulelake, on Oct. 31. Drew and his bride-to-be were en route to Reno to be married the evening of Oct. 19 when their car went out of control and rolled over in Howard Gulch, 25 miles north of Alturas.

Since that time Drew has remained in critical condition at the Modoc Medical Center with a badly fractured neck. Although he needs specialized surgery, his condition has been too critical for him to be flown out of Alturas to the University of California Hospital.

He remains completely immobilized with a neck traction held in place by an apparatus resembling a giant set of ice tongs set into his head to hold the neck in place and prevent

further serious injury. He lies on a hard surfaced tilt bed that allows him to be turned without changing his position.

The new Mrs. Drew was also hospitalized for the accident for a week with extensive bruises and abrasions. Drew will be flown from Alturas early Saturday morning to the UC Hospital for immediate surgery, and the couple decided to be married before he left the Modoc Medical Center.

The staff of the hospital went together to make the occasion as festive as possible and bought a corsage for the bride as well as the wedding cake. Drew's doctor, Dr. Lloyd Shannon, stood as best man while Rev. Leslie Chism of Alturas read the services. In addition to the hospital staff as guests at the wedding, Drew's mother, Mrs. D. R. Drew of Myrtle Creek, Ore., witnessed the service.

Allied Chief Warns Reds Still A Threat

PARIS (UPI) — Allied Supreme commander Gen. Lyman L. Lemnitzer said Monday the Communist threat to the West remains as great as before the Moscow nuclear test ban agreement.

But he added that the Communists cannot have failed to note the implication of stepped-up Western military capabilities resulting from the airlifting of a complete U.S. armored division through Exercise Big Lift. Lemnitzer addressed the opening session of the annual conference of parliament members from 15 North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) nations.

"It is extremely important," he said, "to recognize that it (the test ban agreement) in no way reduced the existing magnitude or capability of the forces which make up the military threat to NATO. In other words, the military threat to NATO remained at least at the very substantial level prevailing before the treaty went into effect."

Solon Warns Of Rights Revolution

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Rep. Richard Bolling, D-Mo., fears that congressional failure to enact an effective civil rights bill might lead to race riots and "actually wreck the United States."

The House Judiciary Committee approved a civil rights bill last week. It is aimed at ending racial discrimination in voting, education, employment and unions and in private accommodations such as hotels, restaurants and amusement places.

Rep. Jacob K. Javits, R-N.Y., said Sunday there was "every indication" the administration had abandoned hope of getting a civil rights bill through the

Senate this year. Bolling said he believed the House bill's supporters eventually could get enough votes to get the measure cleared for floor action by the House Rules Committee, of which he is a member. Committee Chairman Howard W. Smith, D-Va., opposes civil rights legislation. However, Bolling declined to predict in a local television interview when he thought the bill would be cleared. He also conceded there might be some changes in the measure.

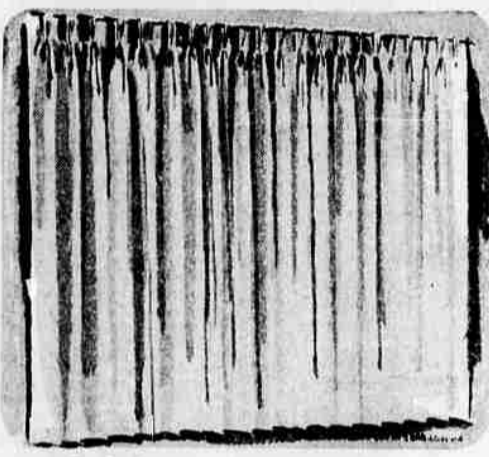
"The failure to pass an effective civil rights act might actually wreck the United States," Bolling said. "If there is not an effective civil rights

act, then the Negro and the other civil rights people in this country would feel that their government had let them down. "They would almost inevitably rely on civil disobedience. Almost inevitably, also, as they did this, irresponsible elements, not the responsible elements in the civil rights movement, would move in. "Then there would be riots and there would be bloodshed.

and if this were to happen, I fear that the white majority of the country would harden against the Negro and it might be a very long time before we could get effective legislation. "The result of this would be to really destroy the American society internally and make it absolutely impossible for the United States to fulfill its role as the leader of the free world."

