**Soviet Army Plans To Withdraw From Hungary In Next Few Months**

MOSCOW (UPI) — The Soviet army, which crushed the Hungarian revolution seven years ago, plans to leave Hungary in the next few months, diplomatic sources said today. Only a few token units will be left behind under the Warsaw pact agreement, the sources said. Western diplomats interpreted the move as a sign of easing tensions in Eastern Europe and of Premier Nikita Khrushchev's faith in the stability of Hungarian Premier Janos Kadar's regime.

families of Soviet soldiers still in Hungary — is part of a pattern prevailing over Eastern Europe. There are no Soviet troops in Czechoslovakia, Romania or Bulgaria. Some forces remain in Poland, and East Germany is heavily garrisoned. But the soldiers stationed in Poland are said to confine themselves to maintaining communications links between Moscow and Berlin and are seldom seen around the country. When Hungary exploded in rebellion in 1956, Soviet soldiers and tanks smashed the uprising. Since then the Kremlin has kept a large garrison — unofficially estimated at two tank and two motorized divisions — within the nation. Unofficial estimates put Soviet strength at 20 divisions, 10 tank and 10 motorized, in East Germany and 2 divisions, 1 tank and 1 motorized, in Poland. Qualified diplomatic sources said that agreement between Moscow and Budapest to withdraw troops is based largely on Kadar's successful efforts to restore his nation's stability since 1956.

**Witnesses For Defense Testify In Fraud Trial**

PENDLETON (UPI) — A real estate broker testified today he believed the best use for land tracts in the Lake Valley subdivision south of Burns was "to build a home if you want hunting and fishing."

Jed C. Blackburn was one of seven defense witnesses called this morning in the seventh day of the mail fraud trial of seven Chicago and Los Angeles area men.

Blackburn testified that most of the land in Harney County had minimum surveys of 20 acres. He said he and his father had not accepted a retainer of \$300 per month from the Harney County Land Development Corp. to show Lake Valley tracts to prospective buyers because they felt they could not feasibly go out and make a profit for themselves. He said his office usually dealt in larger tracts.

James Allerdice, Port Townsend, Wash., a hardware store operator, said he purchased a Lake Valley tract with full and complete knowledge of the land he was buying.

He said he knew there were no trees but wanted the land as rock hunting and possibly hunting and fishing, so made a \$3 down payment.

Ellis Mason of Hines, a forest Service employe, testified about 60 per cent of hunters who go after deer in Harney County have made kills.

Eleven witnesses appeared as the defense opened its case in Federal Court Monday.

Defense Attorney William Morrison said the defense may finish its presentation Thursday.

Dr. David Charlton, operator of a commercial testing laboratory in Portland, testified water in the area had a slightly different taste and odor but was drinkable.

Neil Smith Jr., Burns postmaster, said there was a steady growth but not a booming population in the Burns area. His wife told of collecting Indian arrowheads on Lake Valley property and spoke of nearby sports locations.

Oliver Olivo, a civil engineer who engineered the Lake Valley area, said he was told to leave out "undesirable" land. He said he left 15 to 20 per cent out of the project because it was considered undesirable for the subdivision.

Federal Judge John Kilkenny denied a defense motion for a mistrial. The motion was based on articles published in two newspapers which referred to evidence the judge refused to allow Friday.

The government rested its case Friday after calling 47 witnesses.

Several witnesses failed to show up Monday because of bad weather.
