

# Lodge Says He Would 'Seriously Consider' Republican Nomination

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (UPI)—Ambassador Henry Cabot Lodge said Sunday he would "consider seriously" a proposal from former President Dwight D. Eisenhower that he seek the Republican presidential nomination, although he has no plans at present to run.

Lodge, vice presidential nominee in 1960, said he had no direct word of Eisenhower's appeal and declined to say how he would reply to it. But there were strong indications that whatever his response, Lodge would not leave his post here until well into the new year.

"I have not received any such message," he said when asked about reports that Eisenhower wanted him to return immedi-

ately to the United States and begin campaigning. "If I did receive such a message," he added, "I would consider it and take a good hard look at it."

The 61-year-old ambassador said that at present "I have no intention of running" for president. He said he feels he can do the most good by continuing to serve here.

Informed sources here said Lodge, who took up his post at the end of August, would not consider resigning for several months because of the critical situation in Viet Nam.

He has worked closely with the new military junta, in power only six weeks, and is believed to want to stay here until South Viet Nam's effort against the Communists has improved with the change of government.

# School Aid Compromise Agreement Nears

WASHINGTON (UPI)—House-Senate conferees neared final compromise agreement Monday on a bill to boost federal help to vocational schools and expand the government's student loan program.

The measure — one of two education bills expected to be passed this session — would increase the present \$58 million aid program for vocational schools by four or five times. The compromise also was expected to continue the present national defense education act for student loans and extend the \$400 million "impacted areas" program for schools crowded by children of servicemen and government workers.

The conferees planned to complete work on the legislation Tuesday.

The compromise would cut the extension of the student loan and impacted areas programs from three to two years.

# Board Rules 'No Smog'

ALTURAS—There is no smog in Modoc County. This is the ruling of the Modoc County Board of Supervisors this week.

The ruling is in compliance with the state law which demands that all new cars sold in California be equipped with an approved crankcase device as an aid to controlling moving sources of air pollution. All the county boards of the state must decide whether they want the device installed on used cars sold or transferred.

Failure of the board of supervisors to take official action on the smog before Dec. 31 would automatically constitute an affirmation that the county wants the smog device on used cars.

The device ranges in cost from \$15 to \$18 per vehicle. It is estimated that if all counties were to require them on used cars, it would cost California motorists \$75 million over the next two years.