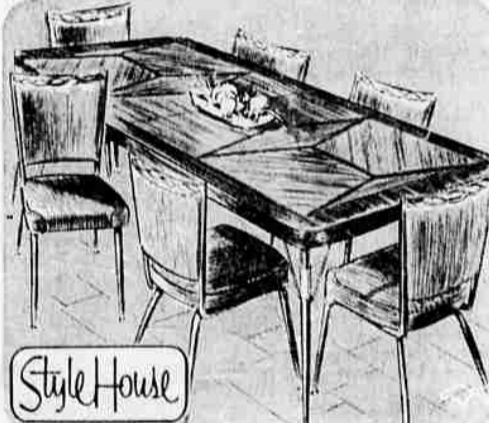

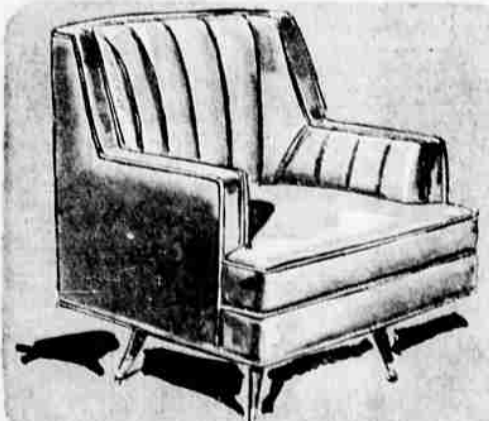

'Chicago' Explained

There is nothing new to learn in order to play "Chicago" or four-deal bridge. A game consists of four deals. On the first, neither side is vulnerable. On the second and third deals the dealer's side is vulnerable but the opponents are not. Both sides are vulnerable on the last deal. Thus, vulnerability is determined by the deal, not by who has won a game or games. When you score a game you get a 300-point bonus if you are not vulnerable and a 500-point bonus if vulnerable. If you make four games you get four game bonuses. Slam bonuses are the same as in rubber bridge. If you make four slams you get four slam bonuses.

There is no bonus for a part score made on the first three hands unless it adds to a previous part score and gives you a game. If you happen to make a part score on the fourth hand you get a 100-point bonus to make up for the fact that the game is over and you get no chance to use that part score towards a later game.

Both North and South overbid today's hand and had West led any suit but clubs South would have been set. As it was, dummy's eight of clubs held the first trick. South went right after trumps and wound up losing one trump and one trick each in hearts and diamonds.

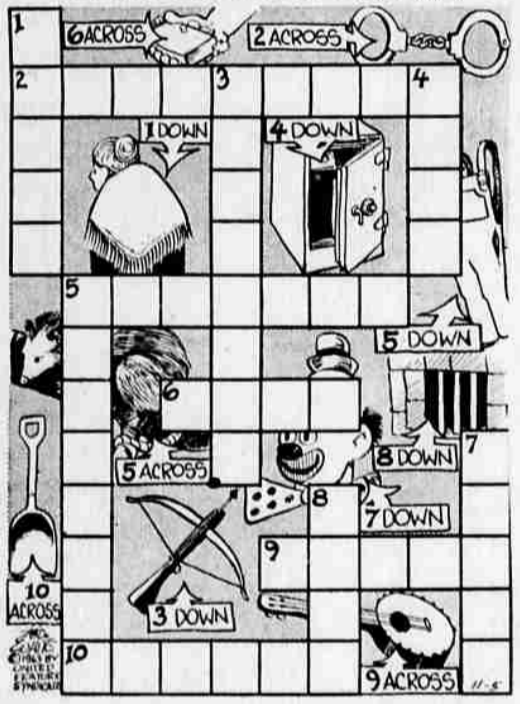
