

High Court Tosses Out Ballot Title

SALEM (UPI)—The Oregon Supreme Court, in a 5-2 split decision, today overthrew Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton's proposed ballot title for the initiative measure to close the state's waters to commercial salmon and steelhead fishing.

It substituted the title proposed by opponents of the measure. The action paves the way for the Save Our Salmon and Steelhead, Inc., to begin circulation of petitions to get the controversial measure on the November, 1964, ballot.

The initiative petition was filed with the secretary of state on Aug. 8. The group was filed with the secretary of state on Aug. 8. The group has until July 2, 1964, to gather 37,006 valid signatures.

It proposes to close all the state's inland waters, including the Columbia River, to commercial salmon and steelhead fishing.

The title assigned by Thornton read "Prohibits commercial fishing for salmon and steelhead in all Oregon inland waters, including boundary rivers. Prohibits all commercial dealings in fish taken illegally."

The Columbia River Salmon and Tuna Packers Association challenged the final four words of Thornton's title, and asked that "fish taken in prohibited areas" be substituted.

Today's Supreme Court action made the substitution. Justice Hall S. Lusk, with Justice Kenneth J. O'Connell joining, dissented, and said Thornton's title met legal requirements, and the court should not disapprove a title "simply because it feels it can write a better one."

The majority opinion by Justice George Rossman said the language in the substituted title "minimizes the possibility that a reader will surmise that unless this measure is adopted, Oregon will have no law that prohibits commercial dealings in salmon and steelhead that were taken illegally."

Dickering With Communists May Have Led To Downfall Of Diem Brothers

WASHINGTON (UPI)—U.S. officials believe that evidence Ngo Dinh Nhu was dickering with the Communists may have helped trigger the coup that overthrew his brother, President Ngo Dinh Diem of South Viet Nam.

Members of the 14-general revolutionary committee which seized power last week contend that the controversial Nhu, who died along with Diem in the uprising, had been negotiating for possible reunification of Communist North Viet Nam and South Viet Nam under a "neutral" banner.

American authorities cannot confirm all the details but they have independent evidence that, at the very least, Nhu was in touch with Red leaders in Hanoi.

This was disclosed Tuesday as Secretary of State Dean Rusk expressed the hope that the United States could recognize the new Saigon regime soon. He said South Viet Nam

was "moving now toward quiet and stability." Other officials said recognition might come in a few days.

Rusk spoke to newsmen after he held a closed-door briefing

on the situation for the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. Committee Chairman J. William Fulbright, D-Ark., disclosed that 12 Vietnamese generals had offered Diem safe

conduct during the uprising if he would surrender. Despite their individual pleas in telephone calls, Fulbright said, Diem apparently refused.

Fulbright quoted Rusk as saying it still was not clear whether Diem and Nhu were assassinated on impulse by individual soldiers, or on orders from the coup leaders. The revolutionary committee of generals

had told the United States, however, that it did not order the slaying.

The basic reason for the coup undoubtedly was fear on the part of the Vietnamese military leaders that Diem's increasingly repressive political measures were beginning to damage the war effort against the Communist-led Viet Cong guerrillas, U.S. officials said.

Home Ends Vote Drive

KINROSS, Scotland (UPI)—Prime Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home today wound up his two-fold campaign for winning a seat in the House of Commons and halting the Conservative party's slide toward possible defeat in the next general elections.

Residents of the constituency of Kinross-West Perthshire will vote in a by-election Thursday to pick a representative from a slate of candidates including the 60-year-old prime minister, who gave up his ancient title last month, and six opponents. The result will be known Friday.

Douglas-Home is expected to win, but the size of his majority is considered vitally important to his party.

Liberal candidate Alastair D. Millar, a local landowner, is expected to provide the stiffest opposition. The liberals did not contest the Kinross seat in the last general elections, and the party is expected to draw more votes away from Douglas-Home than the Labor party candidate, Andrew Forrester.

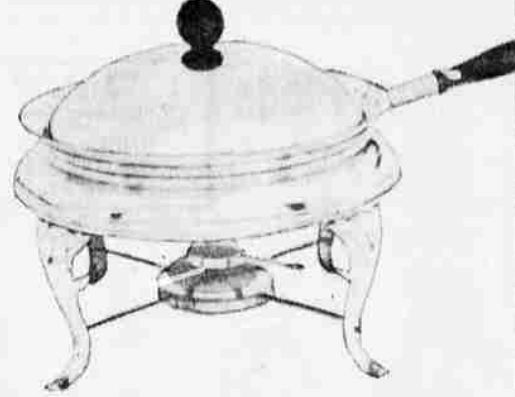
With the next general elections due any time within the next 11 months, the Conservatives have little time to build the prime minister into a solid vote-getter.

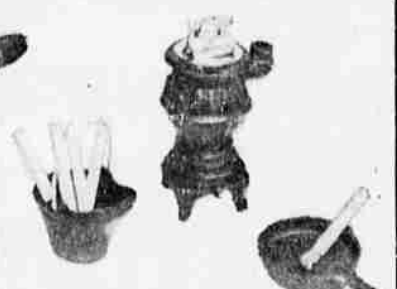
The State Highway Department said McNutt offered to do the work for \$1,191,808.
