# Philadelphia Spoils Homecoming

The Warriors, returning to the city they left two years ago in a franchise shift, were edged 106-102 in an overtime game by the 76ers, formerly the Syracuse Nats. It was the only game scheduled in the NBA Tuesday night.

The game had another nostalgic touch since Alex Hannum, San Francisco coach, is the former mentor of the Syracuse Nats.

Hannum said the situation led to an inspired and "well-played" ball game but to the Warriors' Guy Rodgers, who was a collegiate star at Temple University here, it was just another road game. This despite the fact that his family was in the stands.

The Warriors got a nice hand from the crowd of 5,817 when they came on the floor for the pre-game warmup but the loyalty of the fans was with the current local NBA entry, the 76ers.

The victory was a satisfying one for Dolph Schayes, new 76ers coach who starred for many years with the Nats under Hannum.

But for a time, it appeared the work of Wilt Chamberlain, the former favorite here, would deprive the 76ers of the triumph.

San Francisco rallied to send the tight game into overtime when Chamberlain, who has won new fame as a playmaker, tipped in Rodgers' missed jump shot to deadlock the game 99-98 as time ran out.

The Warriors then scored the first four points of the extra period on a basket by Rodgers and another by Wayne High-tower.

But the 76ers rallied to tie the game at 100-100 and there was another tie at 102-102 before Hal Greer sent the home team ahead for good with a field goal with 33 seconds remaining. Two free throw conversions by Ben Waryly clinched the triumph.

## Officials Absolved In Riot

NEW YORK (UPI) — The judges at Roosevelt Raceway Tuesday were absolved of any blame by the state Harness Racing Commission in connection with the riot following the sixth race last Friday night.

An estimated 500 fans swarmed onto the track, causing considerable damage and cancelling the remainder of the program, after the judges had refused to nullify the race although only two horses finished. The other six entries were wiped out in a backstretch collision in what was supposed to be the first race of the twin double payoff pool.

"The judges acted with complete propriety and in accordance with harness racing rules and regulations," said the commission, which will hold a second meeting today.

The commission also announced that it will "actively assist in the prosecution of any one involved in the disorder and permanently bar any person found guilty."

SEATTLE, Wash. (UPI) — It came up mud Tuesday, but the Washington Huskies still splashed around for two hours in an attempt to sharpen up their defense.

Coach Jim Owens and his staff were disappointed in the Huskies' defensive play last Saturday against California.

Injured guard Rick Sortun joined the workout, but will not play Saturday against UCLA.

PULLMAN, Wash. (UPI) — The Washington State Cougars held a short workout on fundamentals and offensive formations Tuesday after a 30-minute meeting in Hollingberry Field-house.

Coach Jim Sutherland put the squad on the field after a two-day layoff, but he stayed away from contact drills because some team members had some pulled and bruised muscles after Saturday's 21-7 loss to Oregon.

Washington State is at Stanford Saturday.

MOSCOW, Idaho (UPI) — Idaho takes on Idaho State Saturday and coach Dee Andros is working on building up the Vandals' running attack this week. Passing and defense have been the main reasons that the Vandals have won four games this season.

CORVALLIS, Ore. (UPI) — Coach Tommy Prothro said today that Oregon State's star end Vern Burke is "running normally" again after suffering a sprained ankle last Saturday against Indiana.

The Beavers will leave for Los Angeles Thursday to battle Southern California.

EUGENE, Ore. (UPI) — Oregon's star tandem of quarterback Bob Berry and halfback Mel Renfro are described as "much improved" as the Ducks ready for their Saturday battle at Portland against Indiana.

Both have been battling injuries for the past four weeks. Tackle Ray Johnson, who sat out last week's Oregon win over Washington State, also has returned to practice.

PALO ALTO, Calif. (UPI) — Coach John Ralston ran the Stanford Indians through a two-

hour practice session Tuesday in preparation for Saturday's Big Six meeting with Washington State.

Ralston was favorably impressed with the blocking of sophomore guards Bruce Kehrl and Tom Ross, who may be called on to replace John Wilbur. He injured his knee in last week's game against USC and will be operated on Thursday.

BERKELEY, Calif. (UPI) — Coach Mary Levy of the California Bears said today that he is still not sure whether 235-pound sophomore left tackle Roger Foster will be ready for action Saturday in Salt Lake City against the University of Utah.

Foster was injured two weeks ago.

Meanwhile, end Jack Schraub appeared to have finally made it to the first team. He is second in the Big Six in pass-catching and has been named Big Six lineman of the week and Northern California lineman of the week, but has not yet started for the Bears. He worked out with the starters Tuesday.

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — University of Southern California's Trojans stressed pass defense once again today as they prepared to meet Oregon State's football team Friday night in the Coliseum.

Coach John McKay moved All-America end Hal Bedsole up to second string after Tuesday's workout. Bedsole had been dropped to third string after the Trojans were upset by the Washington Huskies.

McKay said Bedsole would play behind Fred Hill and Dave Moton who are alternating at split end on the first team.

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — The UCLA Bruins continued to stress defense in the practice session today in preparation for their game against the Rose Bowl-bound Washington Huskies Saturday.

In Tuesday's session, the Bruins worked on defense most of the afternoon, and then turned to offense under the lights.

The offensive drill featured the running of quarterback Mike Haffner and halfback Byron Nelson.

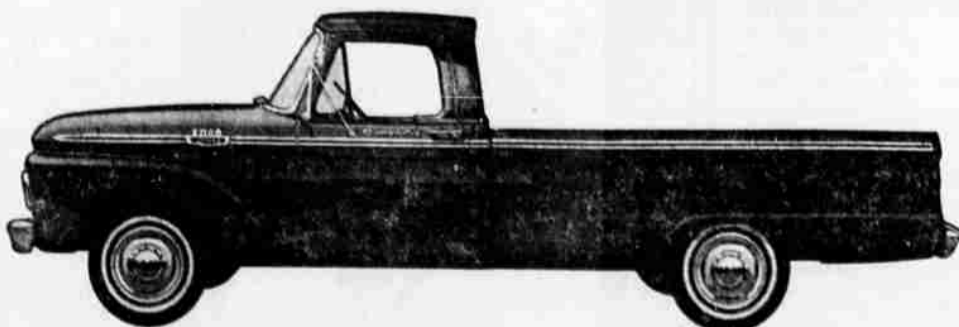
The victory gave Rochester undisputed possession of second place in the Western Division four points behind Pittsburgh.
