Queen To Burke Bombs Not Enough; Beavers Lose Decision

Berry Snaps Records With Air Game; Murphy Scores Vital TD

PORTLAND (UPI) — Bob Berry's 29-yard pass to H. D. Murphy, his third touchdown throw of the day, gave Oregon a 28-22 football victory over Indiana with 11 seconds left Saturday.

It was Oregon's first win over a Big Ten team in eight tries.

Berry, who set school records for passing yardage and touchdown passes in a season, hit Murphy in full flight in the end zone.

The senior halfback made a leaping catch before running out of the end zone. Berry's other scoring passes were 21 yards to end Dick Imwalle and 37 to halfback Larry Hill.

Tom Nowatzke apparently had won the game for Indiana less than two minutes earlier with a 29-yard field goal. Nowatzke also scored Indiana's first touchdown on a 52-yard pass interception and quarterback Rich Badar got the others on runs of 1 and 10 yards.

Berry and All-America halfback Mel Renfro brought the Ducks from behind twice before the final heroics.

The senior quarterback completed 13 of 20 passes for 214 yards including eight of his last nine throws for two of the touchdowns.

His three scoring passes gave

him 14 for the season, breaking the record of 13 set by Hal Dunham in 1951. His 1,426 yards this year eclipsed George Shaw's school record of 1,358 in 1954.

Renfro carried the ball 16 times for 41 yards and caught

five passes for 79 yards including a diving 30-yarder with 48 seconds to play that moved the Webfoots deep into Hoosier territory.

The Hoosiers, stymied on the ground most of the game, had to use Badar's passing for their big gains. He completed 9 of 13 for 164 yards. Nowatzke car-

ried the ball 17 times but was held to 44 yards.

The game was played in windy, cold weather with rain falling part of the second half, temperatures in the high 40s held the crowd to 19,051.

The loss ended a three-game Indiana winning streak, leaving it with a 3-5 record for the season. Oregon has a 6-3 mark.

Garrett, Brown Running Insures Southern California Win, 28-22

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Southern California's two great running backs, Mike Garrett and Willie Brown, each scored a touchdown Friday night as the Trojans came from behind for a 28-22 football victory over Oregon State.

The Beavers' passing combination of quarterback Gordon Queen and end Vern Burke clicked for two touchdowns in the second period and another in the fourth period, but otherwise Oregon State's passing attack was bottled up.

A sparse crowd of 30,846 at the Coliseum witnessed a tremendous passing effort by Queen when he and his favorite target avoided the Trojans' defensive maneuvers. The three touchdown passes thrown by Queen brought his total to 16 in nine games, one better than the mark set by teammate Terry Baker last season.

Garrett Gains 159 Yards

Garrett rushed for 159 yards for the Trojans while Brown put the game out of Oregon State's reach in the third period with a 54-yard run down the sidelines for a touchdown.

With the Trojans leading 22-14, both teams scored in the final period when Queen threw his third touchdown pass to Burke for 34 yards. His other scoring drives were for 12 and 22 yards.

Hal Bedsole, back on the first USC team after disciplinary action, hauled in a seven-yard pass from Craig Fertig in the first period after a fumble recovery to give the Trojans a lead until Queen found the range in the second quarter to Burke.

Houston In Upset Loss

TULSA, Okla. (UPI) — Tulsa quarterback Jerry Rhome threw two fourth quarter touchdown passes to halfback Bill Van Burkleo and then calmly passed for a two-point conversion with one minute left Saturday to upset Houston 22-21.

Trailing 21-14 with 1:10 left, Rhome threw a 43-yard scoring pass to Van Burkleo.

Rhome then threw a quick strike to halfback Jeff Jordan in the corner of the end zone for the winning conversion.

Rhome's earlier touchdown pass to Van Burkleo covered five yards with six minutes left in the fourth quarter. It capped a 98-yard march.

Houston scored the first two times it got the ball. Cougar quarterback Jack Skog scored on runs of one and seven yards to cap drives of 52 and 50 yards in the first quarter.

