

# Oregon Still Favored Slightly Despite Renfro Mishap; Sparts Get Big 10 Nod

NEW YORK (UPI)—Texas, headed toward a New Year's Day date in the Cotton Bowl, and Michigan State, bidding for a trip to the Rose Bowl, are favored to win their regular season finales on college football's holiday program Thursday.

Top-ranked Texas is a 10-point choice to down Texas A&M and thereby complete a perfect 10-0 season.

Michigan State is a six-point favorite over Illinois in their climatic game which will decide

the Big Ten championship and the conference representative in the Rose Bowl.

On Saturday, Princeton is rated a seven-point favorite to win the Ivy League title by beating Dartmouth while Harvard is a one-point pick over Yale. Both games are among those postponed from last Saturday because of the assassination of President Kennedy.

# Service Classic Slated In Memory Of Kennedy

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Army and Navy will get a chance to play their annual football classic in the memory of the late President Kennedy.

The game will be dedicated to Kennedy's memory, the Pentagon announced Tuesday.

After a day of conferences, Pentagon officials said it was decided to reschedule the Philadelphia game for Dec. 7, a one-week postponement.

Army Coach Paul Dietzel said

the postponement was "the least we could do" in memory of the late President.

Terming last Friday's assassination a great tragedy, Dietzel said "we are very honored to dedicate the game" to Kennedy's memory.

Coach Wayne Hardin of Navy said he and his team backed the decision "100 per cent."

"We're glad that it's going to be played, though, and not canceled," he added.

The Pentagon announcement said:

"The secretary of the Army and the secretary of the Navy decided today that the Army-Navy football game will be postponed one week in deference to the memory of President Kennedy. Consideration was given to cancellation of the game. However, President Kennedy's family requested that the game be played. The game will be dedicated to his memory."

# Nebraska's Devaney Cited For Upset Win Over Sooners

LINCOLN, Neb. (UPI) — He took over the football job at a school which hadn't had more than a couple of winners in two decades and racked up a 9-2 record his first year.

During his second season he steered the club to a gaudy 9-1 mark.

The ninth victory, a 20-0 defeat of Oklahoma last Saturday, was more than just another win. It gave his team its first Big Eight title in 23 years; it nailed down a trip to the Orange Bowl; and it won for Nebraska Coach Bob Devaney the title of United Press International Coach of the Week.

Devaney said the triumph over the always-tough Sooners was the "greatest" of his career. Then he immediately started handing out praise. By the time he was finished he had mentioned every assistant coach and most of the players.

"Give my assistants a lot of credit," he said. "They did a heck of a job of getting the team ready."

# Late Trade Completes House Cleaning By A's

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (UPI)—The Kansas City Athletics had completed a general house cleaning today with the trade of Norm Siebern to the Baltimore Orioles for Jim Gentile and \$25,000.

The exchange of first basemen Tuesday marked the departure of the last of the old Athletics, those who were on the team's roster when Charles O. Finley purchased the club in January, 1961.

Finley has wielded a busy broom from the start in his efforts to rebuild the Athletics.

But he has swept at a spring-cleaning pace during the past eight days in a crash program to add power to the lineup.

Last week, the Athletics sent second baseman Jerry Lampe and pitching mainstay Dave Wickersham and Ed Rakow to the Detroit Tigers in exchange for slugger Rocky Colavito, a right-handed swinger. The Tigers also sent along relief pitcher Bob Anderson and \$30,000 with Colavito. That was the first step in Kansas City's program for power.

The second step in the program came Tuesday when they got Gentile, a left-handed slugger.

"We feel that now we have the best one - two home run combination that Kansas City has ever had," said Athletics General Manager Pat Friday.

Siebern, the last varsity hold-over from the club Finley purchased, was the only semblance of power in the Kansas City lineup during the past three seasons. He batted cleanup. His best year was 1962 when he hit 25 home runs, drove in 117 and batted .300. Last year he hit 16 homers, drove in 83 runs and batted .272.

Gentile, who at 29 is one year younger than Siebern, had a poor year last season. He batted .249, hit 24 homers and drove in 72 runs.

But Gentile has produced more for the Orioles in the past four seasons that Siebern has produced for the Athletics. During that period, Gentile hit 124 homers, drove in 398 runs and batted .272. Siebern hit 78 home runs, drove in 357 runs and batted .269.

# No Action Taken On PSC 'Look'

OGDEN, Utah (UPI) — The infant Big Sky Athletic Conference is in good health and will continue to make progress and increase in size.

That's the first progress report given by Commissioner Jack Friel to athletic directors and faculty representatives who met at Ogden to iron out problems and make an evaluation of the league.

The league named Babe Garcia, veteran mentor at Idaho State University, the Big Sky football "coach of the year."

Garcia's club won the league's first football crown and posted an overall 6-3 record.

Expansion was discussed at the sessions but Friel said the six-member organization eventually would have to increase its membership.
