Tours Set At Center

THE JOHN F. KENNEDY SPACE CENTER will be opened to the public for the first time on a regular once-a-week basis beginning Dec. 15.
The Air Force announced Friday it would set aside its security barriers for a three-hour period every Sunday for 65-minute automobile tours.
The general public was admitted to the spaceport only once before—on Armed Forces Day in 1961. Usually, only cape employes and a few others are admitted to the cape.
Maj. Gen. Leighton I. Davis, commander of the Air Force missile test center, said the drive-throughs would be conducted on a trial basis. He said they would have to be stopped if the tours could not be properly handled or if they interfered with normal operations at the spaceport.

Santa Fails As Jumper

PACIFICA, Calif. (UPI)—An elaborately planned visit by Santa Claus to the youngsters of this oceanside community went slightly awry Saturday when Saint Nick parachuted into the surf instead of a nearby shopping center.

The plans called for Santa, 28-year-old veteran sky diver Ron Young, to drop into the Eureka Shopping Center after a 5,000-foot free fall and a 2,500-foot float by parachute to earth. But the winds changed at the last minute and Young, wearing the customary red suit and stuffed with pillows, splashed into the ocean.

He was rescued by surfboarders, borrowed a dry Santa Claus costume from a local variety store and made his scheduled appearance before 200 somewhat puzzled children.
"It's all very embarrassing," said Santa Claus. "I've had 502 jumps, you know."

Brief Ceremony Honors Pearl Harbor Victims

PEARL HARBOR, Hawaii (UPI)—A small crowd of about 100 persons Saturday paid tribute in a brief ceremony to the U.S. servicemen who died at Pearl Harbor 22 years ago.

The ceremony lasted less than 15 minutes and took place in a stiff breeze that whipped the array of flags standing at half staff in memory of the late President John F. Kennedy.

The quiet observance, consisting of several speeches, a short prayer and the playing of Taps, took place at the white concrete memorial that straddles the sunken USS Arizona. The battleship was sunk in the first wave of the Japanese attack. The bodies of 1,102 American servicemen are still entombed in her rusted hull.
