

Klamath Falls Public School Enrollment Tops 4,500

More than 4,500 students are attending public schools in Klamath Falls, it was reported Monday night.

Superintendent of Schools Ray Hunsaker reported to a joint meeting of the elementary and Klamath Union school boards that as of that day, enrollment in elementary schools stood at 2,471 and at the end of October, Klamath Union had 2,125 students.

The junior class at KU is the largest with 586 students, followed by 569 sophomores, 532 freshmen and 447 seniors.

Mills is the largest elementary school with 479 students, followed by Roosevelt with 394. Other elementary schools and their enrollments are:

Fairview, 362; Fremont, 296; Pelican, 249; Joseph Conger, 236; Riverside, 228; Lucile O'Neill, 177; and Ponderosa, 50.

New Spud Regulations

Amendments to the regulations to qualify for the potato diversion program recommended by the Oregon - California Potato Committee to the Secretary of Agriculture, USDA, have been approved, according to word received by Merrill R. Webb, Redmond, manager.

They will become effective Friday, Nov. 8. From this date through June 30, 1964, all potatoes shipped for fresh use in Districts 1, 2 and 4 (Central Oregon and the Klamath Basin) shall be at least the following quality: Round Varieties: U.S. No. 1, two inches minimum diameter; Long Varieties: U.S. No. 1, two inches minimum diameter or four ounces minimum weight; U.S. No. 2, six ounces minimum weight.

Every effort is being made, the official stated, to have the diversion program effective on the same date as the regulation changes.

Civil Defense Sirens Found Hard To Hear In Downtown Area

The testing of the Klamath Falls' civil defense alarm system Monday was a complete success, except in the one section where it's needed most—the downtown area.

Civil Defense Director Jim Watson said Wednesday that many people in the county courthouse and various other buildings along Main Street were barely able to hear the 125 decibel siren which blared out its alarm from the roof of the Medical - Dental Building at noon Monday.

Some others walking near Main Street or driving in the vicinity of the siren were of a different opinion. They appraised that the noise emitted by the siren was irritating and too harsh.

Elsewhere, three smaller sirens on poles at Lakeview and Trinity streets, Washburn Way and Eberlein Avenue, and Patterson and South Sixth streets

produced an alarm loud enough to be heard by residents in their respective areas, Watson said. The smaller sirens are dissimilar to the type at the Medical - Dental Building in that they are stationary, while the alarm of the other model is sounded through a horn as it revolves on top of the building.

Watson believes that the horn is pointing too high and indicated that it might be heard by more people working inside offices in the heart of the business area if it were lowered. Watson said he would discuss the matter with the firm which installed the system and ask for their recommendations. Mean-

while, the CD alert system will continue to be tested at noon on the first Monday of every month, he said.
