Dixie Republicans Ready Campaign For Goldwater

CHARLESTON, S.C. (UPI) — Dixie Republican leaders meet here today to plan strategy for their Goldwater campaign and promised a warm welcome and cold shoulder to a delegation sent by Gov. Nelson Rockefeller.

South Carolina GOP Chairman Drake Edens, host to the 13-state conference, promised that the New Yorkers would be treated to a show of Southern hospitality, but added:

"This is Goldwater country."

Other Southern Republican leaders agreed that the Rockefeller supporters would have little chance of winning Southern support from the Arizona senator.

"The South is united for Goldwater," said Wirt Yerger Jr., of Jackson, Miss., chairman of the Southern Association of State GOP Chairmen.

Going As Republicans

Michael N. Seels, executive director of the New York State GOP Committee, said that he and three other New York backers of Rockefeller were coming here simply as Republicans.

"We're not going down there as carpetbaggers to sell a point of view," Seels said. "Of course we're going to talk to some of our friends. We'll probably be asked some questions."

Edens said the conference would have been restricted to simply talk of greasing the GOP's election machinery had the New Yorkers not decided to come.

The South Carolinian said they could be expected to actively boost Rockefeller's candidacy and Goldwater backers in turn would plug their man.

Man Indicted On Bad Check

Plane Skids Off Runway; 97 Survive

LONDON (UPI) — All 97 persons aboard a Trans-Canada Airlines (TCA) DC 8 jetliner escaped death Wednesday night when the plane skidded off a London Airport runway into a muddy cabbage patch during a heavy fog.

The plane, bound for Montreal, was not airborne but had reached the "point of no return" when the accident happened. Four persons, three women and a man, required hospitalization but their injuries were not considered serious.

Visibility was about 20 yards, officials said, when the plane started down the runway. Ground speed was too great to come to an orderly halt when the pilot, Capt. R.S. Found, had to slam on the brakes. The giant jetliner skidded about 700 yards into the boggy cabbage patch and one of its four engines caught fire.

The passengers were able to scramble out of the aircraft in near-record time by using an escape chute. TCA officials said all were removed from the plane within 90 seconds after the accident.

Most of the passengers who spent the night in London hotels, will return to Canada today aboard another plane flown here from Canada, TCA officials said.

Russians Unveil Vaunted Anti-Missile Missile

MOSCOW (UPI) — The Soviet Union today unveiled the vaunted Soviet anti-missile missile which Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev once said could "hit a fly in the sky."

A squadron of three of the silver-painted rockets, fitted with huge fins at mid-fuselage and tail, was hauled through Red Square on open trucks for this year's military parade on the anniversary of the Russian revolution. The fins apparently provide maneuverability.

Minutes earlier Soviet Defense Minister Marshal Rodion Malinovsky had described the Soviet Union's might in a brief speech which warned that any aggressors would meet a "crushing retaliatory blow."

The parade was held in frosty weather in front of Khrushchev and other top government and Communist party leaders. They had solemnly mounted the Lenin mausoleum as the ancient clock in the Kremlin struck 10 a.m.

Conspicuously absent from the black and red marble monument was Frol Kozlov, a member of the Soviet Presidium who was taken ill six months ago. He has been reported to have suffered a stroke, and did not attend another demonstration in Red Square last May Day.

The unveiling of the new Soviet anti-missile missile was the highlight of this year's celebration and followed the first showing last year of a Polaris-type naval rocket. The Polaris-type was back again today, in larger numbers and bearing a naval crest.

Khrushchev told a visiting group of American newspaper editors last year that Russia had such a fast and accurate rocket that it could shoot down a "fly in the sky."

The silvery, multi-staged weapon appeared to be between 30 and 35 feet long, somewhat shorter than the Russian ballistic missiles that once were installed in Cuba. The latter also were displayed today.

The 10-minute roll-past of military hardware included lesser ground-to-ground and surface-to-air missiles and rockets, along with giant tanks and self-propelled cannon. Members of the Moscow military garrison and cadets marched in review.

Then, banners and portraits of Lenin waving in the air, came the vanguard of hundreds of thousands of Russians who marched across the square to the blare of martial music and exhortations from loudspeakers.
