## Solon Asks Bill Review

SALEM (UPI)—The property tax relief act for persons over 65 "isn't working out," Sen. Walter Pearson, D-Portland, said today. He said he would ask a legislative review of the bill and of rules set up by the Tax Commission.

Senate President Ben Musa said he would reactivate the Senate Tax Committee so Pearson could begin work on the problem.

The bill was passed at the regular session of the 1963 legislature.

"Under present rules, persons will be deprived of property tax relief whom the legislature intended should get relief," Pearson said.

# Gov. Romney's Fiscal Reform Program Turned Down By Michigan Legislature

LANSING, Mich. (UPI)—Gov. George Romney appeared today to have escaped serious political injury from the legislature's rejection of his ambitious fiscal reform program.

Romney, a possible 1964 Republican presidential contender, would not even concede a total defeat for his plan.

Instead he claimed "there was more Republican support than ever before for basic tax reform."

Romney's program, which included personal and corporate income taxes, was officially killed Thursday in the House of Representatives.

Prosperity apparently was a major contributing factor in the program's defeat. With the state riding the crest of an economic boom, few legislators were anxious to test their voter popularity by enactment of an income tax.

But Romney, who last January became Michigan's first Republican governor in 14 years, claimed increased support for tax reforms.

"More citizens and organizations than ever before responded to the call for support," he said. "There has been more general support for tax reform this year than at any time during the six years I have actively engaged in the effort to straighten out Michigan's tax structure."

Romney was active in the reform movement before entering politics and while president of the American Motors Corporation.

The governor's reform package centered around adoption of a statewide income tax on individuals and corporations.
