Firms And Agencies Back Red Cross Call For Help

Leading business and industrial executives of the community and representatives of city, state and federal government responded well to the request of Red Cross leaders for assistance in blood donor recruitment for 1964. At a meeting Dec. 9, 32 local concerners and representatives to pledge their support to meeting the 1,800 pints of blood needed in the coming year to provide blood for the sick and injured. Brooks Dickerman, chairman of the local chapter, introduced Mrs. Stephen Walker as the new Red Cross blood chairman. Mrs. Walker has been active in the program for the past 11 years, she succeeds Mrs. Winston Purvine, who served for the past three years as chairman. She is a three-time blood donor and a member of the Red Cross. Mrs. Walker is a newcomer to the blood program but has been active in other community activities. She explained the donor recruitment plan and discussed quotas with representatives of the employe groups. Mrs. Bertha Morton, administrative assistant to the Regional Blood Center of the Red Cross in Portland explained the financing of the blood program, and the expenses incidental to receiving blood donated. She pointed out that there was no charge for the blood itself. Dr. George Nicholson discussed the usage of blood, and the tremendous value of the local Red Cross program in meeting completely the need for blood by hospital patients. The next blood drawing will be a three-day operation in Klamath County, Tuesday, Jan. 14, the bloodmobile will headquarter at the Merrill Recreation Hall with donor hours from 4 to 8 p.m. Prosperity Chapter of the Eastern Star at Malin, and the PTAs of Tulelake and Newell are merging recruitment efforts with the Merrill Lions Club which acts as sponsor. Wednesday, Jan. 15, the Masonic Lodge, 418 Klamath Avenue, will host the bloodmobile, with all Masonic affiliated orders cooperating in donor recruitment. Hours are from 2:30 to 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 16, the operation moves to the Service Club at Klamath Falls, with hours from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. King-see Field and OTT topped blood quotas in 1963 and have pledged support. Street Maps Available On Nine Oregon Cities

New street maps for nine Oregon cities are now available through the Oregon State Highway Department, according to Forest Cooper, state highway engineer. The cities are Baker, Klamath Falls, Lake Oswego, Milwaukie, Gladstone, Tigard, Boring, Holladay, and Vale. Because of their larger size, Baker, Klamath Falls, Lake Oswego, and Milwaukie each require four map sheets to cover the area within the city limits. Gladstone and Tigard each require two map sheets. The other three cities require only one map sheet. The maps are drawn to the scale of 1 inch to the mile and are plotted on a 17 x 19-inch sheet. This size costs 25 cents per map sheet. A reduction-size map uses a scale of 1,600 feet to the inch on an 8 1/2 x 11-inch sheet. This smaller size costs 15 cents per map sheet. For example, a map for Baker would cost \$1 for the larger size and 49 cents for the smaller size. The Gladstone map costs \$2.98 for the larger size and 29 cents for the smaller size. Maps for the three cities with one map sheet each would cost 25 cents for the larger size and 15 cents for the smaller size. The maps are available for purchase through the Oregon State Highway Department. Persons wanting these maps may purchase them by writing to the Map Distribution Unit, Room 313, State Highway Building, Salem, Ore. 97330. Checks should be made payable to the Oregon State Highway Department.

Byrd Wins Acquittal

Charles Byrd, 36, was acquitted Tuesday night of an assault with a dangerous weapon charge by a circuit court jury. The unanimous verdict was returned after 49 minutes of deliberation. Byrd had been indicted by the grand jury for the killing of Kenneth Ford during a card game in a Broad Street residence Sept. 1. Ford was treated for a long gash on his forehead. Police said at the time that the killing followed an argument over money.
