NEW YORK (UPI) — Florentino Fernandez's gory, avenging TKO victory over Juan (Rocky) Rivero won him another middleweight contender's promoter Harry Markson announced Saturday.

Cuban Fernandez of Miami Beach, who had lost a controversial decision to Argentina's Rivero last Nov. 1, butchered the "little wild bull of the pampas" Friday night in the ring until the bloody bout was stopped at the end of the seventh round.

Houston Takes Win

HOUSTON (UPI) — Sophomore halfback Mike Spratt scored twice on reverses of 31 and 29 yards to give the Houston Oilers a 21-7 win Saturday over the big but slow Louisville Cardinals.

A crowd of 5,000, lost in the 70,000-seat Rice Stadium saw both teams end dismal seasons.

Spratt scored on the same play from the Louisville 31 midway in the fourth quarter to end a 94-yard drive and give Houston a comfortable 21-7 lead.

Big Bomb Retains Packer Title Hope

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — The Green Bay Packers kept their championship hopes alive Saturday with a "long bomb" attack that edged the San Francisco Forty Niners, 21-17.

The Packers now have to depend on the Detroit Lions to defeat the Chicago Bears Sunday to give Green Bay its fourth consecutive Western Division National Football League crown.

Fought to a standstill on the ground by a stoutish Forty Niner defense, the Packers took to the air for the victory. Quarterback Bart Starr found Boyd Dowler behind the San Francisco secondary with passes that were good for 63 and 50 yard touchdowns. That spelled the difference.

The Packers had marched 78 yards to a score the first time they got the ball with Tom Moore piling over from the one. But the Forty Niners came back with an 88-yard ground drive of their own featuring J. D. Smith and the veteran Joe Perry. The score came when Smith piled over from the two.

On the ensuing kickoff, Green Bay fumbled and San Francisco recovered on the Packer 23. When this Forty Niner attack stalled on the 15 for some unaccountable reason, the Forty Niners decided to try for a touchdown on fourth down instead of going for a field goal that would have given them a 10-7 lead.

Two minutes after the Packers got the ball, Starr faked and then hit Dowler with his first touchdown bomb.

San Francisco came right back to knot the count at 14-14 when Smith broke over tackle and went 52 yards to score.

Starr's next bomb to Dowler came in the third quarter and put the Packers ahead to stay. Tommy Davis, who tied the National League record of 156 consecutive conversions with his points after on the second San Francisco touchdown, kicked a 44-yard field goal in the last quarter.

Fullback Jim Taylor gained 59 yards for Green Bay to bring his total for the season to 1,010 yards — the fourth consecutive year in which he has gained 1,000 or more.

Starr completed 17 out of 27 passes for 206 yards, Smith carried the ball 19 times for San Francisco and gained 129 yards.

The Klamath Falls Frosh collected their second victory of the season Saturday afternoon as they posted a 48-37 win over the visiting Crater Frosh.

Mike Rainwater and Kent Howard again led the Frosh as they scored 19 and 12 points respectively.

In a preliminary contest, the second KU Frosh team, the Lakers, won over the Crater team, 42-31. Duane Hootowit led the Lakers with 17 points.

Chiefs Top Boston '11'

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (UPI) — Quarterback Len Dawson passed for three touchdowns and ran 43 yards for another Saturday in 11-degree weather to lead the Kansas City Chiefs to a 33-3 triumph over the Boston Patriots.

The Chiefs' victory, coupled with the Buffalo Bills' decision over the New York Jets, threw the American Football League Eastern Division lead into a tie between the Patriots and the Bills.

Boston opened the scoring late in the first period on a 15-yard field goal by Gino Cappelletti. The Patriots' only score of the game was set up when Kansas City's Jerrell Wilson dropped the football while preparing to punt. Boston took possession on the Chiefs 30-yard line.

After that, it was Kansas City's game—both offensively and defensively. In the second period, Dawson tossed a 14-yard scoring pass to Chris Burford for a 7-3 lead at halftime.