Skog passed 10 yards to end Clem Beard to give Houston a 21-7 halftime lead.

Roseburg edged defending champion Medford 7-6 and Beaverton clubbed Parkrose 19-7 as the Oregon class A-1 high school football playoffs opened Friday night.

Games Saturday sent North Salem to Pendleton and Grant of Portland against West Linn in Portland.

In the class A-2 playoffs, top-ranked Phoenix blasted Douglas 38-0 at Ashland. Action in that division Saturday matched Junction City against Stuslaw at Florence and Woodburn at Vale. North Catholic played Willamina in Portland Saturday night.

Alan Young's extra point kick was the margin of victory for Roseburg, which was held to a tie with Cottage Grove for the Midwestern League title this fall. The Indians moved 63 yards in the third quarter with Jim Beamer plunging for the score from the 1-yard line.

Medford moved 69 yards, mostly on Mike Barnes' passing, in the fourth quarter and Jim

Cox plunged into the end zone from the 2. Roseburg's line blocked Bill Collins' extra point kick and that was the margin of victory.

The win moved the Vikings, runnersup in the state playoffs last season, into the semifinals against Beaverton at Salem next weekend.

North Salem broke a 7-7 tie with a touchdown in the third period on a three-yard run by Del Schaeffer.

Pendleton collected a touchdown in the first period on a 12-yard run by Eric Larson in the first period and the Vikings countered with a score in the second period on a 68-yard run by Schaeffer.

Beaverton survived a touchdown by Parkrose in the first five minutes and scored in the first, second and fourth quarters for its victory.

Rose Bowl Records Muddied As UCLA Bruins Surprise Huskies

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Quarterbacks Larry Zeno and Steve Sindell led an aroused UCLA football team to a 14-0 upset victory over Washington Saturday that kept the Huskies from clinching the Western Rose Bowl bid.

Halfback Byron Nelson proved the key man in the victory by catching 10 passes, including both touchdown throws from Sindell and Zeno.

The Huskies went into the game undefeated in the Big Six and needing only Saturday's win to insure them of the Rose Bowl selection.

But UCLA which had won only one previous game this season was unimpressed by Washington's record and five-game winning streak.

The Bruins on a great team effort outplayed Washington throughout the contest and held the Huskies to minor yardage gains on the ground.

The first UCLA score came in the opening seconds of the second period when Sindell passed eight yards to Nelson in the end zone to culminate an 88-yard drive. The march was featured by the rushing of fullback Jim Coletto and a 20-yard pass from Sindell to Nelson.

In the second quarter the

Huskies were unable to get into UCLA territory as UCLA kept Washington's fullback Junior Coffey bottled up and repeatedly threw quarterback Bill Douglas for losses.

Zeno took over in the second half at quarterback and guided them on a 76-yard drive which ended when he passed four yards to Nelson for the touchdown. On the march Zeno completed five of eight passes for 45 yards and ran for 25 yards himself.

In the fourth period, the tiring Bruins twice presented the Huskies with the ball on fumbles, the second time on their 20. But the Huskies could only get to the 13 where the hard-hitting Bruins forced them to fumble.

UCLA outplayed Washington both on the ground and through the air. The Bruins gained 109 yards rushing and 204 passing while Washington had only 94 rushing to 52 passing.

Washington now has a record of three victories and one loss in the Big Six and the loss Saturday left the Rose Bowl bid up in the air. The conference

is not bound by standings, but selects what it considers the most representative team.

Next week's season's closing game in which Washington meets Washington State and once beaten Southern California meets UCLA could decide the New Year's Day representative.

Southern Cal and UCLA both have 2-1 conference records, but the Trojans lost to Washington.

A large measure of UCLA's defensive might came from the

work of ends Mel Profit and Dave Gibbs who put a tremendous rush on Douglas but the entire UCLA team played fired up ball to completely outcharge the Huskies who went into the contest leading the Big Six in both rushing and total offense.
