

Protestants Eye Anti-Racism Program

PHILADELPHIA (UPI) — A 10-point program to purge U.S. Protestant churches of racism was laid before the General Assembly of the National Council of Churches for action today.

Intense debate was anticipated, since some of the proposals are very hard for Southern churchmen to swallow. But

council officials forecast overwhelming adoption of the "call for action."

It was the most specific indictment of racial barriers in church life that has ever been brought to a vote by the National Council, which represents 31 major denominations with a membership of 40 million persons in all sections of the country.

"We believe that the church of Jesus Christ is commanded by its Lord to rid itself of all these forms of racial injustice which have been perpetuated through the years by us all in our churches, church organizations, agencies and institutions," it said.

It urged national church bodies and local congregations to take immediate steps to:

1. Insure that every Christian church is "in fact open to all regardless of race."
2. Sponsor regular contacts between white and Negro Christians through interracial campaigns, clubs, conferences and meetings.
3. Remove any racial discrimination from church employment policies, and integrate staffs from janitor through pastor.
4. Review Sunday school materials to make sure they accented youngsters with "the Christian's responsibility in the struggle for racial justice."
5. Integrate the "governing boards, staff and clientele" of church-owned institutions such as hospitals, orphanages, homes for the aged, etc.
6. Require fair employment practice clauses in all contracts for church construction.
7. Examine church investment portfolios to insure that no funds are invested in "enterprises which openly practice discrimination."
8. Give "moral and financial support" to major civil rights organizations.
9. Work for "reconciliation" in communities which are bitterly divided by racial issues.
10. Support the "prompt enactment" of the "civil rights legislation."

Mother May Move Oswald's Body

FORT WORTH (UPI) — Mrs. Marguerite Oswald, mother of accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald, said she will announce today whether she will move her son's body from a Fort Worth cemetery.

Police urged that the body be moved to protect it from ghouls, who might break open the grave and take the corpse. Guards, costing \$3,000 a month, now watch the burial spot.

Mrs. Oswald also indicated that she will bring to light "discrepancies" in the FBI's case against her son today during an afternoon news conference, which was announced Thursday.

Mrs. Oswald, in an interview Thursday, contended that her son had been made the "scapegoat" for police and FBI negligence.

Received Offers

Mrs. Oswald, 36, also indicated that she had received a "number" of offers for her book on her son's life. The unemployed woman confirmed that she would write the book.

She said she originally had intended to do the book before her son had returned from Russia using his letters to her as a commentary on the Russian social system.

She said she dropped the idea when Oswald came home and indicated he wanted to do the book himself.

"I believe Lee did not get a fair deal," Mrs. Oswald said. "He never had a chance to disprove the charges against him."

At the same time, she reiterated her claim that the FBI could have kept Oswald from shooting the crime.

Should Have Watched

"They knew he was a defector," she said, "they should have kept a watch on him."

Mrs. Oswald said she had hoped Oswald would have been

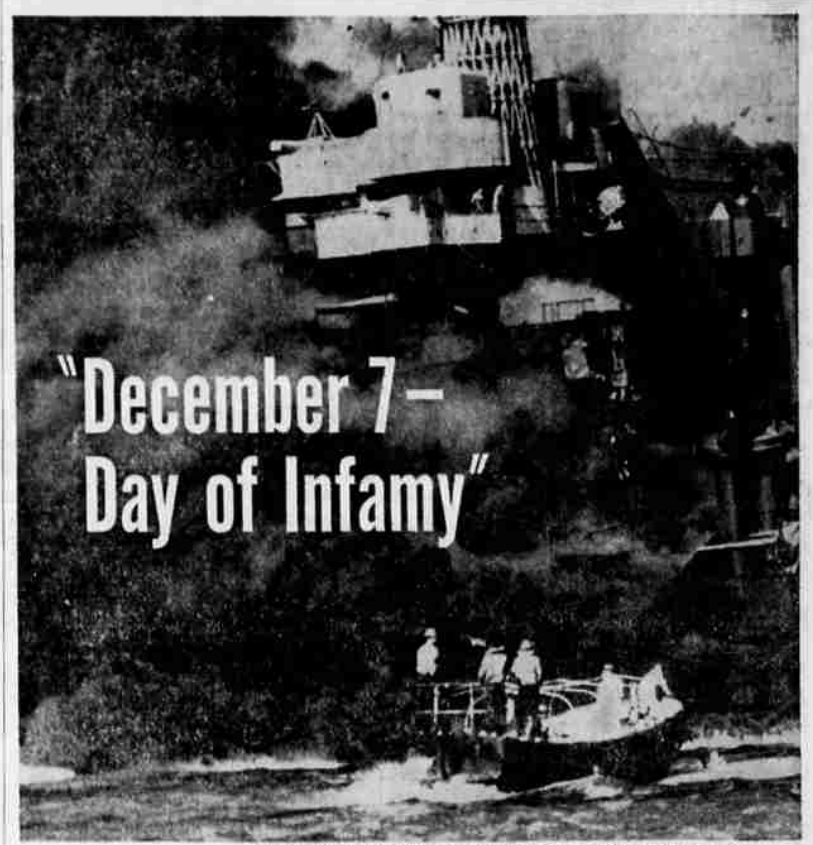
buried in Arlington National Cemetery, across the Potomac from the nation's Capitol.

"He received an honorable discharge from the service," she said, "I intend to see to it

that false publicity surrounding his discharge will be corrected."

Oswald was released from active duty in Sept. 1959 on hardship grounds, shortly after

his mother was hurt in a candy store accident. He received an undesirable discharge from the inactive reserve in November, 1960, a year after he "defected" to Russia.

Mrs. Oswald Gets \$6,000

FORT WORTH (UPI) — The bleak future of Lee Harvey Oswald's widow was brightened today by contributions that exceeded \$6,000 and a deluge of mail from sympathetic Americans.

Mrs. Oswald, 21, has two young children and speaks little English. She was left penniless when the suspected assassin of

President Kennedy was slain.

Mrs. Shirley Williamson, a Fort Worth housewife, collected \$6,000 for Mrs. Oswald and the children. Secret Service agents who guard the Russian-born woman indicated Mrs. Oswald had received other contributions through the mails.

Mrs. Williamson said she and her husband collected the money for Mrs. Oswald as a memorial to President Kennedy. The Williamsons said they felt the late President would not want the widow left without food or shelter.
