## Isolated Act Or Conspiracy? — World Wonders

LONDON (UPI)—Newspapers in both the Communist and non-Communist world asked today about the "forest of question marks" left by the assassination of President Kennedy and

the slaying of his accused killer, Lee H. Oswald. The term was used by the newspaper Die Welt in Hamburg, West Germany, which said "there is a feeling of shame that the law, which should explore the facts, was prevented from doing so. Political mists which also gathered should have been cleared. Now they thicken to poisonous clouds."

Criticism of the Dallas police was general, particularly for the announcement that the investigation into the President's murder was closed with the death of Oswald. Newspapers voiced the suspicion that there remained much of importance still unknown in the case. There was much speculation about a plot or an accomplice for Oswald. One Vienna newspaper, Arbeiter-Zeitung, reported without confirmation that Oswald had been seen in the night

club owned by his killer, Jack Ruby, only three days before the President's death. The London Daily Mail reported "whispers" that "Oswald was a tool who was used and then liquidated." London's Daily Sketch doubted he could have carried out the killing without an accomplice and suggested the other right-wing extremists or Communist nations had a hand in it. Britain's Guardian said jokes about Texans "will never again seem funny. The trouble with the image of the Texan is the six-shooter at the waist."

## Gun Scare Proves False

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Police today checked out an apparent false alarm report that a man was seen with a weapon on a roof opposite the office of Atty. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy. Police said the report apparently resulted from someone mistaking a workman, carrying tools, as a gunman. Several workers were on the roof repairing pipes and insulation, officials said.

Internal Revenue Service (IRS) officials said about 20 workmen had been on the job atop the IRS Building. They said all the workers were accounted for. Sgt. T. F. Sullivan of the General Services Administration (GSA) police said an extensive search by officers failed to uncover any trace of a gunman.

## Driver Unhurt In Car Crash

A 20-year-old motorist who gave his address as Kingsley Field escaped injury about 8:30 p.m. Monday when he failed to negotiate a curve in a heavy fog near the intersection of Spring Lake and Midland roads, Oregon State Police have reported.

Donald Ray Lanier, 20, told police that he lost control of his car and ran it into a ditch, damaging the left side of the vehicle. Lanier was not cited.

