

Trojans Stopped By Honkers

Honkers Capitalize On Troy Errors In Mudfest

MODOC FIELD—A pair of football mistakes made the difference in the two teams playing here Friday night.

They were costly mistakes for the Sacred Heart and errors of which the alert Lakeview Honkers took full advantage.

The first was a wobbly aerial pick off to set up a touchdown and the second fumble—in the sea of mud used as a gridiron causing numerous such bobbles — also turned into a touchdown.

These two scoring probes by the Honkers gave them a 12-0 Rogue Valley League triumph.

It was based on the battle of the basement, with the loser ticketed for the dubious honor of filling this position in the league standings.

Both teams went into the contest seeking the initial league victory of the season and if this fact didn't give them equal opportunity at gaining a victory, then the great equalizer—mud—did.

The sloppy going was the big factor in the contest as the fumble chart indicates. The Trojans fumbled four times and lost the ball three of these times and the Honkers had five fumbles and lost the ball on two of these occasions.

It was Homecoming for the Trojans and that plus the desire to end a none too successful season on a winning note gave the Sacred Heart eleven sufficient incentive.

However, Roy Robertson's Honkers, a team which has given the better teams in the loop for better losing this year, overcame the fired-up Trojans and particularly in the second half.

The first half of the contest was played according to the book, with each team giving and taking with the exception

of the first quarter error by Troy which the Honkers took with thanks and used to good advantage.

How even the contest was indicated in the first half stats which revealed the Trojans had the better going with the exception of the figures on the scoreboard — and they only count them.

It was a 74-55 net yardage advantage for the Trojans in the first half and a 5-1 first down edge.

But, the halftime score read 6-0 for the Honkers.

It was an aerial pick off by Jeff Sullivan with 5:10 left in the first quarter setting up the first score. This came after the Trojans had proved tough and forced the first punt of the game and were driving.

On the first play on the Sacred Heart 41 after the interception, Sullivan faked the handoff and gave to halfback Greg Tracy who went the left end route and was in the clear as he turned the corner.

He traveled the 41-yard distance for the score untouched. The PAT attempt via a run failed and it was a 6-0 game.

The Trojans came back in the second period to mount a drive carrying deep into Honker territory.

It was Joe DeNault recovering the first two fumbles for him in the contest giving the Trojans the ball on their 48.

Good gains by Jim Korsen and passing by Marv Davis and sound blocking carried the Trojans to the Honker two before the Lakeview eleven stiffened and ended the threat.

In the second half the Honkers threatened again as Gary Merrill recovered a Trojan fumble on the Sacred Heart 39.

The Honkers traveled to the Trojan 11 on a drive which included a big 36-yard gain around the left side by Tracy to the 14.

However, on second down on the 11, the Honkers were again hit by the fumble-causing muddy going and gave the ball back to the Trojans as again DeNault was the man of the hour recovering on the 12.

The teams battled into the fourth period before another Honker drive to the Trojan 27 was stopped and the Sacred Heart eleven took over.

But again the nerves of both teams struck on first down for the Trojans and the fumble on first down was taken by the Honkers' Merrill again.

With the ball recovered on the 24, the Honkers were first hit with a five-yard penalty moving back to the Sacred Heart 29.

From this point the drive started, with Tracy, Rich Drinkwater and Vern Plato alternating on the running and Sullivan connecting with Plato on the key play of the drive.

With 8:27 left in the contest and fourth and one for the Honkers, Sullivan threw the short safety pass to Tracy carrying down to the Trojan 12 and a first down.

Two plays later the Honkers were across with Plato carrying the final three yards for the score.

The PAT attempt on a run again failed and it was a 12-0 contest with 7:41 left.

The Trojans were unable to sustain a closing drive and the Honkers came back and were again threatening in the closing seconds when the Lakeview bench was cleared and moved the ball down to the Trojan nine when the final horn sounded.

So ended the 1963 campaign for the Trojans and the Honkers, with Lakeview ending with a 2-7 overall mark and the Trojans winless in nine outings.

However, with both teams well-supplied with inexperienced griders, possibilities of both becoming threats for the Rogue League honors next year are increased considerably.

Henley Scoring Mark Ended By Big Pirates

A record has ended for the Henley Hornets.

Sure, the Phoenix Pirates handed the Hornets a 28-0 Rogue Valley League setback, but that was not too surprising.

The champion Bucs were supposed to win.

The record ended is in the fact the Hornets were shut out for the first time in 46 games.

This is a mark carrying over five years of gridiron action.

The last team to turn the trick was Eagle Point as a 13-0 setback was sustained by the Hornets.

With the rain and mud slowing both teams considerably, the potent Pirate eleven went into a 7-0 lead in the first period and added seven points per quarter for the victory.

