News Told To Father

HYANNIS PORT, Mass. (UPI) — A heart-sick family broke the sad news Saturday to ailing Joseph P. Kennedy that his son was assassinated.

A doctor was in the family midst for fear disclosure of the tragedy might worsen the condition of the 75-year-old patriarch of the Kennedy clan.

The elder Kennedy's reaction was not known outside the sprawling white house overlooking Nantucket Sound where he and President Kennedy sailed and frolicked in happier days.

Perhaps indicative that the father took the news hard was the apparent delay in the family's previously indicated plans

to fly to Washington shortly after noon.

Mrs. Rose Kennedy, the President's 72-year-old mother, attended two Masses in a Catholic church and then went home to tell her husband what the world had known for nearly 20 hours—that their son was mortally wounded by a sniper.

Mrs. Kennedy, her son, Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, and a married daughter, Mrs. Eunice Shriver, all were present when father Kennedy was informed.

Kennedy, former ambassador to Great Britain, suffered a stroke in December, 1960, which left him virtually unable to talk. He spends most of his time in a wheel chair.

Highlights In The Life Of President Kennedy

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Highlights of President Kennedy's career:
 May 29, 1917—Born in Brookline, Mass., the second of nine children of former Ambassador to Great Britain Joseph P. Kennedy and his wife, Rose.
 1940 — Graduated from Harvard cum laude with a bachelor of science degree.
 1940 — Published best selling book, "Why England Slept."
 1941-45 — Served in the U.S. Navy. Rose to rank of lieutenant in command of a PT boat. In 1943 was badly injured when his boat was rammed by a

Japanese destroyer off the Solomon Islands.
 1947-1951 — Served as a U.S. congressman from Massachusetts.
 1962—Elected to the Senate, defeating Republican Sen. Henry Cabot Lodge.
 1963—Married Jacqueline Bouvier in Newport, Rhode Island.
 1954-1955—Spent six months in hospital undergoing and convalescing from major surgery on a back injury aggravated by the sinking of his PT boat.
 1956—Won a Pulitzer Prize for his book "Profiles in Courage."
 1960—Narrowly missed winning the Democratic vice presidential nomination, losing in a

close contest to the late Sen. Estes Kefauver, D-Tenn.
 1957—Became the father of his first child, Caroline.
 1958—Won reelection to the Senate by an overwhelming vote.
 1960—On July 14, he won the Democratic presidential nomination on the first ballot.
 1960—In November he defeated Vice President Richard M.

Nixon for the presidency in a close-fought battle that gave Kennedy a final edge of scarcely 100,000 ballots.
 1961—Became the father of a son, John Jr.
 1961—In April took full responsibility for the ill-fated Cuban invasion staged by dissident exile groups.
 1962—In October forced Russia to withdraw missiles it had secreted in Cuba.
 1963—Assassinated Nov. 22.

Ring Placed In Casket

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (UPI)—Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy pressed her wedding ring into the hand of her dead husband, seconds before his coffin was closed, Rep. Henry B. Gonzales, D-Tex., said Saturday. Gonzales described the incident in radio interview on sta-

tion KTSA. "She kissed her husband and touched his hand," the congressman said. "She removed her wedding ring and placed it in his hand."
 The casket was closed then, and the sorrowful return to Washington begun.

JFK Made Decision On Riding

DALLAS (UPI) — President Kennedy himself made the decision that gave an assassin the chance to kill him.

The original plans for the Dallas tour called only for a fast ride from the airport to a lunch at the Trade Mart.

But Democratic leaders urged him to ride in a motorcade through the heart of the city, to give the voters a smile and a wave.

Some advisers had misgivings remembering the violence that greeted U.N. Ambassador Adlai Stevenson last month.

The final decision was up to Kennedy. He approved the slow-moving motorcade that carried him to a date with a sniper's bullet.
