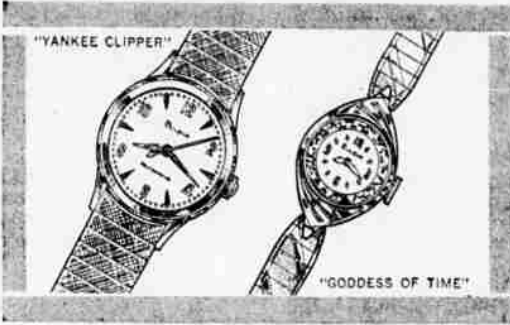

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Agriculture Secretary Orville L. Freeman assured lumber industry leaders Wednesday the forest service will adopt a system of annual balance reports on timber sales from national forests.

The reports, which had been requested by industry spokesmen, would show actual timber sales in comparison with "allowable cut" on each forest under sustained-yield management methods. The reports would also show potential sales under improved management conditions, an industry spokesman said.

Freeman's statement was made at a meeting with members of Congress from 19 states and leaders of the National Lumber Manufacturers Association (NLMA).

The forest service, part of Freeman's department, manages the National Forest and wood-using industries in many areas depend heavily on forest

service sales for their supplies. W. D. Hagenstein, Portland, Ore., executive vice president of the industrial forestry association and member of NLMA advisory committee, said Freeman also proposed:

—A revised system for handling appeals filed by lumbermen in contract disputes with the forest service under the new proposal. Review committees would hear appeals from rulings by regional forest service officials. The committees would include agriculture department officials from agencies outside the forest service and private citizens.

—Negotiation between industry spokesmen and the forest service on details of revised requirements for timber sales contracts.

Hagenstein said Freeman also announced he was prepared to accept practically all of the recommendations of an impartial study committee on new appraisal practices for timber on national forests.

**Council Fathers Propose 'Senate' Of Bishops To Help Govern Church**

VATICAN CITY (UPI)—Ecumenical Council fathers from all parts of the world spoke up strongly today in favor of the establishment of a "senate" of bishops in Rome to help the Pope govern the church.

The proposal for an episcopal senate composed of representatives chosen by national hierarchies was endorsed in council debate by bishops from France, South Africa, Ireland and Indonesia.

In another highlight of today's debate, Joseph Cardinal Ritter of St. Louis, who said he was speaking for "several" U.S. bishops, called for a clear declaration by the council that the Roman Curia has no independent

existence in its own right but is solely an instrument of the Pope.

Cardinal Ritter favored enlarging the powers of bishops to run their own dioceses, as a pending council document would do, but he objected strenuously to the fact the document speaks of "granting" powers to bishops. He said it should speak rather of "restoring" powers which bishops have by divine right but have in the course of history tended to be restricted.

Cardinal Ritter's views were seconded by Archbishop Piotr Kalwa of Lublin, Poland, speaking on behalf of the entire Polish hierarchy.

Archbishop Owen McCann of Capetown, speaking for all bishops from South Africa and Northern Rhodesia, said it was "absolutely necessary" to set up a central body in Rome representing all the bishops of the world. He said that many of the questions awaiting action by the Ecumenical Council could be turned over to this body, thus cutting down the duration of the council.

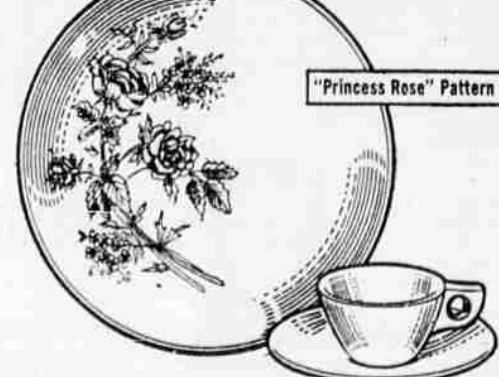