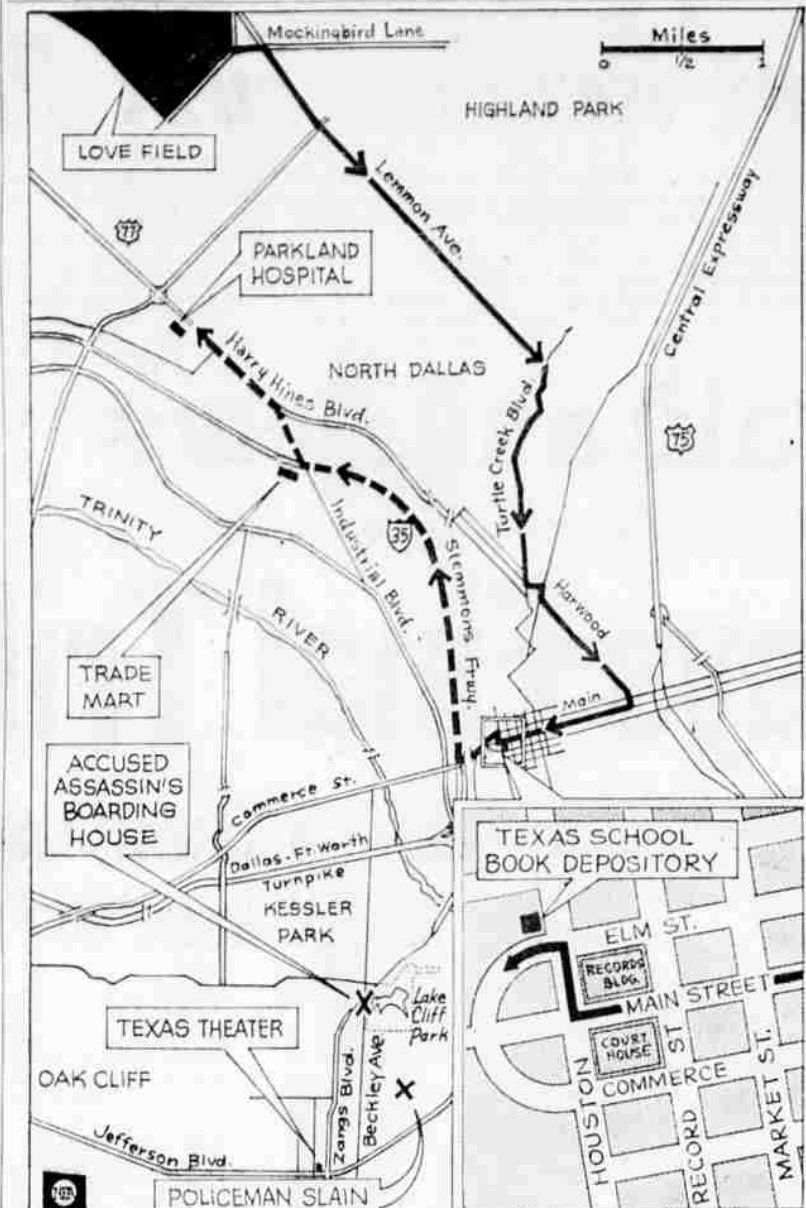

## Three Major Investigations Seek Assassination Answers

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Three major investigations were developing today into the assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of his accused slayer, Lee Harvey Oswald.

The Senate Judiciary Committee were expected to reveal all the details surrounding the death of the President to choke off at once any of the inevitable rumors of a "plot."

President Johnson assured the nation Monday night that all the facts disclosed in the FBI investigation would be made public.

## Meeting With Johnson Decried By Hatfield

PORTLAND (UPI) — Gov. Mark Hatfield returned from Washington in the pre-dawn hours today, bearing a word picture of the nation's new President and an appeal to dispel the hatred which has consumed some parts of America.

President Lyndon Johnson is a gregarious and warm human being, the governor said, in addition to being a political expert familiar with the ways of Washington.

# Ruby Indicted By Grand Jury

DALLAS (UPI) — A county grand jury today returned an indictment of murder with malice against flashy Jack Ruby, who shot President Kennedy's accused assassin.

aming trial probably will be held for Ruby after Thanksgiving.

Dist. Atty. Henry Wade said he would ask the death penalty and requested that Ruby be held without bond. Dist. Judge Joe B. Brown will rule.

Ruby, a striptease nightclub operator, shot Oswald on Sunday while millions of Americans watched on live television. The shooting took place while Oswald was being brought out of city jail under heavy guard to be taken to a maximum security cell at county jail.

Jake "The Master" Ehrlich said earlier today he is willing to consider defending Ruby.

Newspapers dubbed him Jake "The Master" because of the way he handles his courtroom attack. He is noted primarily for his trial histrionics and flamboyant personality.

Ruby told his Dallas lawyer, Tom Howard, Monday that he had a "spur of the moment" urge to kill Lee Harvey Oswald to avenge the Kennedy family and because he thought Oswald was part of a Communist plot.

Dallas County Dist. Atty. Henry Wade, who has a perfect batting average in murder cases—24 convictions out of 24—has said he will try to send Ruby to the electric chair.

Howard planned to have him plead temporary insanity and stressed that he felt Ruby had been "emotionally disturbed."

Called by Sister Ehrlich said he got a telephone call from Mrs. Eva Grant, Ruby's sister, and that she asked him if he would defend her brother.

Since Ruby already has retained Howard, Ehrlich said she should have him call his San Francisco office.

If the attorney asks Ehrlich to head up or organize a defense for Ruby, would he accept? "I would give it a hell of a lot of thought," he replied. Howard was not immediately available for comment, but his wife said that someone from Ehrlich's office in San Francisco had been in contact with her husband.
