Braves Win Final Gridiron Contest

ALTURAS — The Modoc Braves ended the 1963 football season with a rousing victory over the Trinity Wolves last Saturday afternoon. Sparked by three outstanding runs by flanker back Richard Hughes, the Braves defeated the Wolves 40 - 20. After a first quarter TD by the Wolves, the Braves came back in the second quarter with a ground drive climaxed as Hughes scored on a reverse. Jim Van Loan kicked the conversion to put the Braves in the lead. Hughes followed up with a spectacular 50 - yard run on a reverse for the second score in the second half. On an option play, quarterback David Starr went 40 yards to make the half-time score, 20-7. Following the winning pattern set in the first half, Hughes ran the kickoff back 80 yards to score in the opening few minutes. A pass by halfback Van Loan to Scott Shefflin scored the conversion point for the Braves. Later in the third quarter, linebacker Bob Hetherwick picked up a fumble by the Wolves on their 15-yard line and ran it over for another score for Modoc. The Trinity eleven came back to life in the fourth quarter with a pass from Dennis McGlynn to Dan Carpenter for six points. The conversion point was made on a pass to Carpenter. Carpenter set up the last TD for the Wolves with an intercepted pass in the fourth quarter. During the last two minutes of the game Modoc scored again when quarterback Starr broke through on a sneak and went 40 yards to the goal line after a fine key block by John Ford.

Elk Hunting Rated Good In Northwest

PORTLAND (UPI) — The weekly report on fishing conditions prepared by the State Game Commission: Northwest: Silver salmon angling fair to good in Tillamook-Nestucca area and a few 40-50 lb. fair to good in Tillamook-Bay; a few steelhead being taken in the Nestucca, Trask and Wilson; Fern Ridge Reservoir near winter level and catfish angling improving; Dorena Reservoir producing good rainbow catches. Southeast: An occasional steelhead is being taken in the Cleveland Rapids, the "Forks," and Winchester and Idleyd areas in Umpqua system; Tenmile Creek good for jacks; Coos and Coquille Rivers generally poor for salmon; Rogue River has been fair for steelhead from Grants Pass to Graves Creek, and good in the Lobster Creek - Agness area; Chinook fishing has been good with cluster eggs but most fish getting dark; Sixes and Elk Rivers poor. Northeast: John Day River in good condition from Kimberly downstream for steelhead.

PORTLAND (UPI) — Here is the weekly hunting report from the Oregon State Game Commission: Northwest: Elk hunting in the Clatsop unit continues good with many large bulls being taken. Southwest: Elk hunting has slowed in this area due to the animals holding up in the deep timber. Access on back roads is becoming more difficult as rain soaks the area. Pheasant and duck hunting is also slow. Central: Generally poor for both elk and waterfowl. Only small flights of ducks and geese have been observed and elk are feeding at highest elevations. Deer permit holders are having only fair success. Northeast: Storms in the area have improved elk hunting conditions, particularly in Willowa County. Grant and Umatilla counties should also begin to produce. Pheasant hunting is only fair in Union and Baker counties. Southeast: Elk remain in the higher country and lack of good tracking snow has hampered hunter's efforts. Ducks and geese flocking in large numbers in Warner Valley and Summer Lake is due to improve with coming storms.

The Pistons' win moved them out of the Eastern Division cellar as Baltimore took Detroit's place. Ray Scott paced the Pistons with 30 points.

The fast-moving Boston Celtics scored 139 points to Cincinnati's 121 Wednesday night as the New York Yankees of professional basketball surged to their seventh win without a defeat.
