 Beef continues to pour into markets at a fast pace. There are many good specials with particular emphasis on the fore-

quarter. A moist, tender pot roast with vegetables and brown gravy makes a welcome change after the Thanksgiving fare of turkey or ham. There is plenty of fresh pork

at excellent prices. You will find very good buys on pork shoulder roasts and steaks, and loin roasts and chops. The less known and less demanded shoulder steaks are excellent when browned and then braised in a covered skillet. They are good eating, and a little easier on the budget than pork chops. Bacon is being featured at very moderate prices.

The list of plentiful low-cost Oregon-grown fresh vegetables include cabbage, carrots, onions, potatoes, squash, turnips and rutabagas. Celery, yams, and sweet potatoes are in good supply. However the prices may go up a little during the next couple of weeks, dropping again as Christmas approaches. Cucumbers and tomatoes from California are expensive. Quality is fair.

Reports that avocados are now increasing. One grocery chain reports that avocados are now being shipped on the stem on which they grew. This is being done on a trial basis to find out if the avocados will keep longer than those which are tray packed. These avocados are reported to sell for less because of reduction of packing costs.

Fine quality pink grapefruit are available at very reasonable prices. Tangerines and tangelos are plentiful and moderately priced.

There is an abundant supply of fresh dates for Christmas fruitcakes and steamed puddings. It is a good idea to check your spices before making characteristic fragrance of the spice is missing, it is time to buy a fresh supply.

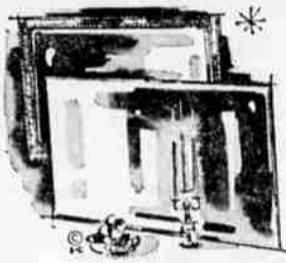