It was Grennen and Jim Consruck alternating in the opening touchdown drive, with Grennen sweeping the right side for the score.

The teams fought through the mud on even terms the balance of the first chapter and most of the second, before the Pirates again struck, this time with but 13 seconds left in the first half.

With two minutes left in the second stanza, Ron Williams hit Eugene Hill with an aerial covering 35 yards and putting the Bucs on the Henley eight.

Gronnen picked up three and Consruck the final five yards for the tally. Williams added the PAT on a run for a 14-0 lead.

OSU Rooks Top Washington Pups

SEATTLE (UPI) — The Oregon State University frosh football team defeated the University of Washington freshmen 21-13 here Friday afternoon on the strong running of fullback Paul Pifer and quarterback Bob Grimm.

Pifer and Grimm carried the pups and gained 91 yards for the Rooks. Grimm gained 110 yards on 13 carries, including a 36-yard touchdown run in the third quarter.

Washington scored early in the second quarter on a 47-yard pass from Frank Etter to Dave Williams. Their second touchdown came late in the fourth quarter when fullback Jerry Williams went five yards around right end for the score.

Don Cook made all three conversions for Oregon State.

Oregon State dominated the statistics, holding the edge in first downs 21-12, and in total offense yardage, 401-225. The Rooks gained 338 yards with a strong rushing attack.

The Washington frosh are now 0-3 for the season.

Machen In Ring Offer

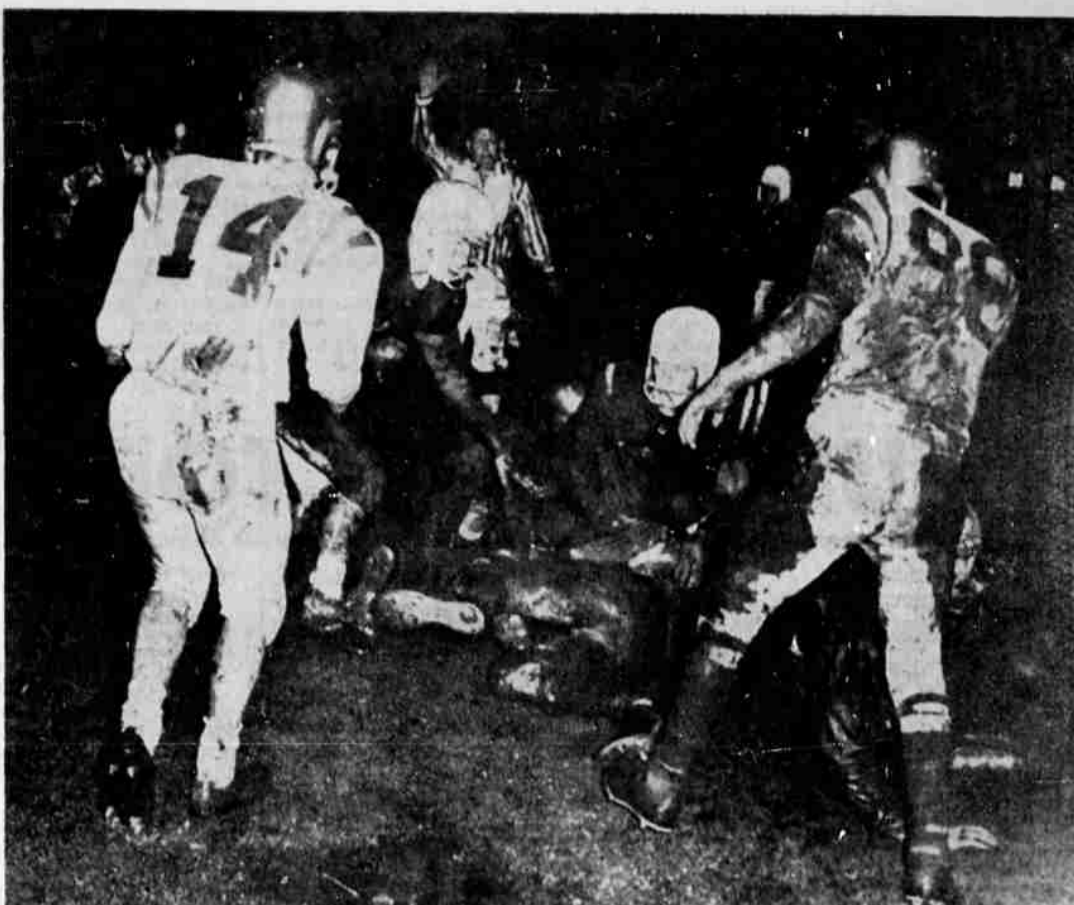
SEATTLE (UPI) — Eugene Machen was offered \$10,000 Friday to box Eddie Cotton in Seattle.
