FBI Report Probably Won't Be Made Public For Week

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Government sources said Saturday the FBI report on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy and his accused killer, Lee Harvey Oswald, probably will be kept under top-secret wraps for at least another week.

The additional delay in making public any details of the FBI's findings was decided on to allow the blue ribbon investigation commission headed by Chief Justice Earl Warren to study the report. But further details of the bizarre background of Oswald prior to the Nov. 22 tragedy at Dallas, Tex., continued to crop up.

The latest was a report that further evidence has been found linking Oswald to the sniper attempt on the life of right-wing former Maj. Gen. Edwin A.

Walker in Dallas last April. The Chicago Sun-Times said the FBI has asked Dallas police for full particulars of the Walker case.

The purported document, according to the Sun-Times, was found when FBI agents searched both Oswald's family home in Irving, Tex., and his lodging house in Dallas immediately after the Kennedy assassination.

In another development, Mrs. Oswald's former landlady, Mrs. Ruth Paine, told newsmen in Irving that she had told the FBI less than a month before the assassination that Oswald was working in the Dallas book warehouse from where the fatal shots were fired.

Mrs. Paine said she had given the information to the agents sometime between Oct. 16 and Nov. 9 when they paid a routine call at her house. She wanted to advise Mrs. Oswald that she should notify them if she received any blackmailing threats from behind the Iron Curtain.

Mrs. Paine added that in response to questions she told the agents that Oswald was employed at the Texas school book depository building, which overlooked the Kennedy motorcade route during his Dallas visit. She said she was unable to tell the agents where Oswald was living at that time.

Mrs. Oswald also was quoted from Texas as expressing a wish to remain in this country and become an American citizen.

14 Nations May Meet On Cambodia Neutrality

LONDON (UPI) — The United States may join Russia and Communist China soon in a 14-nation conference to negotiate Cambodia's demands for a guarantee of its neutrality and independence, diplomatic sources said Friday.

Britain and the United States, who resisted a similar request in the past, have been in close consultation on the latest demand for several days. The sources said a final decision is imminent.

The U.S. and British governments are still cool in principle to a conference at which Russia and Communist China would be represented, the sources said. But they fear that rejection of the request at this time might drive Cambodia into Peking's orbit.

Prince Norodom Sihanouk, head of state in the strategic Southeast Asian nation, angrily renounced American aid Nov. 19 and told U.S. economic and military advisers to leave the country. He permitted French military advisers to remain, however, and has indicated he would welcome increased aid from France.

On the same day, he renewed his call for an international conference to guarantee Cambodia's neutrality and independence.

The United States and Britain are in a difficult position because agreement on the conference could imply recognition of Sihanouk's charges of aggressive intentions by Thailand and South Viet Nam, both allies of the West.

Wife Eyes Citizenship

FORT WORTH (UPI) — Marina Oswald, widow of the suspected assassin of President Kennedy, was quoted Friday as saying she wants to become an American citizen.

Mrs. Oswald, 23-year-old Russian-born mother of two, burst into tears when she learned at least \$7,700 had been sent to her by sympathetic Americans.

Mrs. Shirley B. Williamson, part-time private investigator and housewife, headed a drive to raise money for Lee Harvey Oswald's widow and children.

An unidentified agent, who has the woman and children under guard and in hiding, was quoted by Mrs. Williamson: "She just broke down and cried when the money began to come in. She said, in broken

Ike Recalls Threats Against His Life

NEW YORK (UPI) — Former President Dwight D. Eisenhower said today "there could be no absolute protection against" an assassin who is "determined" to kill a president.

Eisenhower, noting that he received an average of 250 "crackpot" letters weekly while in office, said he "thought it realistic to assume that my safety was largely out of my hands."

"If a determined individual was willing to accomplish his purpose, there could be no absolute protection against him," Eisenhower said in an article in the Saturday Evening Post.

Eisenhower also urged that succession to the presidency be changed to keep the administration "heading in the same political direction" in the event of an emergency.

Eisenhower said the present line from the president, vice president, to the speaker of the House, president pro tempore of the Senate and then to the cabinet is illogical.

The former chief executive said he preferred a previous system that called for the secretary of state and other cabinet members to follow the vice president in line of succession. This was the law prior to 1947.

"I believe that the earlier order of succession is a more logical one which would keep the presidency heading in the same political direction until the electorate has an opportunity to make its further wishes known," Eisenhower said.

When Lyndon B. Johnson became president House Speaker John McCormack 72, and Sen. Carl Hayden, D-Ariz., 85, became next in line respectively to succeed to the presidency.

However, Eisenhower pointed out in the Post article that the speaker of the House is elected by a district and the president pro tempore of the Senate by a state. "Neither necessarily reflects the will of the whole electorate," he added.

The present line of succession, Eisenhower said, makes it "possible for a man to succeed to the presidency who is out of sympathy with the aims and policies of the administration."

Drug Plan Criticized

PORTLAND (UPI) — A plan to allow druggists to collect extra money for filling welfare prescriptions has been criticized by a spokesman for the Oregon Pharmaceutical Association.

The State Welfare Commission proposal would authorize druggists and others to collect from needy persons and their relatives the difference between the highest fees allowed by the commission and the fees actually paid.

Henry Speckman, executive secretary of the pharmacists' group, called the plan impractical.

"Not only are pharmacists reluctant to collect money from persons already in need, but no body can tell ahead of time how the state will prorate the payments," he said.

Last month, when druggists' claims outran available funds, the commission cut payments for prescriptions at about 65 cents on the dollar.

Diamond Jim Behind Bars While Police Investigate

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Police Saturday continued their investigation into the complicated affairs of James Pattillo, 35, suspected embezzler of at least \$27,000 from his former employer.

Pattillo, known to his acquaintances as Diamond Jim, remained in jail after efforts to reduce his \$27,500 bail were unsuccessful.

The suspect had worked as secretary-treasurer of the George Windler Co., a firm which manufactured redwood tanks and other products. But he disappeared late last month after telling his employer he was going to Texas for medical treatment.

Several days later, investigators found discrepancies in Pattillo's books and a search for the missing man was launched. He was found with a girl friend last Thursday, sailing his 53-foot cruiser Diamond Jim out of Monterey Bay.

Police said Pattillo had taken at least \$27,000, perhaps as much as \$100,000, from his employer. When Pattillo was arrested in Monterey, authorities found \$13,145 in cash aboard the boat, as well as furs, jewels, television sets and jars and banks containing coins.
