The Klamath Forest Protective Association will begin issuing Christmas tree cutting permits to the public at 50 cents each, beginning 8 a.m. Saturday, Dec. 7, Assistant District Warden Paul Nichols has announced. Permits to take Christmas trees on Weyerhaeuser land from Camp Four to Parker Mountain on the Klamath Falls-Ashland highway will be available daily at KFPA headquarters.
