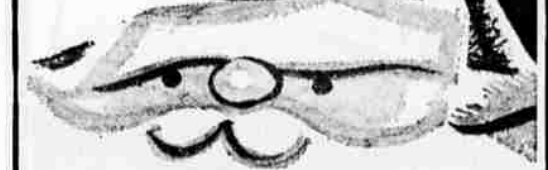

Miller, an employe of the Downing Logging Co., was setting a checker on a log when it rolled on him.

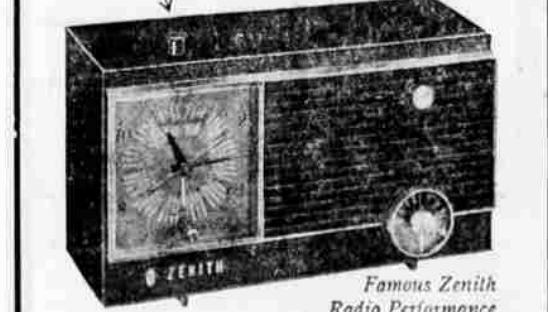

Holy Water Accident Douses Eternal Flame

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The eternal flame on President Kennedy's grave at Arlington National Cemetery flickered out for about one minute Tuesday because of a freakish accident.

A group of children was visiting the grave when the cap came off a bottle of holy water. "A stream of water hit the flame directly, extinguishing it," John Metzler, cemetery superintendent, said. "An attendant relighted the flame immediately. I estimate it was out for only one minute."

Metzler was at a loss to explain how a small amount of water could have extinguished a flame which has continued to burn in heavy rains and high winds.

He said he was not present when the accident happened, but reconstructed the events later. There were about 20 children from 8 to 11 years old in the group, Metzler said. They were taking turns sprinkling the grave with holy water.

Various plans have been advanced for substituting a permanent burner, possibly with a gas fuel line, at the grave. The present flame is from a temporary burner, about a foot in diameter.

Complications Send Connally Back To Hospital

AUSTIN, Tex. (UPI) — Texas Gov. John Connally, shot down with President Kennedy Nov. 22 and thought well enough to be released six days ago, was back in the hospital today with complications from his wounds.

The new ailment was inflammation of a blood vessel in his right leg, the indirect result of the sniper's bullet that passed first through his chest, then hit his wrist and went into his leg.

His doctor called it a "superficial inflammation" and said the governor would be in St. David's Hospital for five or six days. The doctor said Connally's condition was not serious and no surgery would be required.

Connally will carry on routine business while he is in the hospital, a spokesman said. Mrs. Connally, who stayed at the governor's side for the 13 days he was in Parkland Hospital in Dallas after the shooting, stayed home with the couple's three children this time.

thrombophlebitis" occurred at the point where the tube was inserted.

The governor's arm was still in a cast because of his shattered wrist.

Connally held a television interview in his room at Parkland Hospital during his stay there. On Thanksgiving Day, he watched the University of Texas-Texas A&M football game on television but his doctors said he got too "worked up" over it.

Pronounced well enough to leave Parkland, he returned to Austin Dec. 5 and up until Tuesday had been convalescing at the governor's mansion under heavy Department of Public Safety guard.

He has not received visitors but has been able to handle some routine business. Officials

at St. David's, a Methodist hospital, would not say which room the governor was in and referred all inquiries to Connally's staff.
